1 RESOLUTION 2 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR 3 **GRANT APPLICATION WITH THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION OF THE** U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PROVIDING FOR AN 4 APPROPRIATION TO THE TRANSIT DEPARTMENT. 5 6 WHEREAS, acquisition of new Transit Revenue Vehicles are listed in Fiscal 7 Year 2012 of the 2012 – 2016 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and 8 WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration has authorized under 9 Section 5309 funding for Bus and Bus Facilities grant funds in support of its State 10 of Good Repair program; and 11 WHEREAS, the Administrator of the Federal Transit Administration of the 12 U.S. Department of Transportation has made federal funds available to the City of 13 Albuquerque in the total amount of \$2,994,290 for this project; and 14 WHEREAS, the above project supports the desired community condition 15

for safe and affordable integrated transportation options associated with Goal 3 -Public Infrastructure on the City's Five-Year Goals Plan; and

17 WHEREAS, the City desires to apply for these funds and City funds in the 18 amount of \$662,188 from the Capital Acquisition Fund 305 Project Activity 19 7507010 "Revenue Vehicles Replacement/Expansion", are available for the local 20 match; and

21 WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in 22 accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 that in 23 connection with filing for assistance under 49 U.S.C 5309 that the applicant gives 24 assurances that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and 25 related U.S. Department of Transportation Requirements.

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1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 2 ALBUQUERQUE:

Section 1. That the Mayor is authorized to file grant applications on behalf
of the City of Albuquerque with the Federal Transit Administration of the U.S.
Department of Transportation to aid in financing of public transportation projects
pursuant to 49 U.S.C. 5309.

Section 2. That the Mayor is authorized to furnish such additional
information as the Federal Transit Administration of the U.S. Department of
Transportation may require in connection with grant applications.

10 Section 3. That the Mayor is authorized to execute grants on behalf of the 11 City of Albuquerque with the Federal Transit Administration of the U.S. 12 Department of Transportation for aid in financing of public transportation 13 projects pursuant to 49 U.S.C. 5309.

Section 4. That the grant application in the amount of \$3,656,478 consisting of \$2,994,290 in federal funds and \$662,188 local funds, which includes \$29,020 in indirect overhead costs, from the Capital Acquisition Fund 305 Project Activity 7507010 "Revenue Vehicles Replacement/Expansion", are hereby approved and submission and execution with the appropriate official or office of the Federal Transit Administration of the U.S. Department of Transportation is in all respects approved.

are hereby transferred from the Capital Acquisition Fund 305 and that the

Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

Approving and authorizing the filing and acceptance of a State of Good Repair grant, which will fund the acquisition of "2" 40-foot CNG buses, "3" 60-foot diesel buses and the acquisition of spare parts for the new vehicles.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This legislation authorizes the Transit Department to file and accept a grant from the Federal Transit Administration through the State of Good Repair and Bus Facilities Initiative.

3. Why is this project needed?

Funding has been insufficient for "mission critical" assets such as bus replacement. As the backbone of transit operations, maintaining the condition of the revenue fleet in a state of good repair has been a high priority of CAO-ABQ Ride for more then a decade.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The total cost of the above grant-funded project is <u>\$3,656,478</u> consisting of <u>\$2,994,290</u> in federal funds and <u>\$662,188</u> in local match funds from the General Obligation Bond program.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?

None
