	5	repeatedly suspended and overturned throughout the country.			
	6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF			
	7	ALBUQUERQUE:			
	8	SECTION 1. Article 3 of the Albuquerque Code of Resolutions, "City			
	9	Employees" is amended to add a new section, Section "3-3-20", as follows:			
	10	"§ 3-3-20 No City Mandates for COVID-19 Vaccination. It shall be the policy			
	11	of the City that, no City of Albuquerque employee will be required to obtain			
	12	and/or provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination, and there shall be no			
	13	consequence for an employee opting to not get vaccinated."			
	14	SECTION 2. COMPILATION. Section 1 of this Resolution shall be			
	15	incorporated in and made part of the Albuquerque Code of Resolutions,			
	16	Chapter 3, Article 3, as "COVID-19 Vaccination Ban."			
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
