Per Established by City Ordinance § 10-5-3, the central objective of the Albuquerque Arts Board is to "promote and encourage private and public programs to further the development and public awareness of, and interest in, the visual arts and fine crafts and cultural properties." This eleven-member board includes people widely known for their professional competence and experience in the visual arts, and knowledgeable lay persons. Each member serves a staggered three-year term. The central responsibility of each member is to serve as Board liaison to Artwork Planning Committees. The full Board makes selection recommendations to the Mayor.

When a vacancy on the Albuquerque Arts Board occurs, the Councilor representing the District in which the vacating member of the Albuquerque Arts Board resides, shall nominate two members to the Albuquerque Arts Board who reside in his or her respective Council District and the Mayor shall appoint one of these recommended members
