3	THE ACCEPTANCE OF POTENTIAL GRANT AWARDS FOR MULTIPLE TRANSIT
4	DEPARTMENT PROGRAMS FROM THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION
5	(FTA) OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PROVIDING FOR
6	AN APPROPRIATION TO THE TRANSIT DEPARTMENT.
7	WHEREAS, one of goals of the City of Albuquerque is to support safe and
8	affordable integrated transportation options associated with Goal 3 -Public
9	Infrastructure on the City's Five-Year Goals Plan; and
10	WHEREAS, in order to expedite the award and receipt of grant funding to
11	Transit Department Programs, the City of Albuquerque Transit Department
12	submits for approval the following list of potential awards; and
13	WHEREAS, potential grant funds in the approximate amount of \$22,742,933
14	will be used to pay for various transit programs that contribute to safe and
15	affordable integrated transportation options to the citizens of Albuquerque; and
16	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque desires to appropriate these funds or
17	has available City funds in the amount of \$4,075,081 which consist of \$3,935,769
18	from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 and/or the Transfer to
19	Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants
20	Fund 665, and \$139,312 from the Transfer to Operating Grants Program from the
21	General Fund 110 for the local match and includes the City's portion of Indirect
22	Overhead (IDOH).
23	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
24	ALBUQUERQUE:
25	Section 1. That the list of estimated grant awards is hereby made a

part of this resolution, is hereby approved and its submission and filing with the

appropriate official or office of the respective granting agency is in all respects approved.

Section 2. That upon award, funds in the amount of \$26,818,014 consisting of \$22,742,933 in federal funds from the Federal Transit Administration which include \$538,584 for IDOH, \$3,935,769 from the Transit Capital Implementation Program fund 305 and/or the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665; which includes \$80,226 for IDOH, and \$139,312 from the Transfer to Operating Grants Program from the General Fund 110 which includes \$12,202 for IDOH is hereby appropriated to the Transit Department in the Capital Improvement Fund 665, and Operating Grant Fund 265, for Fiscal Year 2020 through 2022.

Section 3. In the event that the Department receives additional grants not listed below, the Department will be required to submit separate legislation. The Department will also be required to submit the applications and awards for these grants to the Office of Management and Budget and the Central Accounting Office for review.

Section 4. That the following are potential grant awards with possible City IDOH and cash match requirements.

SUBJECT: Funding for FY20 Transit Program Grants Omnibus Bill

In order to speed the availability of grant funding for transit programs, the Transit Department has submitted a Grant Omnibus Bill, which lists potential Federal Transit Administration grants that the department may receive. Passage of the Omnibus Bill will allow the Transit Department to apply and receive grant funds. The Transit Department is estimating receipt of \$22,742,933 in federal grants from the Federal Transit Administration. Indirect costs in the amount of \$538,584 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the grant's cash match ratio.

The amount of \$4,075,081 will be appropriated and/or is available, and consists of \$3,935,769 from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 and/or the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665, and \$139,312 from the Transfer to Operating Grants Program from the General Fund 110, for the purpose of meeting the grant cash match.

The Transit Department will use the grant funds for various transit project to support the desired community condition for safe and affordable integrated transportation options.

A resolution has been prepared and is being forwarded to City Council for approval.

Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

The City of Albuquerque Transit Department is eligible to receive potential grant awards for programs and projects from the Federal Transit Administration. In order to expedite the approval process and allow the department to take advantage of grants with short application and approval timelines, this Omnibus Bill approves application for and receipt of potential Federal Transit Administration grants by the Transit Department for FY20.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This legislation authorizes the Transit Department to apply for Federal Transit Administration funds for Transit related projects and appropriates those funds to the Transit Department.

3. Why is this project needed?

The "Omnibus Bill" is needed in order to take advantage of funding opportunities from the Federal Transit Administration. The funding will support the desired community condition for safe and affordable integrated transportation options.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The Transit Department will potentially receive \$22,742,933 from the Federal Transit Administration grantor. Funding of \$4,075,081 will be appropriated and will consist of \$3,935,769 from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 and/or the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665; and \$139,312 from the Transfer to Operating Grants Program from the General Fund 110, for the purpose of meeting grant cash match.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?

6. What will happen if the project is not approved?

Transit will not be able to appropriate the Federal Transit Administration funds to provide funds for various transit projects to support the desired community condition for safe and affordable integrated transportation options.

GRANTS WITH POSITIONS

Travel Demand Management (TDM) – CMAQ

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$817,500 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Congestion Mitigation Air Quality – Mandatory (CMAQ-MAND) Funds for the transportation demand management program. A local match totaling \$139,312 is available and is appropriated from a Transfer to Operating Grants Program in the General Fund to the Operating Grants Fund 265. Indirect costs in the amount of \$83,808 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA CMAQ rate of 85.44% by grantor and 14.56% local match.

This funding will cover marketing, public education and outreach to promote the reduction of auto emissions and traffic congestion in the metropolitan area.

GRANTS WITHOUT POSITIONS

Revenue Vehicles 5307

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$9,072,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 Formula Funds for revenue vehicle purchase. A local match totaling \$1,600,941 is available and is appropriated from the Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$187,686 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5307 Formula bus sliding scale rate of 85% by grantor and 15% local match.

This funding is for revenue vehicles which will provide funding to acquire revenue vehicles and associated equipment and manufacturing inspections.

Revenue Vehicles 5339

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$1,300,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facility Funds for revenue vehicle purchase. A local match totaling \$229,412 is available and is appropriated from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$26,895 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5339 Formula bus sliding scale rate of 85% by grantor and 15% local match.

This funding is for revenue vehicles which will provide funding to acquire revenue vehicles and associated equipment and manufacturing inspections.

Associated Transit Improvements 5307

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$108,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 Formula Funds for Associated Transit Improvements (Transit Enhancement) projects. A local match

totaling \$27,000 is available and is appropriated from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$2,374 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5307 Formula rate of 80% by grantor and 20% local match.

This funding is for Associated Transit Improvements will provide funding to construct bus shelters, landscaping, Bike/Pedestrian access, and signage.

Transit Facility Rehab 5307

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$1,000,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 Formula Funds for facility rehabilitation projects. A local match totaling \$250,000 is available and is appropriated from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$21,982 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5307 Formula rate of 80% by grantor and 20% local match.

This funding is for Facility Rehab which will provide funding to rehabilitate and remodel various transit facilities, including equipment within those facilities.

Bus Stop Facilities 5307

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$500,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 Formula Funds for bus stop facilities. A local match totaling \$125,000 is available and is appropriated from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$10,991 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5307 Formula rate of 80% by grantor and 20% local match.

This funding is for Bus Stop Facilities which will provide funding to rehabilitate and install various bus stops.

Transit Security Equipment 5307

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$108,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 Formula Funds for security equipment. A local match totaling \$27,000 is available and is appropriated from Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$2,374 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA 5307 Formula rate of 80% by grantor and 20% local match.

This funding will provide funding for Transits security equipment at its various facilities and for any employees utilizing security equipment.

Central Avenue BRT - CMAQ

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$6,837,433 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Congestion Mitigation Air Quality – Mandatory (CMAQ-MAND) Funds for Central Avenue Corridor Improvements. A local match totaling \$1,165,180 is available and is appropriated from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$140,728 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA CMAQ rate of 85.44% by grantor and 14.56% local match.

This funding will cover Central Avenue Corridor improvements to promote the reduction of auto emissions and traffic congestion in the metropolitan area.

Central Avenue BRT - STPU

The Transit Department desires to apply for \$3,000,000 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Surface Transportation Program-urban (STPU) Funds for Central Avenue Corridor Improvements. A local match totaling \$511,236 is available and is appropriated from the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665. Indirect costs in the amount of \$61,746 is included in the total grant amount and will be cost shared according to the FTA STPU rate of 85.44% by grantor and 14.56% local match.

This funding will cover Central Avenue Corridor improvements to improve roadways and system connectivity while not negatively impact the environment and/or historically significant landmarks.
