8	WHEREAS, the City Council passed and adopted Council Bill No. O-07-89
9	on September 5, 2007 establishing procedures for the inclusion and amendment
10	of projects in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and the Transportation
11	Improvement Program (TIP) of the Albuquerque Metropolitan Planning Area.
12	Submittals to the Council shall be made at least 30 days prior to the deadline for
13	project submittals as established by the Mid-Region Council of Governments
14	(MRCOG). Project requests shall only be submitted to the MRCOG for inclusion
15	in the MTP and TIP by City Council Resolution, and;
16	WHEREAS, MRCOG has issued a schedule outlining each of the steps and
17	the timeline for the preparation of the proposed FY 2014 to FY 2019 TIP, and;
18	WHEREAS, in order for the City of Albuquerque to be eligible to receive
19	federal transportation funds as a member of the MRCOG, a project must be
20	included in both the MTP and the TIP, and
21	WHEREAS, in compliance with the procedures set forth in O-07-89, the
22	Mayor hereby requests the City Council adopt an updated list of priority projects
23	to be included in the 2035 MTP, and for consideration of federal funding in the

24 proposed FY 2014 to FY 2019 TIP.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 2 ALBUQUERQUE:

SECTION 1. The projects identified in Attachment 1 shall represent the official list of priority projects to be included in the 2035 MTP, and for consideration of federal funding in the proposed FY 2014 to FY 2019 TIP.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to submit project requests to MRCOG for inclusion in the 2035 Metropolitan Transportation Plan, and for consideration of federal funding in the proposed FY 2014 to FY 2019 TIP based on the Attachment 1 list of projects. The Mayor shall ensure that all project submittals are made to the Mid-Region Council of Governments prior to the January 8, 2013 deadline.

SECTION 3. The recommendation of specific projects to be selected from the priority list for consideration of federal funding in the FY 2014 to FY 2019 TIP shall be made jointly by staff from the Administration and the Council. The selection decision will be based largely on the regional significance of each of the projects and how well they are expected to score based on the established selection criteria agreed upon by the member agencies of MRCOG.
