6	days unless the Council does not confirm an appointee presented to them
7	within the timeline stated within this section];
8	[1. The Police Chief or Fire Chief may be removed for cause by a vote of
9	two-thirds of the entire membership of the Council.]
10	[1. The Police Chief and Fire Chief shall have an employment agreement with
11	the City specifying the terms and conditions of employment including a
12	provision for early termination of employment. The Mayor may terminate
13	either employment of the Police Chief or the Fire Chief at any time. The
14	Council may terminate the agreement at any time, with notice to the Mayor and
15	affected Chief, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of
16	the Council.]

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, word, or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this resolution. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section, paragraph, sentence, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
