1 RESOLUTION  
2 DESIGNATING AS CITY FEDERAL PRIORITIES THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE'S  
3 FISCAL YEAR 2023 CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING REQUESTS  
4 TO THE 117<sup>TH</sup> CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES.

5 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives and the Senate of the 117<sup>th</sup>  
6 Congress of the United States, have established Congressionally Directed  
7 Spending to assist in the development and operation of public infrastructure  
8 and community-based service programs for state and local governments; and

9 WHEREAS, the members of the New Mexico Delegation to the 117<sup>th</sup>  
10 Congress have issued calls to the communities of New Mexico to submit  
11 Congressionally Directed Spending Requests; and

12 WHEREAS, staff from the Mayor's Office, multiple City Departments, and  
13 the Council Services Department have submitted project requests for  
14 Congressionally Directed Spending funding with direction of the Mayor and  
15 City Councilors; and

16 WHEREAS, § 2-2-2 of the Albuquerque Code of Ordinances authorizes the  
17 Intergovernmental Legislative Relations Committee to prepare a legislative  
18 program for submission prior to December 30<sup>th</sup> of each calendar year to the  
19 Mayor and Council for their approval and to draft appropriate legislation on  
20 behalf of the City prior to each session of the United States Congress; and

21 WHEREAS, the call for Congressionally Directed Spending Requests was  
22 issued by the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress in February of 2022 after the December 2021  
23 submission of the City's Priorities Resolution R-21-235. A second federal  
24 priorities resolution is, therefore, required to include the list Congressionally  
25 Directed Spending Project Requests in the City's list of Federal Priorities; and

9 1 to this Resolution are adopted as the City's Priority Congressionally

13 members of the Congressional Delegation.
