Chapter 53; Title 23, United States Code; or other 21 federal statutes authorizing a project administered by the Federal Transit 22 Administration. The City of Albuguergue is the designated recipient as defined 23 by 49 U.S.C. 5307(a)(2), to apply for Urbanized Area Formula Program 24 assistance.

25 Section 2. That the Chief Administration Officer is authorized to execute26 and file with its applications the annual certifications and assurances and
