- 1 SECTION 1. § 2-2-1 of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque is amended 2 as follows: **"§ 2-2-1 CREATION OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE.** 3 4 There is hereby created a Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and 5 Legislative Relations [that shall be comprised and convene as follows:]. 6 [(A)] The Committee shall be composed of six voting members. Three 7 voting members of the committee shall be members of the City Council, The 8 remaining three voting members shall be designated by the Mayor. The Chief 9 Administrative Officer shall chair the committee [and two other members of the 10 Administration shall occupy the remaining committee positions.] 11 [(B)] The staff support to the committee shall be provided jointly by the 12 Chief Administrative Officer and the Director of Council Services. 13 [(C) The committee shall meet monthly and may convene additional 14 meetings by request of the Chair of the Committee or by a joint request from 15 the three City Council Committee Members.]" 16 SECTION 2. § 2-2-2 of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque is amended 17 as follows: "§ 2-2-2 AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR. 18 19 The Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and Legislative Relations shall 20 have the express authority to do the following: 21 (A) Promote cooperation [and] [-1] encourage coordination between the city[,] 22 [the federal, and state, and local, governments.] [-and other governmental 23 entities, particularly the state the county, Albuquerque Public Schools, 24 Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority and Middle Rio 25 **Grandel:** 26 (B) Attend such meetings of other governmental entities as may be **27** necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article; 28 (C) Prepare [a legislative program] for submission prior to October 1st, of 29 each calendar year [a state legislative program resolution that includes the
  - Mayor's, the City Council's and City Councilors requests for capital outlay and
- 31 policy initiatives. The Mayor, the Council and or individual Councilors, may
- 32 submit requests as additional capital outlay needs are identified.] [to the

- 1 Mayor and Council for their approval and draft appropriate legislation on behalf 2 of the city prior to each session of the legislature of the state.] 3 (D) Represent the city and coordinate its legislative efforts at any general or 4 special session of the legislature of the state; (E) [Prepare by December 1s for approval by the committee, and adoption by 5 6 the Council at the following Council Meeting, a Federal program resolution for 7 the City of Albuquerque's grant, policy initiative, and program requests to the 8 Federal Government.-The Mayor, the Council and or individual Councilors, may 9 submit requests as additional grant and program needs are identified. The 10 Resolution and additional requests shall be submitted to the members of the 11 New Mexico Congressional Delegation and agencies of the Federal 12 Government, as needed.] [Prepare a legislative program for submission prior to 13 December, 30 of each calendar year to the Mayor or the Council for their 14 approval and draft appropriate legislation on behalf of the city prior to each 15 session of the United States Congress. 16 (F) Adopt and promulgate rules, regulations and orders necessary to 17 implement any authority delegated to the committee by this article; 18 (G) Represent the city and coordinate its federal [and state] legislative 19 program[s]. in Washington, D.C and at the State Capital and with State 20 Agencies; [Bracketed/Strikethrough Material]

  28 (H) Work with the New Mexico Municipal League to coordinate the activities of the city with the programs and activities of other municipalities throughout the state including reviewing and approving the City of Albuquerque's annual membership to the league [and any initiatives proposed between the City of Albuquerque and the Municipal League.] (I) Engage and manage the services of representatives at the state and federal level to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities provided in this article [including reviewing and submitting for approval to the
  - City Council proposed contracts and legal obligations between the City of Albuquerque and such representatives.]"
  - SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not

	1	affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Council
	2	hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section,
	3	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any
	4	provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
	5	SECTION 4. COMPILATION. SECTION 1 and SECTION 2 of this Ordinance
	6	shall amend, be incorporated in, and made part of the Revised Ordinances of
	7	Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.
	8	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect five days
	9	after publication by title and general summary.
