SPECIAL ELECTION RESOLUTION

2 **CONCERNING A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION RELATING TO PROPOSED**
3 **AMENDMENTS TO THE ALBUQUERQUE CITY CHARTER; AND CONCERNING**
4 **A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF**
5 **ALBUQUERQUE AT THE NEXT CITY REGULAR ELECTION; SUBMITTING TO A**
6 **VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED, REGISTERED ELECTORS AND NONRESIDENT**
7 **MUNICIPAL ELECTORS AT SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION CERTAIN**
8 **QUESTIONS FOR AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL**
9 **OBLIGATION BONDS IN VARYING PRINCIPAL AMOUNTS AND FOR SPECIFIED**
10 **PUBLIC PURPOSES AND, TO THE QUALIFIED REGISTERED ELECTORS**
11 **PROVIDING THE FORM OF THE BOND QUESTIONS AND THE DESIGNATION**
12 **CLAUSE FOR SUCH QUESTIONS ON THE BALLOT; PRESCRIBING**
13 **OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION AND**
14 **BONDS; AND RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION**
15 **THEREWITH.**

16 **WHEREAS**, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Albuquerque (the
17 "City") in the County of Bernalillo and State of New Mexico, hereby determines that it is
18 necessary and in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants to issue general
19 obligation bonds in the principal amounts and for the purposes provided herein; and

20 **WHEREAS**, the Council has the power to submit questions of issuing general
21 obligations bonds to the qualified electorate of the City pursuant to applicable laws of
22 the State of New Mexico, the City Charter and the City's home rule power pursuant to
23 Article X, Section 6 of the New Mexico Constitution; and

24 **WHEREAS**, certain of the projects approved by the Council in the 2015 Capital
25 Improvements Program to be funded by the proceeds of general obligation bonds have

1 been re-grouped for the purposes of the ballot faces; and

2 **WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines and declares that all of the projects
3 (the "Projects") for which the questions of issuing the City's general obligation bonds
4 (the "Bond Election Questions") are set forth herein are or will be for public purposes;
5 and

6 **WHEREAS**, a regular municipal election is required to be held in the City of
7 Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 6th day of October, 2015, at which an election relating to
8 the offices of Councilor of Districts 4, 6 and 8 will be held in accordance with the City
9 Charter; a n d

10 **WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines that a special municipal election will
11 be held in the City of Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 6th day of October, 2015 relating to
12 the Bond Election Questions; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the Council previously approved three questions: 1) P-15-8,
14 requiring advice and consent by the City Council for the appointment of the fire chief
15 and police chief, 2) P-15-9 relating to the signature requirements for direct legislation by
16 voter initiative, and 3) P-15-10 relating the ballot requirements for charter amendments
17 (the "Charter Amendments"), and called for these questions to be included as part of the
18 next regular municipal election.

19 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**
20 **CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:**

21 **Section 1:** All action, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution,
22 heretofore taken by the Council and the officers of the City, directed toward the Bond
23 Election Questions and the Projects described or referred to in the Bond Election
24 Questions, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the calling and
25 holding of an election to authorize the issuance of the general obligation bonds (the
26 "Bonds") to finance the Projects, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and
27 confirmed. Funding for projects identified within one General Obligation Bond purpose
28 may be reallocated to another project within the same purpose, provided that any such
29 reallocation is approved by appropriate legislation.

30 **Section 2:** At the next regular city election of municipal officers to be held in
31 the City a special election (such regular election and special election being sometimes
32 referred to herein as the "Election") shall be held and there shall be submitted to the

1 City's qualified, registered electors and, to the nonresident municipal electors as herein
2 provided ("nonresident municipal electors"), the Bond Election Questions set forth in
3 Section 8 hereof. A registered, nonresident municipal elector means any person who
4 on the date of election, is a qualified registered elector of Bernalillo County but who is a
5 resident of that portion of Bernalillo County which is outside of the Albuquerque city
6 limits, who has paid a property tax on property located within the City of Albuquerque
7 during the year preceding the election and who has registered with the City Clerk of
8 Albuquerque his or her intention to vote at the general obligation bond election by filing
9 with the office of the City Clerk of Albuquerque a certificate of eligibility announcing such
10 person's intention to vote at such election on the questions of creating municipal debt.

11 **Section 3:** For the purpose of this Resolution and solely for the purpose of
12 voting on the Bond Election Questions, all territory within the County of Bernalillo is a
13 "Municipal Precinct." All territory in the Municipal Precinct and not within the City's
14 boundaries shall constitute one voting division to be known as the "Nonresident Voting
15 Division." The Nonresident Voting Division shall include the territory within the
16 boundary of any other municipality within the County. The polling place within the City
17 for nonresident municipal electors desiring to vote on the Bond Election Questions shall
18 be at a location in Albuquerque, New Mexico, as designated by the City Clerk, which
19 polling place shall be separate from any other polling place located within the City.

20 **Section 4:** The City's qualified, registered, resident electors are eligible to vote
21 on candidates, questions and Bond Election Questions being submitted at the Election.
22 The City's qualified, registered, nonresident electors are eligible to vote only on the
23 Bond Election Questions. No judge or clerk of election shall allow a person to vote
24 unless he or she is duly registered as a voter with the Bernalillo County Clerk and
25 unless he or she meets the qualifications of a resident elector or a nonresident
26 municipal elector.

27 **Section 5:** All persons desiring to vote for any candidate or on any questions
28 being submitted at the Election (including nonresident municipal electors who may vote
29 only on the Bond Election Questions) must be registered to vote. Any person who is
30 otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered to vote may register at the
31 office of the Bernalillo County Clerk, 6th Floor, One Civic Plaza, Albuquerque, New

1 Mexico, or at the office of any duly appointed deputy registration officer on or before
2 5:00 p.m., on the twenty-eighth day immediately preceding the election.

3 **Section 6:** Not more than sixty, nor less than fifteen, days before the Election,
4 any nonresident municipal elector desiring to vote on the Bond Election Questions shall
5 file with the City Clerk a certificate of eligibility which shall be the nonresident municipal
6 elector's additional registration requirement for voting at the Election on the Bond
7 Election Questions. Each nonresident municipal elector must file such certificate of
8 eligibility in addition to registering to vote with the Bernalillo County Clerk. The certificate
9 of eligibility shall be in substantially the following form:

8 **Section 7:** Absentee voting will be permitted as authorized by state law, as
9 amended and supplemented. Applications for absentee ballots may be obtained from
10 the City Clerk's Office. The absentee voters' polling place will be located at the City
11 Clerk's Office, or as may be otherwise designated by the City Clerk. See Exhibit "A"
12 hereto. The judges and clerks will be those persons so designated for the regular
13 municipal election.

14 **Section 8:** The Bond Election Questions shall be submitted on paper ballots.
15 The votes cast for and against each Bond Election Question at the Election shall be
16 tabulated on the election tabulation system counters. The paper ballots shall contain the
17 designation clauses for the Bond Election Questions and shall be printed in English and
18 Spanish with plain, clear type in black ink on white material of such size as will fit the
19 paper ballots. The complete Bond Election Questions, in English and Spanish, shall be
20 placed near the voting booths in plain view so that the complete questions may be
21 examined by the qualified voters before they vote. The ballot faces shall be in

7 **Section 10:** The polls shall be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on
8 election day. Except as provided in Section 3 hereof and except for absentee voting, the polls
9 shall be located in each of the precincts of the City, or consolidated precincts as shall be
10 established by the City. See Exhibit "A" hereto. Except as provided in Section 3 hereof and
11 except for absentee voters, each voter shall cast his or her ballot at the polling place in the
12 precinct or consolidated precinct in which he or she resides.

13 **Section 11:** The election on the Bond Election Questions shall be held and conducted
14 in accordance with the Bond Election Act, the Municipal Election Code and the Election Code
15 of the City Charter.

16 **Section 12:** The judges and clerks for the Nonresident Voting Division precinct will be
17 appointed by the City Council as provided in the Municipal Election Code and the Election
18 Code of the City Charter.

19 **Section 13:** The vote on the Bond Election Questions shall be canvassed as early as
20 is possible in accordance with the Municipal Election Code, the Bond Election Act, and the
21 Election Code of the City Charter, as amended and supplemented, and the City Clerk shall
22 certify the results of the bond election and shall enter them in the official minute book of the
23 City.

24 **Section 14:** This Resolution shall be published in the English and Spanish languages
25 at least once a week for four consecutive weeks by four insertions, the first insertion being
26 published between fifty (50) and sixty (60) days before the day of the Election in a newspaper
27 or newspapers which are of general circulation in the City and which otherwise qualify as
28 legal newspapers in the City. The City Clerk is hereby instructed and authorized to carry out
29 this provision.

31 City Clerk, Plaza del Sol, 600 2nd Street NW, 7th Floor, Albuquerque, New Mexico.




