BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 7 8 **ALBUQUERQUE:** 9 Section 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance may be cited as "Americans with Disabilities Act Advisory 10 11 Council Ordinance.". [Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion 12 Section 2. FINDINGS. [Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with 13 Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"), the City of Albuquerque will not discriminate 14 against qualified individuals with disabilities in the provision of services, 15 16 programs or activities; and The City of Albuquerque does not discriminate on the basis of 17 2. disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all 18 19 regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); and 20 21 The City of Albuquerque will make reasonable modifications to 22 ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all City 23 programs, services and activities; and The City of Albuquerque seeks: to enhance the community by the 24 contributions of persons with disabilities; to make a positive difference in their 25 relationship with the community by working toward providing full access to 26

facilities, programs, services, activities and employment; and to enable

- 1 persons with disabilities to equally participate in the social and economic life 2 of the city.
- 3 Section 3. MEMBERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION.
- 4 The ADA Council shall be comprised of 10 members, at least six of whom shall be individuals with disabilities who represent the six major life functions 5 identified in the Americans with Disabilities Act. 6
 - The mayor shall appoint the ADA Council members subject to the 1. advice and consent of the City Council. Both the Mayor and individual City Councilors may recommend potential Board members to the Mayor.
- 10 ADA Council members shall serve without compensation. 2.
- The ADA Council shall select, by majority vote, two of the appointees 11 3. 12 as the chairperson and vice-chairperson of the Council.
- 13 Section 4. MEETINGS.

- 1. The ADA Council shall meet monthly.
- 15 2. Because of the special considerations of persons with disabilities 16 due to health or logistical problems the following shall apply:
 - a. A quorum shall consist of five members of the Council; and
 - b. A member of the Council may participate in the meeting by means of a conference telephone, web based broadcast such as skype or other similar communications equipment and/or software when it is otherwise difficult or impossible for the member to attend in person, provided that each member participating by such methods can be identified when speaking, all participants are able to hear each other at the same time and members of the public attending the meeting are able to hear any member of the Council who speaks during the meeting.
 - 3. The Council shall comply with all applicable policies, ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of the City.
 - Section 5. DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND POWERS.
 - The mission of the ADA Advisory Council is to support the civil rights of, and full integration into, Albuquerque community life for all people with disabilities. The ADA Advisory Council shall:
- 32 Advise the Mayor and City Council on issues affecting people with 1. 33 disabilities.

- 2. Provide a public forum to identify, discuss, and address issues relevant to people with disabilities.
- 3 Report on accessibility problems around the City.
- 4 4. Provide information to the city's ADA Coordinator about disability concerns expressed by the public.
- 5. Provide information, educational opportunities and networking
 opportunities to all citizens with disabilities.
- 8 6. Establish criteria for prioritizing the remedial steps to address
 9 access needs within the community.
- 10 7. Develop operating procedures for the ADA Council.
- 11 8. Review City government program services and activity access for physical, sensory, or other impediments.
- 9. Review City codes with the City's Office of Diversity & Human Rightsrelating to disability rights and access.
- 10. Make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding a community transition plan that addresses: barriers (non-structural) to city programs, services and activities and barriers (structural) to city facilities including parks and trails.
 - Section 6. TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.
 - The ADA Council will receive effective and ongoing training and technical assistance from the City's Office of Diversity and Human Rights to ensure that they understand the information they receive and are able to provide effective oversight of and make appropriate decisions regarding the City of Albuquerque's compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.
 - Section 7. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
