12	operation of Fire Station 29 to the County at the end of Calendar Year 2011; and	
13	WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Fire Department has expressed a need to	
14	preserve the 15 positions from Station 29 and re-deploy them to fill service gaps	
15	to include a ladder unit in the northwestern part of Albuquerque.
