2 **CONCERNING A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE**
3 **CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE AT THE NEXT CITY GENERAL ELECTION;**
4 **SUBMITTING TO A VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED, REGISTERED ELECTORS AND**
5 **NONRESIDENT MUNICIPAL ELECTORS AT SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION**
6 **CERTAIN QUESTIONS FOR AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL**
7 **OBLIGATION BONDS IN VARYING PRINCIPAL AMOUNTS AND FOR SPECIFIED**
8 **PUBLIC PURPOSES AND, TO THE QUALIFIED REGISTERED ELECTORS**
9 **PROVIDING THE FORM OF THE BOND QUESTIONS AND THE DESIGNATION**
10 **CLAUSE FOR SUCH QUESTIONS ON THE BALLOT; PRESCRIBING**
11 **OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH SPECIAL ELECTION AND**
12 **BONDS; AND RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION**
13 **THEREWITH.**

14 **WHEREAS**, the City Council (the “Council”) of the City of Albuquerque (the
15 “City”) in the County of Bernalillo and State of New Mexico, hereby determines that it is
16 necessary and in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants to issue general
17 obligation bonds and gross receipts tax revenue bonds in the principal amounts and for
18 the purposes provided herein; and

19 **WHEREAS**, the Council has the power to submit questions of issuing general
20 obligations bonds and gross receipts tax revenue bonds to the qualified electorate of the
21 City pursuant to applicable laws of the State of New Mexico, the City Charter and the
22 City’s home rule power pursuant to Article X, Section 6 of the New Mexico Constitution;
23 and

24 **WHEREAS**, certain of the projects approved by the Council in the 2015 Capital
25 Improvements Program to be funded by the proceeds of general obligation bonds have

1 been re-grouped for the purposes of the ballot faces; and

2 **WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines and declares that all of the projects
3 (the "Projects") for which the questions of issuing the City's general obligation bonds
4 (the "Bond Election Questions") are set forth herein are or will be for public purposes;
5 and

6 **WHEREAS**, a regular municipal election is required to be held in the City of
7 Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 6th day of October, 2015, at which an election relating to
8 the offices of Councilor of Districts 4, 6 and 8 will be held in accordance with the City
9 Charter; a n d

10 **WHEREAS**, the Council hereby determines that a special municipal election will
11 be held in the City of Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 6th day of October, 2015 relating to
12 the Bond Election Questions.

13 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**
14 **CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:**

15 **Section 1:** All action, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution,
16 heretofore taken by the Council and the officers of the City, directed toward the Bond
17 Election Questions and the Projects described or referred to in the Bond Election
18 Questions, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the calling and
19 holding of an election to authorize the issuance of the general obligation bonds (the
20 "Bonds") to finance the Projects, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and
21 confirmed. Funding for projects identified within one GO Bond purpose may be
22 reallocated to another project within the same purpose, provided that any such
23 reallocation is approved by appropriate legislation.

24 **Section 2:** At the next regular city election of municipal officers to be held in
25 the City a special election (such regular election and special election being sometimes
26 referred to herein as the "Election") shall be held and there shall be submitted to the
27 City's qualified, registered electors and, to the nonresident municipal electors as herein
28 provided ("nonresident municipal electors"), the Bond Election Questions set forth in
29 Section 8 hereof. A registered, nonresident municipal elector means any person who
30 on the date of election, is a qualified registered elector of Bernalillo County but who is a
31 resident of that portion of Bernalillo County which is outside of the Albuquerque city
32 limits, who has paid a property tax on property located within the City of Albuquerque

1 during the year preceding the election and who has registered with the City Clerk of
2 Albuquerque his or her intention to vote at the general obligation bond election by filing
3 with the office of the City Clerk of Albuquerque a certificate of eligibility announcing such
4 person's intention to vote at such election on the questions of creating municipal debt.

5 **Section 3:** For the purpose of this Resolution and solely for the purpose of
6 voting on the Bond Election Questions, all territory within the County of Bernalillo is a
7 "Municipal Precinct." All territory in the Municipal Precinct and not within the City's
8 boundaries shall constitute one voting division to be known as the "Nonresident Voting
9 Division." The Nonresident Voting Division shall include the territory within the
10 boundary of any other municipality within the County. The polling place within the City
11 for nonresident municipal electors desiring to vote on the Bond Election Questions shall
12 be at a location in Albuquerque, New Mexico, as designated by the City Clerk, which
13 polling place shall be separate from any other polling place located within the City.

14 **Section 4:** The City's qualified, registered, resident electors are eligible to vote
15 on candidates, questions and Bond Election Questions being submitted at the Election.
16 The City's qualified, registered, nonresident electors are eligible to vote only on the
17 Bond Election Questions. No judge or clerk of election shall allow a person to vote
18 unless he or she is duly registered as a voter with the Bernalillo County Clerk and
19 unless he or she meets the qualifications of a resident elector or a nonresident
20 municipal elector.

21 **Section 5:** All persons desiring to vote for any candidate or on any questions
22 being submitted at the Election (including nonresident municipal electors who may vote
23 only on the Bond Election Questions) must be registered to vote. Any person who is
24 otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered to vote may register at the
25 office of the Bernalillo County Clerk, 6th Floor, One Civic Plaza, Albuquerque, New
26 Mexico, or at the office of any duly appointed deputy registration officer on or before
27 5:00 p.m., on the twenty-eighth day immediately preceding the election.

28 **Section 6:** Not more than sixty, nor less than fifteen, days before the Election,
29 any nonresident municipal elector desiring to vote on the Bond Election Questions shall
30 file with the City Clerk a certificate of eligibility which shall be the nonresident municipal
31 elector's additional registration requirement for voting at the Election on the Bond
32 Election Questions. Each nonresident municipal elector must file such certificate of

1 eligibility in addition to registering to vote with the Bernalillo County Clerk. The certificate
2 of eligibility shall be in substantially the following form:

1 **Section 7:** Absentee voting will be permitted as authorized by state law, as
2 amended and supplemented. Applications for absentee ballots may be obtained from
3 the City Clerk’s Office. The absentee voters’ polling place will be located at the City
4 Clerk’s Office, or as may be otherwise designated by the City Clerk. The judges and
5 clerks will be those persons so designated for the regular municipal election.

6 **Section 8:** The Bond Election Questions shall be submitted on paper ballots.
7 The votes cast for and against each Bond Election Question at the Election shall be
8 tabulated on the election tabulation system counters. The paper ballots shall contain the
9 designation clauses for the Bond Election Questions and shall be printed in English and
10 Spanish with plain, clear type in black ink on white material of such size as will fit the
11 paper ballots. The complete Bond Election Questions, in English and Spanish, shall be
12 placed near the voting booths in plain view so that the complete questions may be
13 examined by the qualified voters before they vote. The ballot faces shall be in
14 substantially the following form:

7 **Section 10:** The polls shall be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on
8 election day. Except as provided in Section 3 hereof and except for absentee voting, the polls
9 shall be located in each of the precincts of the City, or consolidated precincts as shall be
10 established by the City. Except as provided in Section 3 hereof and except for absentee
11 voters, each voter shall cast his or her ballot at the polling place in the precinct or consolidated
12 precinct in which he or she resides.

13 **Section 11:** The election on the Bond Election Questions shall be held and conducted
14 in accordance with the Bond Election Act, the Municipal Election Code and the Election Code
15 of the City Charter.

16 **Section 12:** The judges and clerks for the Nonresident Voting Division precinct will be
17 appointed by the City Council as provided in the Municipal Election Code and the Election
18 Code of the City Charter.

19 **Section 13:** The vote on the Bond Election Questions shall be canvassed as early as
20 is possible in accordance with the Municipal Election Code, the Bond Election Act, and the
21 Election Code of the City Charter, as amended and supplemented, and the City Clerk shall
22 certify the results of the bond election and shall enter them in the official minute book of the
23 City.

24 **Section 14:** The Bond Election Resolution shall be published in the English and
25 Spanish languages at least once a week for four consecutive weeks by four insertions, the first
26 insertion being published between fifty (50) and sixty (60) days before the day of the Election
27 in a newspaper or newspapers which are of general circulation in the City and which
28 otherwise qualify as legal newspapers in the City. The City Clerk is hereby instructed and
29 authorized to carry out this provision.

30 **Section 15:** For further information concerning this election, consult the Office of the
31 City Clerk, One Civic Plaza NW, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

1 **Section 16:** The officers of the City be and they hereby are authorized and directed to
2 take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution.

3 **Section 17:** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall for
4 any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such
5 section, paragraph, clause or provisions shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this
6 Resolution. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each
7 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word, or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision
8 being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

9 **Section 18:** All resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are
10 hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed
11 to revive any resolution or ordinance, or parts thereof, heretofore repealed.

10 assigned a specific polling location for Early Voting or on Election Day. For purposes
11 of consolidating precincts, the City is consolidated into one precinct – CP1. The
12 Consolidated Voting Centers are assigned numbers for organizational purposes. The
13 Office of the City Clerk wishes to make clear to all City Voters that they may cast their
14 ballots at any one of the nine (9) Early Voting locations or at any one of the sixty-one
15 (61) Consolidated Voting Centers on Election Day, October 6, 2015. The Early
16 Voting locations and Consolidated Voting Centers are in addition to the voter's ability to
17 vote via Absentee Ballot by request.

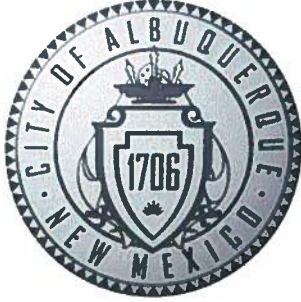


