SUBJECT: Mayor's Recommendation of Award (ROA) for RFP No. 2019000055 "Property

Information Management and Laboratory Information Management System"

The City of Albuquerque's Police Department in conjunction with the Department of Finance, Purchasing Division, issued the RFP for a Property Information Management and Laboratory Information Management System.

The RFP was posted on the Purchasing E-Procurement, Sicomm.net website and advertised in the Albuquerque Journal.

The City received four (4) responses to this solicitation. The ad hoc evaluation committee evaluated and scored the proposals received in accordance with the evaluation criteria published in the RFP. After thoroughly reviewing and scoring the proposals, Porter Lee Corporation earned a score of 2070 points. The ad hoc committee found Porter Lee Corporation to be both responsive and qualified and recommends an award to Porter Lee Corporation.

I concur with this recommendation.

Cover Analysis

- 1. What is it? The City of Albuquerque's Police Department (APD) will be contracting with Porter Lee Corporation to provide a Property Information Management and Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) for the APD Crime Lab.
- **2.** What will this piece of legislation do? This legislation will approve the RFP committee's recommendation of award to Porter Lee Corporation.
- **3.** Why is this project needed? To track cases, the APD Crime Lab utilizes multiple independent databases for evidence/case management, case file documentation, and reporting. Since these systems typically do not "speak to" each other, they require redundant manual data entries and data transcription. LIMS will provide a complete case management solution from submission of evidence to final case disposition. The implementation of a LIMS will enhance the capacity and increase the efficiency of the Laboratory by eliminating duplication of effort, reducing transcription errors, and increasing time spent on casework and backlog reduction for not only the DNA Unit, but all of the scientific units of the laboratory. Additionally, a LIMS will help to enable real-time tracking of forensic evidence through the laboratory by supervisors,
- **4.** How much will it cost and what is the funding source? The cost of LIMS for the purchase, implementation and maintenance agreements will be \$1.4 million dollars over a five year period. A final contract with exact terms and conditions will be negotiated by DFAS Purchasing. APD received a federal grant in the amount of \$262,500 that will be applied toward the project. Most of the balance will be paid using general fund monies currently budgeted in the Scientific Evidence Division operating accounts for Fiscal Year 2020 although the maintenance agreement and licensing costs will be extended into years two through five. Additional annual maintenance and licensing costs may be requested in the Fiscal Year 2021 and successive budgets.
- 5. Is there a revenue source associated with this Plan? If so, what level of income is projected? There is no revenue source associated with this contract.
