ENACTMENT NUMBER R-2013-114. 3 TITLED: ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR THE TIMEFRAMES FOR PURGING OF LICENSE PLATE READER RECORDS BY THE ALBUQUERQUE POLICE 4 5 DEPARTMENT: TO EXTEND THE TIME PERIOD THE ALBUQUERQUE POLICE DEPARTMENT MAY KEEP INFORMATION FROM LICENSE PLATE READERS 6 7 BEFORE PURGING THE INFORMATION. 8 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Police Department ("APD") employs license 9 plate readers that record a still image of vehicle license plates and location information from vehicles parked or driving in public location; and 10 - Deletion 11 WHEREAS, license plate images and location data can assist in legitimate Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 police activity, including but not limited to locating missing persons and 13 stolen vehicles; and Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] 14 WHEREAS, the license plate images are in a format that allows storage and 15 archiving of the images for indefinite periods of time; and 16 WHEREAS, the City Council previously passed a resolution restricting 17 APD's access to the information gathered from license plate readers, requiring 18 APD to purge such information after fourteen days; and 19 WHEREAS, APD can more effectively locate missing persons and stolen 20 vehicles if permitted to access the information gathered from license plate 21 readers for a longer period of time. 22 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 23 **ALBUQUERQUE:** 24 SECTION 1. Section 1 of R-13-220, Enactment Number R-2013-114, page 25 one, lines 19 to 24, are replaced with the following language:

It shall be the policy of the City that the Albuquerque Police Department shall purge each license plate image and all associated information from its databases within one (1) year from the date of collection unless a longer period of retention is required for a particular license plate image, images or information because of an ongoing criminal investigation. #### **Cover Analysis**

#### 1. What is it?

Legislation extending the time period that APD may keep information from license plate readers.

#### 2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This legislation amends a previously adopted resolution, R-13-22, establishing a policy for the timeframes for purging of license plate reader records by APD, extending the time period that the department may keep information from license plate readers from two weeks to one year. This will allow APD to more effectively locate missing persons and stolen vehicles, as access to the information gathered from license plate readers will be possible for a longer period of time.

#### 3. Why is this project needed?

License plate images and location data can assist in locating missing persons and stolen vehicles. R-13-22 limited the retention of license plate information to two weeks, which restricts the use of this information in investigations.

#### 4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

There is no additional cost associated with this change, as the City's contract currently includes storage of information up to one year.

# 5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected? No.

#### 6. What will happen if the project is not approved?

APD will continue to purge license plate images and associated information from its database after two weeks, potentially impacting investigations and location of missing persons and stolen vehicles.
