Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

A new grant application for federal assistance for the operations of Albuquerque Community Safety and it's Violence Intervention Program. The goal is to expand and sustain existing violence intervention programs within Albuquerque. This effort will be a collaborative work between the City of Albuquerque and the Vera Institute, who was the primary applicant on the grant with ACS as subawardee.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

Allow the City to apply for state funding from the Department of Justice grant for the operation of violence intervention work within the City of Albuquerque with the Vera Institute as a technical assistance provider. This will be a joint effort between the two entities, providing evidence-based violence prevention efforts to disrupt cycles of gun violence, gang violence, and auto theft.

3. Why is the project needed?

To expand violence prevention work in Albuquerque leveraging best practices from across the nation.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The application is seeking \$400,000 from October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2026. There are no matching funds required for this grant. The funding source is from the U.S. Department of Justice.

5. Is there a revenue source associate with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected.

The grant award of \$400,000 is the revenue source. Since matching funds are not required, there is no City cash match requirement to impact the General Fund.

6. What will happen if the project is not approved?

The partnership with Vera will significantly deteriorate and the programming it would fund would not happen.

7. Is this service already provided by another entity?

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No.
