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1 —(2)—A[a] member of the Council may participate in the meeting by means  
2 of a conference telephone, web based broadcast such as skype or other  
3 similar communications equipment and/or software when it is otherwise  
4 difficult or impossible for the member to attend in person, provided that each  
5 member participating by such methods can be identified when speaking, all  
6 participants are able to hear each other at the same time and members of the  
7 public attending the meeting are able to hear any member of the Council who  
8 speaks during the meeting.

9 (C) The Council shall comply with all applicable policies, ordinances,  
10 resolutions, rules and regulations of the city[;][.]”

11 SECTION 3. § 2-6-5-5 DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND POWERS is  
12 hereby amended as follows:

13 “The mission of the [ABQ] ADA Advisory Council is to support the civil rights  
14 of, and full integration into, Albuquerque community life for all people with  
15 disabilities. The [ABQ] ADA Advisory Council shall:

16 (A) Advise the Mayor and City Council on issues affecting people with  
17 disabilities.

18 (B) Provide a public forum to identify, discuss, and address issues relevant  
19 to people with disabilities.

20 (C) Report on accessibility problems around the city.

21 (D) Provide information to the city's ADA Coordinator about disability  
22 concerns expressed by the public.

23 (E) Provide information, educational opportunities and networking  
24 opportunities to all citizens with disabilities.

25 (F) Establish criteria for prioritizing the remedial steps to address access  
26 needs within the community.

27 (G) Develop operating procedures for the [ABQ] ADA Council.

28 (H) Review city government program services and activity access for  
29 physical, sensory, or other impediments.

30 (I) Review city codes with the city's Office of Diversity & Human Rights  
31 relating to disability rights and access.

32 (J) Make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding a  
33 community transition plan that addresses: barriers (non-structural) to city

1 programs, services and activities and barriers (structural) to city facilities  
2 including parks and trails.”

3 SECTION 4. § 2-6-5-6 TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE is hereby  
4 amended as follows:

5 “ The [ABQ] ADA Council will receive effective and ongoing training and  
6 technical assistance from the city's Office of Diversity and Human Rights to  
7 ensure that they understand the information they receive and are able to  
8 provide effective oversight of and make appropriate decisions regarding the  
9 City of Albuquerque's compliance with Title II of the Americans with  
10 Disabilities Act of 1990.”

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
