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1 Department, Santa Fe County Sheriff's Office, Socorro Police Department,
2 Socorro County Sheriff's Office, Taos County Sheriff's Office, Taos Police
3 Department, and Union County Sheriff's Office; and

4 WHEREAS, APD has access to grant funding opportunities through the US
5 Department of Health and Human Services' Opioid Initiative, which is
6 administered locally by the New Mexico Human Services Department, as well
7 as other opportunities through the University of New Mexico Health Sciences
8 Center; and

9 WHEREAS, naloxone has a shelf life of two years and must be replaced
10 biennially.

11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
12 ALBUQUERQUE:

13 Section 1. That a new priority objective is created under the PUBLIC
14 SAFETY GOAL reading as follows:

15 "The Albuquerque Police Department shall, by March 1, 2017, explore other
16 law enforcement agencies' naloxone protocols with the aim of developing a
17 naloxone protocol for all officers in the Department. The Department shall:
18 work with officials at the UNM Health Sciences Center to research and
19 apply for grant funding sufficient to cover the cost of placing a naloxone kit
20 in each of APD's vehicles and develop a plan for replacing naloxone kits as
21 they are used or expire; submit a report with recommendations to the
22 Mayor and City Council by June 1, 2017 identifying grant funding
23 opportunities for initial implementation and ongoing funding sources; and
24 develop the initial training module for field officers and an implementation
25 date for training, which shall commence no later than June 1, 2017.

26 Procurement and placement of Naloxone in police vehicles shall be phased
27 in over the 12-month period beginning June 1, 2017, and ending May 31,
28 2018. No fewer than 50% of police vehicles shall have a Naloxone kit in
29 place by December 1, 2017."

30 Section 2. Implementation and continuation of the City's naloxone protocol
31 shall be dependent upon feasibility, availability of the drug, and available
32 funding.

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
