COUNCIL BILL NO. ______ R-21-213 ____ ENACTMENT NO. ______ R-2021-084 SPONSORED BY: Pat Davis 1 RESOLUTION DECLARING A STAY OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE ALBUQUERQUE TAX 2 3 PREPARER AND CONSUMER RIGHTS ORDINANCE. WHEREAS, the City administration presented the Albuquerque Tax 4 Preparer and Consumer Rights Ordinance (the "Ordinance") to the City 5 Council in December of 2020, and it was enacted in February 2021 (Bill No. O-6 7 20-45, Enactment No. O-2021-003); and 8 WHEREAS, the City administration has requested amendments to the ordinance as originally drafted and passed, and stakeholders have also 9 engaged with the City Council to consider amendments to the Ordinance via 10 bill O-21-77 to address certain deficiencies and ambiguities in the Ordinance 11 12 as it was enacted; and 13 WHEREAS, consumers and the impacted industry will be best served by a thoughtful and contemplative review process by the City Council to help 14 ensure that the updates proposed within O-21-77 address and remedy the 15 problems with the ordinance in its existing form; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the tax season for the 2021 tax year is quickly approaching and proposed changes, if adopted, would require additional work by the City and 18 the industry to implement notice, compliance and compliant processing, and 19 20 those processes are not likely to be in place before the tax season; and WHEREAS, acting upon O-21-77 in November or December in anticipation 21 of the 2022 tax season will not offer enough advance notice to consumers and 22 23 the impacted industry on the rules for tax preparers for the forthcoming tax 24

season: and

1	WHEREAS, sufficient time should be taken to consider O-21-77 to provide			
2	sufficient advanced notice of its effects, and to promote confidence amongst			
3	consumers and the impacted industry; and			
4	WHEREAS, notwithstanding the need for sufficient time to consider O-21-			
5	77, it is not in the best interest of the City to enforce the Ordinance during the			
6	forthcoming tax season because of its need for updates and improvements.			
7	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY O			
8	ALBUQUERQUE:			
9	Section 1. Enforcement of the Albuquerque Tax Preparer and Consumer			
10	Rights Ordinance, ROA 1994 §§ 13-20-1-1 through 13-20-1-15, is stayed until			
11	July 1, 2022. No provisions of the Albuquerque Tax Preparer and Consumer			
12	Rights Ordinance will be enforced during this time.			
13	Section 2. The City Council anticipates that it will continue its			
14	consideration of O-21-77, and that its resulting amendments will become			
15	enforceable upon expiration of this stay of enforcement.
