1	RESOLUTION
2	ESTABLISHING CITY POLICY FOR EVALUATING COMPETING CANNABIS
3	BUSINESS REGISTRATION REQUESTS WITHIN 600 FEET OF ONE ANOTHER
4	WHEREAS, the Integrated Development Ordinance (IDO) Section 4-
5	3(D)(35)(c) provides that Cannabis Retail establishments, except cannabis
6	micro businesses, be kept separate by a minimum of 600 feet unless a
7	conditional use permit is approved; and
8	WHEREAS, in order to administer this requirement the City must evaluate
9	each request for a cannabis retail establishment based, in part, on its
10	proximity to any previously existing cannabis retail establishments in the
11	community; and
12	WHEREAS, this system presents a unique challenge at the inception of
13	cannabis retail business development in the City because the City may be
14	evaluating multiple simultaneous requests within 600 feet of one another,
15	none of which have been finally approved or established for purposes of
16	applying distance separation requirements to subsequent applications; and
17	WHEREAS, in general, the IDO establishes policies that prioritize
18	potentially competing requests based, in part, on the time of their application;
19	and
20	WHEREAS, notwithstanding this policy guidance in the IDO, there is
21	presently no clear guidance within the City's business registration process for
22	cannabis retail businesses requesting initial approval within 600 feet of one
23	another; and
24	WHEREAS, both businesses and community members will be best served
25	by a clear, publicly adopted policy as to how new requests will be evaluated

with respect to the 600-foot separation requirement as the industry
 establishes its physical presence in the City; and
 WHEREAS, given that the City Council enacted the 600-foot separation
 provisions within the IDO, it is appropriate that the Council offer guidance on
 how that restriction should be administered; and

6 WHEREAS, final resolution on this question is time sensitive because the 7 retail checklist of the New Mexico Regulation and Licensing Division includes 8 a requirement of certification by cannabis retail establishments that they have 9 a local business license and will conform with zoning restrictions.

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF11 ALBUQUERQUE:

Section 1. For purposes of administering the IDO's 600-foot separationrequirements for cannabis retail establishments:

a. The City shall evaluate the 600-foot distance separation limitation
based on the time of application for business registration with the City.

b. A cannabis retail establishment that submits its request first in time
will be given first priority as compared to subsequently received applications
within the 600 foot distance.
