## 1. What is it?

Approval of Unallocated Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Match and Entitlement Funds as listed in the Second and Third Substantial Amendments of the HUD 2021 Action Plan.

# What will this piece of legislation do?

The legislation will approve unspent ESG funds from Program Year 2018, 2019, and 2020 to be added to the Program Year 2021 HUD Action Plan under the programs below. In total, \$303,144.50 of unallocated (ESG) match and entitlement funds will be added to the agencies currently receiving ESG funds.

# 3. Why is this project needed?

In order to maximize and leverage federal dollars, the ESG funds must be allocated to the agencies listed above. These funds will be used to provide services, such as housing and shelter, to people experiencing homelessness. Such services are not only a critical need for the City of Albuquerque but are eligible under the ESG program guidelines.

# 4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

In total, this legislation will approve \$303,144.50 of ESG funds. This includes \$212,303.47 of ESG Match funds and \$90,841.03 of ESG Entitlement funds.



**Barrett Shelter**- \$26,913.31 of Program Year 2019 ESG grant funds and \$16,319.99 of Program Year 2019 ESG match funds will be added to the original contract amount of \$54,671.64. New total amount of the Program Year 2021 activity is \$97,904.94.
