R-22-30 SPONSORED BY: Brook Bassan, by request 1 RESOLUTION 2 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF GRANT APPLICATIONS AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF POTENTIAL GRANT AWARDS FOR MULTIPLE CITY 3 DEPARTMENTS FROM ASSOCIATED GRANTOR AGENCIES AND PROVIDING 4 FOR AN APPROPRIATION TO THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE. 5 WHEREAS, any application or proposal for a federal or state grant must be 6 submitted to the City Council for review and approval; and 7 WHEREAS, in order to speed the availability of grant funding for critical 8 City programs and to improve the efficiency of the grant application process, 9 the following departments submit for approval a consolidated list of potential 10 -Bracketed/Strikethrough Material-1 - Deletion awards: Albuquerque Fire Rescue, Albuquerque Police Department, Family 11 and Community Services, Parks and Recreation, Transit, Environmental 12 Health, Office of Equity and Inclusion, Office of Emergency Management, Solid 13 14 Waste and Senior Affairs; and 15 WHEREAS, potential grant funds in the approximate amount of \$35,238,113 will be used to pay for various programs that further the goals of each 16 department and contribute to the wellbeing of the citizens of Albuquerque; 17 18 and 19 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque is desirous of accepting these funds for which funding of \$8,590,514 in City funds will be appropriated and 20 available beginning in the Fiscal Year 2023 for the purpose of meeting grant 21 22 cash match and indirect overhead requirements. 23 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 24 ALBUQUERQUE: 25 Section 1. That the list of estimated grant awards is hereby made a part of this resolution, is hereby approved and its submission and filing with the 26

appropriate official or office of the respective granting agency is in all respects approved.

Section 2. That upon award, estimated funds from the respective granting agencies listed and the appropriate City cash contributions for the purpose of indirect, FICA or cash match are hereby appropriated to the respective departments in the specified funds beginning in Fiscal Year 2023.

Section 3. That upon award, funds in the amount of \$43,828,627 consisting of \$35,238,113 from granting agencies (which includes \$432,426 for IDOH) and a local match of \$8,590,514 (which includes \$571,024 in IDOH) are hereby appropriated to the departments and funds specified in Section 5 beginning in Fiscal Year 2023, which includes \$5,931,109 from the Fiscal Year 2023 Transfer to Operating Grants Program from the General Fund 110 appropriated to the Operating Grants Fund 265, and \$2,659,405 appropriated from the Transit Capital Implementation Program Fund 305 to Transit Grant Fund 665 and/or the Transfer to Capital Grants program in the Transit Operating Fund 661 to the Capital Grants Fund 665.

Section 4. In the event that departments receive additional grants not listed below or the City cash contributions exceed the appropriated \$5,931,109, departments will be required to submit separate legislation.

Section 5. That the following are potential grant awards with possible City grant match requirements by fund and department:
