1	RESOLUTION
2	ESTABLISHING A COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR ROUTE 66
3	(CENTRAL AVENUE) ALONG ITS ENTIRE LENGTH THROUGH THE CITY;
4	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION
5	WHEREAS, Central Avenue is the City's most iconic remnant of Route 66
6	through Albuquerque; and
7	WHEREAS, Route 66 is a key part of Albuquerque's heritage, and the City
8	should continuously seek opportunities to enhance and promote it; and
9	WHEREAS, Central Avenue traverses the entire length of the City from East
10	to West and features some of the City's most iconic neighborhoods and
11	districts, but also suffers in many spots from blight and deterioration; and
12	WHEREAS, additional attention along the Route 66 Corridor is necessary in
13	order to continue supporting both those sections of the roadway that are
14	doing relatively well, as well of those sections in need of additional support;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, support in the forms of business incubation, better activation
17	of underutilized spaces, rehabilitation of iconic signage, better litter removal
18	and maintenance, economic development and tourism promotion would be
19	appropriate; now
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY
21	OF ALBUQUERQUE:
22	SECTION 1. Program Development. The City shall develop an improvement
23	plan for the Central Avenue Corridor that, at a minimum:
24	<ul> <li>Authorizes, establishes or promotes "pop-up" retail or artistic or</li> </ul>
25	cultural activities at vacant or underutilized locations;

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1	<ul> <li>Identifies opportunities for iconic sign rehabilitation, replacement or</li> </ul>
2	development and establishes a City-sponsored program that accomplishes
3	this work in collaboration with businesses and property owners;
4	<ul> <li>Establishes a marketing and business promotion program; and</li> </ul>
5	<ul> <li>Implements a clean-up and maintenance program that addresses</li> </ul>
6	litter, street cleaning, landscape maintenance, and immediate removal of
7	obstructions from public ways and sidewalks.
8	SECTION 2. Reporting. The City Administration shall submit a report of its
9	progress on this program to the City Council for its receipt by January 15,
10	2023.
11	SECTION 3. Appropriation. \$250,000 in one-time funding is unreserved
12	from the fund balance and appropriated to the Cultural Services Department to
13	administer in collaboration with other relevant City Departments for purposes
14	of funding this program during FY 23, as follows:
