- 1 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
- 2 ALBUQUERQUE:
- 3 SECTION 1. § 2-2-1 of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque is amended
- 4 as follows:
- 5 "§ 2-2-1 CREATION OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE.
- 6 There is hereby created a Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and
- 7 Legislative Relations [that shall be comprised and convene as follows:].
- 8 [(A)] The Committee shall be composed of six voting members. Three
- 9 voting members of the committee shall be members of the City Council, [and
- 10 the remaining six City Councilors may serve as alternates for the three Council
- 11 <u>committee members</u>]. The remaining three voting members shall be [members
- 12 of the Mayor's Administration, designated by the Mayor, and shall include the]
- 13 [designated by the Mayor. The] Chief Administrative Officer [, who] shall chair
- 14 the committee [, two other members of the Administration and three alternates
- 15 from the Administration.]
- 16 [(B)] The staff support to the committee shall be provided jointly by the
- 17 Chief Administrative Officer and the Director of Council Services.
- 18 [(C) The committee shall meet monthly. The Committee may convene
  - additional meetings by request of the Chair of the Committee or by a joint
  - request from the three City Council Committee Members.]"
  - SECTION 2. § 2-2-2 of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque is amended
- 22 as follows:
- 23 "§ 2-2-2 AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR.
- 24 The Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and Legislative Relations shall
- 25 have the express authority to do the following:
- 26 (A) Promote cooperation [and] [,] encourage coordination [and the
  - resolution of concerns and disagreements] between the city and other
- 28 governmental entities, particularly the [s][S]tate [of New Mexico], the [c]
- 29 [C]ounty [of Bernalillo], Albuquerque Public Schools, [the University of New
- 30 Mexico, Central New Mexico Community College] Albuquerque Metropolitan
- 31 Arroyo Flood Control Authority [,the Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District, ]
- 32 and [the] Mid [dle Rio Grande-] [Region] Council of Governments;

- 1 (B) Attend such meetings of other governmental entities as may be 2 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article; 3 (C) Prepare [a] [and adopt, prior to October 31st of each calendar year, a 4 state] legislative [program] [priorities resolution for adoption by the Council] 5 for submission [prior to October 1 of each calendar year] [to the state 6 legislature, the governor of New Mexico and as needed to state agencies.] [to 7 the Mayor and Council for their approval and draft appropriate legislation on 8 behalf of the city prior to each session of the legislature of the state] [Additions 9 and amendment to the State Legislative Priorities Resolution shall be by either 10 a resolution adopted by the Council or a letter that is jointly signed by the 11 Mayor and the President of the City Council with copies distributed to the City 12 Council, the Intergovernmental Relations Committee and to those parties to 13 whom the State Legislative Priorities Resolution was distributed.] 14 (D) Represent the city and coordinate its legislative efforts at any general or 15 special session of the legislature of the state; 16 (E) Prepare a [Federal Priorities resolution for adoption by the City Council] 17 [legislative program] for submission prior to December 30 of each calendar 18 year [to the members of the New Mexico Congressional Delegation and 19 agencies of the Federal Government, as needed.] [to the Mayor and Council for 20 their approval and draft appropriate legislation on behalf of the city prior to 21 each session of the United States Congress; [Additions and amendment to the 22 Federal Priorities Resolution shall be by either a resolution adopted by the 23 Council or a letter that is jointly signed by the Mayor and the President of the 24 City Council with copies distributed to the City Council and the 25 Intergovernmental Relations Committee and to those parties to whom the 26 federal priorities resolution was distributed;] **27** (F) Adopt and promulgate rules, regulations and orders necessary to 28
  - implement any authority delegated to the committee by this article;
  - (G) Represent the city and coordinate its federal [and state] legislative program[s] in Washington, D.C. [with the New Mexico Congressional
- 31 Delegation, Congressional Committees and Federal Executive Agencies] and
- 32 [at the State Capital and with state agencies];

1	(H) Work with the New Mexico Municipal League to coordinate the activities		
2	of the city with the programs and activities of other municipalities throughout		
3	the state; and		
4	(I) Engage and manage the services of representatives at the state and		
5	federal level to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities		
6	provided in this article [including reviewing and submitting for approval to the		
7	City Council by Resolution proposed contracts and legal obligations between		
8	the City of Albuquerque and such representatives.]"		
9	SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,		
10	clause, word or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or		
11	unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not		
12	affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Council		
13	hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section,		
14	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any		
15	provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.		
16	SECTION 4. COMPILATION. SECTION 1 and SECTION 2 of this Ordinance		
17	shall amend, be incorporated in, and made part of the Revised Ordinances of		
18	Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.		
19	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect five days		
20	after publication by title and general summary.
