The Albuquerque Police Department in conjunction with the Department of Finance, Purchasing Division, issued the RFP for CODIS STR DNA Testing and Analysis Services.

The RFP was posted on the Purchasing E-Procurement, Bonfire website on January 31, 2022 and advertised in the Albuquerque Journal on February 6, 2022 and February 13, 2022.

The City received two (2) responses to this solicitation. The ad hoc evaluation committee evaluated and scored the responsive proposals received in accordance with the evaluation criteria published in the RFP. After thoroughly reviewing and scoring the proposal, Bode Cellmark Forensics, Inc., earned the highest score of 961.67 points. The ad hoc committee found Bode Cellmark Forensics, Inc., to be both responsive and qualified and recommends an award to Bode Cellmark Forensics, Inc., Inc.,

I concur with this recommendation.

The Albuquerque Police Department will manage this contract.

Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

The New Mexico DNA Identification System (NMDIS) is a unit of the Albuquerque Police Department's Scientific Evidence Division (APD-SED). The NMDIS wishes to contract with a vendor laboratory for the purchase of genetic testing and analysis of swabs collected from felony arrestees and felony convicted offenders in the State of New Mexico. The contracted vendor will provide profile data generated from offender swabs to the NMDIS.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This legislation will allow the NMDIS to continue to enter DNA profiles from offenders into the national Combined DNA Indexing System (CODIS) maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

3. Why is this project needed?

When the FBI established CODIS, each state in the United States established a state database laboratory to act as gatekeeper for all DNA data entered and for entering all offender DNA profiles into CODIS. In 1997, the APD-SED established the NMDIS laboratory to function as the State of New Mexico's database laboratory. The NMDIS has a limited DNA testing capacity and relies on outsourcing vendors for DNA testing and analysis of all offender DNA profiles.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

Annual testing costs are approximately \$150,000.00-\$165,000.00 depending on the number of offender samples collected throughout the state during the year. Funding for the NMDIS program is derived from non-City of Albuquerque funds. The NMDIS testing budget is derived from federal funding (annual recurring formula program grants covering ~80-90% of the annual testing costs) and State of New Mexico funds (fees assessed against felony convicted offenders and state legislative funds ~10-20% of the annual testing costs). Both federal and state funds are earmarked specifically for the NMDIS program.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this Plan? If so, what level of income is projected?

There are no direct revenues associated with the testing associated with this RFP.
