10	regarding behavioral and physical health, economic opportunity, and

12	Mitigates the impact of climate change,			
13	Supports local governments in building capacity to produce affordable

15	 To partner with the City to fund City Council District projects that 			
16	benefit neighborhoods, and

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City of Albuquerque Legislative and Program Requests From the 56^{th} Legislature of the State of New Mexico

METRO CRIME INITIATIVE (MCI)

Amendment to Body Camera Law

Amend the body camera law to allow bomb squad law enforcement officers to turn off electronics, including body cameras, when responding to a possible bomb situation and allow Narcotics undercover agents to not have to wear a body camera during an undercover operation.

Firearms - Drug Cases

Adopt legislation that requires firearm cases that involve a drug distribution crime to be charged separate from the seized drug and that also changes the random discharge of a firearm in a populated area to a fourth-degree felony from a misdemeanor.

Increased Funding for Narcotics Education and Criminal Investigations (Fentanyl)

Fixing the state's asset forfeiture law so that confiscated funds can be used locally for public education on narcotics and for other approved uses such as bolstering effective digital investigative technology.

Judiciary Appropriations

Support additional funding for District Attorneys and courts.

Law Enforcement Training

Adopt legislation that has the State pay for health insurance after law enforcement officers complete 25 years of service and that makes officers who have served in other states for at least five years eligible to buy five years of experience from PERA in New Mexico.

$Law\ Enforcement\ Recruitment/Retention$

Provide more support and incentives for recruiting and retaining law enforcement officers.

CRIME LEGISLATION

Cloud Based Criminal Justice Consolidation Engine

Develop a cloud based dashboard and internet engine to track cases from point of inception to disposition.

Custody Standards

Create standards for determining if the person who is arrested for a crime should or should not be kept in custody that provides for the public safety and respects individual rights. This involves reviewing the "Arnold Tool" (also known as the Public Safety Assessment) and its efficacy.

Public Safety Equipment Protection

Enact legislation that establishes penalties for vandalizing or stealing public safety equipment in addition to the penalties for vandalizing or stealing public safety equipment.

Public Vehicle Operators Protection

Enact legislation that establishes penalties for assaulting or battery on an operator of public equipment for both public safety and non-public safety vehicles, including motor coach and paratransit vehicle operators.

Remove Marijuana Public Safety Employment Exclusion

Remove State statutory exclusions prohibiting applicants for public safety positions who acknowledge using marijuana and have prior misdemeanor marijuana-related convictions, guilty pleas, or nolo contendre pleas; or have prior misdemeanor marijuana-related arrests from applying for public safety positions.

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT LEGISLATION

Comprehensive Climate Legislation

Adopt legislation to mitigate the impacts of climate change to protect and provide for the sustainability of the people, the environment, the wildlife and the culture of New Mexico.

Housing Income Discrimination

Adopt legislation prohibiting housing discrimination on the basis of source of lawful income including State and Federal Housing Vouchers, Disability Assistance, and other types of government assistance.

Internet and Marijuana Tax Collection Management and Data Provisions

Develop systems that collect, accurately record, track, and manage records for Gross Receipts Tax Revenues generated through internet sales and develop confidential reporting for agencies to access macro demographics pertaining to internet sales within their jurisdictions.

Low Income Utility Rates Legislation

Adopt Legislation to create low-income rates for PNM and NMGC customers to reduce the energy burden of frontline and low-income residents.

Mental Health Services

Funding to continue and improve the delivery of mental health services.

MRA Reform

Amend the State MRA law to make it more flexible to address the specific constraints and potentials of individual MRA projects and include the financial powers such as Tax Increment Financing to enable projects to yield more revenue.

Strengthen New Mexico's Regional Housing Authority Laws

Pursue legislation to strengthen the capabilities of local governments to provide housing services, including strengthening

Substance Abuse and Behavioral Health Services

Provide additional resources for substance abuse, mental health, and other behavioral health services critical to deterring and preventing crime across the State.

500 Housing Units to Address Housing Supply Crisis

Plan, design, and construct housing throughout the city including the purchase of motels, commercial space, and Desert Hills Complex to convert to housing.

APD Academy Expansion

Plan, design and construct a police academy expansion.

Coronado Park Recovery

Develop a public service reuse plan for Coronado Park.

Gateway

Medical Respite, Sobering Center Phase II, and first responder drop off at the Gateway Center.

North Domingo Baca Pool (Final Phase)

Construct and equip an aquatics facility at North Domingo Baca Park.

Rail Trail

Plan design and construct a localized and multi-modal connection loop across Downtown, Barelas Rail Yards, Old Town and Sawmill.

Real Time Crime Center and APD Technology Improvements

Expand RTCC infrastructure and investigative technology including additional cameras and Cell Site Simulator.

Westside and Eastside Animal Shelters

Plan, design, construct, improve, and expansion and renovation of the city of Albuquerque's West Side animal shelter, including but not limited to new kennels, associates support facilities, officers, public areas, and a veterinary clinic. Fund improvements to both Eastside and Westside Animal Shelters.

Route 66 Centennial Celebration

Plan, design, construct and install improvements to route 66, including roadwork, signage, historic preservation and education projects in preparation for the national route 66 centennial celebration in Albuquerque, NM.

Southwest Public Safety Center

Plan and design a public safety facility to be used by AFR and APD.

Youth Shelter

Purchase land, design, and construct a Youth Shelter for young adults.

Indoor Sports Complex

Acquire land, plan, design, construct, equip, and otherwise improve an Indoor Recreation Complex.

Plan, design, and construct street, median, and sidewalk improvements along New Mexico 45. Coors Boulevard.

City Council District 2-Isaac Benton

12th Street and Sawmill Safety Improvements

Design and Construct pedestrian safety, traffic management, and traffic calming measures on 12th Street between Sawmill Road and Interstate 40.

Girard Streetscaping

Design and Construct a streetscape on Girard Street Between Indian School Road and Haines Avenue.

Broadway Boulevard Streetscaping

Design and Construct a streetscape and crossing on Broadway Boulevard between Lomas Boulevard and Martin Luther King Boulevard.

Wells Park Expansion

Design and Construct an expansion of Wells Park in the Wells Park Neighborhood.

City Council District 3 - Klarissa Peña

Route 66 Visitor Center Improvements

Plan, design, construct, expand, purchase, install signage, educational projects, historical preservation, walking pedestrian overlook bridge and equip a Visitor Center on-site and off-site improvements and multi-use trail along West Central Avenue.

Southwest Public Safety Center

Plan design, purchase, construct, furnish and equip a southwest public safety center.

Westgate Community Center Construction

Plan, design, construct, furnish and equip, including purchasing technology, for phase Three of the Westgate community center.

City Council District 4 - Brook Bassan

Alameda Little League

Study, map, plan, design, develop, construct, renovate, expand, furnish, equip, enhance and otherwise improve Alameda Little League.

Alameda Barstow

Plan design and construct the Alameda Barstow Strom-water Project

North Domingo Baca Pool (Final Phase)

Construct and equip an aquatics facility at North Domingo Baca Park.

Palomas and Wyoming Streetscaping

Plan, design and construct Safety Improvements on Palomas Avenue between Louisiana Boulevard and San Pedro Road.

San Pedro Road Improvements.

Plan, Design and Construct Improvements to San Pedro Road between Paseo Del Norte and Alameda Boulevard.

Vista Del Norte Park Bicycle Pathway

To plan, design, construct, install, equip, and otherwise improve the bicycle pathway at Vista del Norte Park.

City Council District 5 - Dan Lewis

Cibola Loop Multi-Generational Center (Phases I and II)

To plan, design, construct, acquire right of way, furnish, equip, and install a new multigenerational facility in the Cibola Loop Complex.

Cibola Loop Library

To plan, design, construct, acquire right of way, furnish, equip, and install a new green library facility in the Cibola Loop Community Complex.

Paseo del Norte / Unser Expansion (Phase II)

Acquire land, right-of-way, demolish, construct, and otherwise expand and improve Paseo Del Norte to include four lanes and a multi-use trail from Calle Nortena to Rainbow Boulevard.

City Council District 6 - Pat Davis

Affordable Housing Projects

Plan, acquire land, design, construct and otherwise improve affordable housing in Albuquerque.

Bobby Foster Interchange

To plan, design, develop, construct, landscape, and equip an interchange to connect Mesa Del Sol Parkway to the planned community atop the Mesa Del Sol.

East Central Lighting

To plan, design, and construct sidewalks, install street lighting, and other pedestrian and safety improvements on East Central Avenue between Louisiana Boulevard and Eubank Boulevard.

Lead / Coal Safety Measures

To improve road function and safety on Lead Ave SE and Coal Ave SE.

Rey and Elsa Garduño Community Garden

To plan, design, construct, furnish, and equip the Rey and Elsa Garduño Community Garden.

City Council District 7 - Tammy Fiebelkorn

Assistance League of Albuquerque Facility Remodel

Design and construct for the purposes of renovating, updating and expanding the Assistance League of Albuquerque Center.

Boys Club Facility Improvements

Design, and construct improvements and renovations to the Boys Club of Albuquerque Facility for the purpose of providing fitness, skills, and team building and character-building opportunities and training to the youth of Albuquerque.

Median Landscaping.

Design, construct, and renovate median landscaping.

Cutler Park Renovation and Update

Renovate and update irrigation, turf, tree cover, plants, playgrounds, and Americans with Disabilities Acts Standards at Cutler Park.

Los Altos Park Phase 2

Implement Los Altos Park Phase 2, including but not limited to, construction of a BMX track, dog park, outdoor wading pool, pollinator gardens, splash pads, parking, and landscaping.

Pueblo Alto/Mile Hi Storm Drainage

Design, acquire right of way, and construct a best practices Green Infrastructure Storm Water System in the Pueblo Alto and Mile High Neighborhoods to remove flooding of residential properties.

Neighborhood Roadways Repaving

Repave Roadways and Improve Sidewalks to American with Disabilities Acts Standards.

City Council District 9 - Renee Grout

East Gateway Public Art Project

Plan, design, acquire land, construct, improve, and equip a public art piece for the East Gateway.

Manzano Mesa Pickleball Complex Improvements and Expansion

Plan, design, construct, to expand and improve Manzano Mesa Pickleball courts including but not limited to adding 12 courts, restroom, and a support building. (Please note that if the State Recreation grant comes through, we will drop this project and sub in a playground for Singing Arrow Park)

Singing Arrow Playground

Plan, design, construct, and equip a playground project in the Singing Arrow Neighborhood Park (note that this project will rise to the Top 5 if the state grant comes through for the Manzano Mesa Pickleball complex)

Tijeras Arroyo Open Space Biological Zone

Purchase land, plan, design, construct, and equip a visitor center and make conservation improvements on open space lands in the Tijeras Biological Zone and Cultural Corridor.

Tramway Landscaping

Replace and refurbish the landscaping on Tramway Road from Interstate 40 to Manitoba Avenue.
