 and senior care services.
 - Provides funding for community policing services that develop a
 working relationship between the citizens who serve as police officers and the
 citizens they serve, so as to provide public safety through equity, justice, trust
 and understanding and to support the shared missions between police
 services and mental health and social service agencies.
 - Creates a sustainable economy that generates opportunities for entrepreneurs and existing businesses while providing living wages, a safe work environment, health insurance, sick leave, and retirement benefits for employees.

Behavioral Health

Data Sharing: Adopt legislation supporting the sharing of federal data with state and local agencies as well as organizations working to end homelessness, reintegrating previously incarcerated citizens back into the community, and ending the cycle of hospitalizations.

Consent Decree Assistance

Grant Programs: Create grant programs to assist police agencies under a Federal Consent Decree to implement the recommendations and required improvements issued through the Consent Decree.

Economic Development

- Local Tourism Grants: Create grant programs for communities to develop local tourism, including facility development and entrepreneur and workforce training.
- Small Business Technical Assistance: Adopt legislation creating programs to fund technical
 assistance programs that aid small businesses to establish capacity building, including
 information technology systems, data management utility burden management and other
 systems necessary for operating a business in the 21st Century.
 - Space Technology Hub: Continue support of federal programs that further space technology development, the transfer of military technology to civilian use, and assisting metropolitan areas in developing the infrastructure to support space technology development.

Education

- Unhoused Children Education: Adopt legislation creating a program to provide communities with resources to offer quality education services to unhoused children, including both on-site and remote-learning opportunities.
- Learning Technologies Low Income Students: Adopt legislation creating a grant program to provide remote learning technologies to children who reside in families with low- and moderate-income.

Equitable Access to Transportation and Infrastructure

- Affordable 5G: Create a grant program to ensure that Internet infrastructure, including
 Wi-Fi and 5G technology, are affordable and available to all members of society,
 especially those least able to access services, including the homeless and the indigent.
 - Low Income Neighborhoods Basic Infrastructure: Create grant programs to provide roads, transit and utilities to underserved low-income communities.
- Non-Fuel Revenue Transportation Funding: Diversify the funding stream for the Federal Highway and Transit Programs to adjust to revenue losses due to declining federal gas tax revenues.
 - Security Practices: Create a program to fund research and development into Security Practices for Transit Systems and to create Grant Program to provide Operating funds for Security Operations at Transit Agencies.
- Transit Fares: Create programs to assist with the implementation and maintenance of policies that reduce or eliminate transit fares.

Environmental Protection

- Carbon Emission Reduction: Create programs for local and state government agencies to reduce carbon emission from their facilities and fleets to help reduce carbon emissions by 2050 to levels that stave off the worst of climate change.
- National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Compliance: Create grant
 programs to assist local agencies in implementing best practices and infrastructure
 projects to comply with the requirements established in the "Regional Storm Water
 Discharge Permit" issued under the NPDES.

Immigration Reform

Humane Immigration Reforms: Enact immigration reforms that provide immigrants with rights that respect their human dignity and status as taxpayers and contributing members of the community.

Housing Land Banks

Land Banks: Create a grant program to establish land banks for acquiring blighted or underutilized land in at-risk neighborhoods and productively developing the properties by establishing standards for construction, underwriting loans, loan insurance, and expanding the inventory of American with Disabilities Act Compliant homes.

Paid Sick Leave

Paid Sick Leave: Adopt legislation guaranteeing paid sick leave for employees and instituting tax policies to alleviate the expense incurred by small employers for providing sick leave.

Public Health

- Post Pandemic Impacts: Adopt legislation creating programs to assist communities
 in mitigating post pandemic impacts.

Route 66 National Historic Trail

National Historic Trail Designation: Adopt legislation creating a Route 66 National Historic Trail and establish grant programs for the Conservation and Rehabilitation of Culturally and Historically Significant Structures located on Route 66.

Stand Alone Energy Systems Tax Credit

Stand Alone Energy Systems Tax Credit: Adopt the proposed Investment Tax Credit (ITC) for Stand Alone Energy Storage Systems to significantly increase national energy storage capacity by twenty percent.

Student Loan Debt Relief

Student Load Debt Relief: Adopt legislation eliminating and or reducing student loan debts.

Workforce Training

Adopt legislation creating programs to fund the development of workforce training programs for low-income and indigent persons to acquire employment skills that help them participate in emerging and high-tech industries.

2023 Potential Project Grant Applications for All Federal Competitive Earmark and Formula Grant Programs

Alameda Little League Complex

Design, construct, renovate, expand, furnish, equip, enhance and otherwise improve Alameda Little League.

Animal Welfare Shelter Improvements and New Clinic

Design, construct, improve, and expansion and renovation of the city of Albuquerque's East and West Side animal shelters, including but not limited to new kennels, associates support facilities, officers, public areas, and a veterinary clinic.

Cibola Loop Multi-Generational Center

Funding to plan, design, construct, acquire right of way, furnish, equip, and install a new multigenerational facility at Cibola Loop.

<u>North Domingo Baca Park – City Council District 4</u>

Funding to construct a regional natatorium and Therapy Pool to provide a facility for recreation, exercise, therapy and regional competition for Central and North Central New Mexico.

Pueblo Alto Storm Management System

Design and construct a Best Practice Low Impact Development Storm Water Management system in the Pueblo Alto and Mile High Neighborhood.

Rio Grande Levee (Oxbow Heading North)

Funding for Levee Construction West Bank of the Rio Grande from the outfall of the Corrales Main Canal to the Outfall of the San Antonio Arroyo.

Route 66 Revitalization

Funding to plan, design, construct and install improvements to route 66, including roadwork, signage, historic preservation and education projects in preparation for the national route 66 centennial celebration.
