such as social distancing, wearing masks in public, and staying home help
mitigate the spread of COVID-19, prevent illness, and lessen the burden on

reducing access to care and health services, disrupting schooling,
undermining their sense of safety and security, increasing stress on
caregivers, and tragically robbing 250,000 children of a parent or caregiver;
and
WHEREAS, The symptoms and severity of COVID-19 can vary dramatically
by individual and the long-term health implications for survivors are largely
unknown, as many survivors suffer with lingering side-effects of the disease
long after they no longer test positive; and
WHEREAS, More than 6.5 million people worldwide and over 1,065,152
people in the United States have lost their lives due to COVID-19, and in New
Mexico alone, more than 8,607 lives have been lost to this deadly virus; and,
WHEREAS, Each life lost to COVID-19 mattered and leaves a hole in the
hearts of loved ones, family members, and the surrounding community.
BE IT MEMORIALIZED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:
Section 1. The City of Albuquerque supports the designation of a
permanent COVID-19 Memorial to be located in Bernalillo County on State
trust land, for those who lost their lives and in honor of those who are forever
marked by COVID-19 and continue to suffer from the impact of the pandemic.
