5	WHEREAS, COVID-19 has harmed the health and well-being of children by
6	reducing access to care and health services, disrupting schooling,
7	undermining their sense of safety and security, increasing stress on
8	caregivers, and tragically robbing 250,000 children of a parent or caregiver;

10	WHEREAS, The symptoms and severity of COVID-19 can vary dramatically
11	by individual and the long-term health implications for survivors are largely
12	unknown, as many survivors suffer with lingering side-effects of the disease
13	long after they no longer test positive; and
14	WHEREAS, More than 6.5 million people worldwide and over 1,065,152
15	people in the United States have lost their lives due to COVID-19, and in New
16	Mexico alone, more than 8,607 lives have been lost to this deadly virus; and
17	WHEREAS, Each life lost to COVID-19 mattered and leaves a hole in the
18	hearts of loved ones, family members, and the surrounding community.
