COUNCIL BILL NO. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ R-23-146 \_\_\_\_\_ ENACTMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ - 2023 - 0102 SPONSORED BY: Brook Bassan by request 1 RESOLUTION 2 CONCERNING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE AT THE NEXT REGULAR LOCAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 3 7, 2023; SUBMITTING TO A VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS AT SUCH 4 REGULAR LOCAL ELECTION CERTAIN QUESTIONS FOR AUTHORIZING THE 5 ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN VARYING PRINCIPAL 6 AMOUNTS AND FOR SPECIFIED PUBLIC PURPOSES AND, PROVIDING THE 7 FORM OF THE BOND QUESTIONS AND THE DESIGNATION CLAUSE FOR 8 SUCH QUESTIONS ON THE BALLOT; PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS IN 9 CONNECTION WITH SUCH BOND ELECTION AND BONDS; AND RATIFYING 10 Bracketed/Strikethrough Material - Deletion **ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.** 11 Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Albuquerque (the 12 "City") in the County of Bernalillo and State of New Mexico, hereby determines that it 13 is necessary and in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants to issue general 14 obligation bonds in the principal amounts and for the purposes provided herein; and 15 WHEREAS, the Council has the power to submit questions of issuing general 16 obligation bonds to the qualified electorate of the City pursuant to applicable laws of 17 the State of New Mexico, the City Charter and the City's home rule power pursuant 18 to Article X, Section 6 of the New Mexico Constitution; and 19 WHEREAS, certain of the projects approved by the Council in the 2023 Capital 20 21 Improvements Program to be funded by the proceeds of general obligation bonds 22 have been re-grouped for the purposes of the ballot faces; and WHEREAS, the Council hereby determines and declares that all of the projects 23 (the "Projects") for which the questions of issuing the City's general obligation bonds 24 (the "Bond Election Questions") are set forth herein are or will be for public 25 26 purposes; and

- 1 WHEREAS, a regular local election is scheduled to be held in the City of Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 7th day of November, 2023, and shall include the Bond 2 3 Election Questions. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 4 5 ALBUQUERQUE: 6 All action, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution, Section 1: heretofore taken by the Council and the officers of the City, directed toward the Bond 7 Election Questions and the Projects described or referred to in the Bond Election 8 Questions, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the calling and 9 holding of an election to authorize the issuance of the general obligation bonds (the 10 "Bonds") to finance the Projects, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and 11 confirmed. Funding for projects identified within one GO Bond purpose may be 12 reallocated to another project within the same purpose, provided that any such 13 14 reallocation is approved by appropriate legislation. Section 2: At the next regular local election to be held in the City on November 15 7, 2023 (such regular local election being sometimes referred to herein as the 16 "Election"), there shall be submitted to the City's qualified electors the Bond Election 17 18 Questions set forth in Section 5 hereof. 19 Section 3: The City's qualified electors are eligible to vote on candidates, questions and Bond Election Questions being submitted at the Election. 20 21 All persons desiring to vote for any candidate or on any questions Section 4: 22 being submitted at the Election must be registered to vote. Any person who is 23 otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered to vote may register at the office of the Bernalillo County Clerk, 415 Silver Avenue SW, Albuquerque, New 24 Mexico, or at the office of any duly appointed deputy registration officer, as 25 26 authorized by law. 27 This Resolution and the Bond Election Questions shall be Section 5: submitted to the Bernalillo County Clerk to conduct the Election in accordance with 28 the Local Election Act, Section 1-22-1 through -20, NMSA 1978, as amended. 13	Section 6: The election on the Bond Election Questions shall be held and
14	conducted in accordance with the Election Code and the Bond Election Act.
15	Section 7: The Bond Election Resolution shall be published in the English and
16	Spanish languages at least once a week for four consecutive weeks by four
17	insertions, the first insertion being published between fifty (50) and sixty (60) days
18	before the day of the Election in a newspaper or newspapers which are of general
19	circulation in the City and which otherwise qualify as legal newspapers in the City.
20	Section 8: For further information concerning this election, consult the Office
21	of the Bernalillo County Clerk, 415 Silver Avenue SW, Albuquerque, New Mexico.
22	Section 9: The officers of the City be and they hereby are authorized and
23	directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of
24	this Resolution.
25	Section 10: If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution
6	shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or
<b>.7</b>	unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provisions shall not affect any
8	of the remaining provisions of this Resolution. The Council hereby declares that it
9	would have passed this resolution and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause,
0	word, or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional
1	or otherwise invalid.

Section 11: All resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer
