COUNCIL BILL NO. <u>R-23-121</u> ENACTMENT NO. <u>R-2023 - 088</u> SPONSORED BY: Klarissa Peña 1 RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICES 2 TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH BERNALILLO 3 COUNTY TO ALLOCATE FUNDS TO THE METROPOLITAN DETENTION 4 CENTER FOR OPIOID TREATMENT AND RECOVERY. 5 6 WHEREAS, on February 24, 2022, the National Prescription Opiate Litigation Plaintiffs' Executive Committee confirmed participation of over 90% 7 of litigating local governments nationwide in the \$26 billion global opioid 8 settlements finalized with three drug distributors, AmerisourceBergen, 9 Cardinal Health and McKesson, and opioid manufacturer Johnson & Johnson; 10 11 and WHEREAS, the settlements require that 85% of funds be allocated to 12 programs that will help address the ongoing opioid crisis through treatment, 13 14 education, and prevention efforts; and WHEREAS, in total, the settling distributors will make 18 annual payments 15 16 to settling states and entities; and WHEREAS, the passage of R-22-32 created the LG Abatement Fund for 17 timely receipt, appropriation, and expenditure of the opioid settlement 18 19 proceeds; and WHEREAS, the Distributor Master Settlement Agreement and the J&J 20 Master Settlement Agreement outline Core Strategies, Approved Uses, and 21 Other Strategies for the LG Abatement Fund; and 22 WHEREAS, treatment for incarcerated persons is listed as a Core Strategy; 23 24 and

	writeREAS, many incarcerated individuals have overlapping distinctions
2	which are addressed by the Core Strategies, Approved Uses, and Other
3	Strategies; and
4	WHEREAS, the American Psychological Association supports research
5	showing treating prisoners' addiction issues during incarceration and after
6	release helps keep them off of drugs, out of prison, and employed; and
7	WHEREAS, the Federal Bureau of Prisons note studies show when in-
8	prison programs are well-designed, carefully implemented, and utilize
9	effective practices, they reduce relapse, criminality, recidivism, increase the
10	level of the offender's stake in societal norms, increase levels of education
11	and employment upon return to the community, improve health and mental
12	health symptoms and conditions, and improve relationships; and
13	WHEREAS, Bernalillo County partners with Recovery Services of New
14	Mexico to administer Medically Assisted Treatment (MAT) to prisoners at the
15	Metropolitan Detention Center (MDC); and
16	WHEREAS, the New Mexico three-year recidivism rate was 54% in FY19 and
17	FY20, with substance use as one of the main drivers for return to prison after
18	release; and
19	WHEREAS, treating opioid addicted inmates helps the individual start on
20	the road to recovery, helps the families of the individuals, our overburdened
21	prison system, and society as a whole.
22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
23	ALBUQUERQUE:
24	SECTION 1. The Department of Family and Community Services (FCS) shall
25	enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Bernalillo County to
26	provide \$1.5 million dollars from the LG Abatement Fund 201 to provide opioid
27	treatment and recovery services at MDC.
28	SECTION 2. After one year, the Department of Family and Community
29	Services shall produce a report to City Council detailing the effectiveness and
30	outcomes of the treatment and recovery program. Future allocations to
31	Bernalillo County to provide opioid treatment and recovery services at MDC
32	from Fund 201 will be determined based on the outcomes in the report.
