1           **LEGISLATIVE AND PROGRAM AGENDA:** The list of federal or state  
2 requests for laws, policies, programs, and projects included in the annual  
3 Federal Program Resolution and State Program Resolution for the City of  
4 Albuquerque’s federal and state legislative and program agendas as adopted  
5 through the provisions in Section 2-2-3. ROA 1994. All requests in the annual  
6 Federal and State Resolutions can represent either the City Council and Mayor  
7 as a whole or may only represent the individual goals and initiatives of the  
8 Mayor and or individual City Councilors.”

9           Section 2. Delete section “§ 2-2-3 **AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES OF THE**  
10 **COMMITTEE.**” and insert a new Section as follows:

11 “§ 2-2-3 **AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.**

12           The Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and Legislative Relations shall  
13 have the express authority to do the following:

14           (A) Promote cooperation and encourage coordination between the city,  
15 the federal, and state and local governments;

16           (B) Attend such meetings of other governmental entities as may be  
17 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article;

18           (C) Prepare by September 1st of each calendar year, for approval by the  
19 Joint Intergovernmental Relations Committee, and adoption at the Council  
20 meeting following the Committee approval, a state legislative program  
21 resolution that includes the Mayor's, the City Council's and City Councilors’  
22 legislative and program agendas. The Mayor’s and City Council’s legislative  
23 and program agendas shall be included as separate attachments to the state  
24 program resolution;

25           (D) The state program resolution adopted pursuant to paragraph C of this  
26 section and additional requests shall be submitted to the Governor’s Office  
27 and members of the Legislature whose districts include the City of  
28 Albuquerque;

29           (E) From the state program resolution, each Councilor may determine and  
30 submit to the Director of Council Services three state capital requests and  
31 three state legislative requests that are to be placed in a memorandum from  
32 the Director of City Council Services and distributed to City staff and the  
33 lobbyists for the City, that are assigned to advocate for the City of

1 Albuquerque to the State Legislature. The memorandum shall direct the  
2 lobbyists and City Staff to place additional focus and effort on advocating for  
3 the requests listed in the memorandum;

4 (F) The Mayor, Council, and individual Councilors may submit to the  
5 Legislature and State Government policy, program, project, and capital outlay  
6 project requests independent of the annual state legislative and program  
7 agenda resolution;

8 (G) Represent the city and coordinate its legislative efforts at any general  
9 or special session of the Legislature of the state;

10 (H) Prepare by November 1st of each calendar year for approval by the  
11 Joint Intergovernmental and Legislative Relations Committee, and adoption by  
12 the Council at the Council meeting following the committee's approval, a  
13 federal program resolution for the City of Albuquerque's legislative and  
14 program agenda for laws, policy, program, grant, and congressional  
15 appropriation requests to the federal government. The legislative and program  
16 agendas for the Mayor and the City Council shall be included as separate  
17 attachments to the federal program resolution;

18 (I) From the federal program resolution, each Councilor may determine  
19 and submit to the Director of Council Services three federal capital requests  
20 and three federal legislative requests that are to be placed in a memorandum  
21 from the Director of City Council Services and distributed to City staff and the  
22 lobbyists for the City, that are assigned to advocate for the City of  
23 Albuquerque to the Federal Government. The memorandum shall direct the  
24 lobbyists and City Staff to place additional focus and effort on advocating for  
25 the requests listed in the memorandum;

26 (J) The federal program resolution adopted pursuant to paragraph (H)  
27 of this section and additional requests shall be submitted to the members of  
28 the New Mexico Congressional Delegation and agencies of the federal  
29 government, as needed;

30 (K) Congressional appropriation requests filed after the adoption of  
31 the federal legislative and program agenda resolution shall be submitted  
32 through resolution by the Joint Intergovernmental and Legislative

1 Relations Committee to the City Council for inclusion in the most current  
2 federal program resolution;

3 (L) The Mayor, the Council and/or individual Councilors may submit to the  
4 Congressional Delegation and the federal government policy, program, grant  
5 and congressional appropriations requests independent of the annual federal  
6 program resolution for the City of Albuquerque’s legislative and program  
7 agenda;

8 (M) Adopt and promulgate rules, regulations and orders necessary to  
9 implement any authority delegated to the committee by this article;

10 (N) Represent the city and coordinate its federal and state legislative  
11 programs in Washington, D.C. and at the State Capitol and with state  
12 agencies;

13 (O) Work with the New Mexico Municipal League to coordinate the  
14 activities of the city with the programs and activities of other municipalities  
15 throughout the state including reviewing and approving the City of  
16 Albuquerque's annual membership to the league and any initiatives proposed  
17 between the City of Albuquerque and the Municipal League; and

18 (P) Engage and manage the services of representatives at the state and  
19 federal level to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities  
20 provided in this article including reviewing and submitting for approval to the  
21 City Council proposed contracts and legal obligations between the City of  
22 Albuquerque and such representatives.”

23 Section 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,  
24 clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be  
25 invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such a  
26 decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this  
27 ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this  
28 ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase  
29 thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or  
30 otherwise invalid.

31 Section 4. COMPILATION. Sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance shall be  
32 incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque,  
33 New Mexico, 1994.

1           Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect five days  
2 after publication by title and general summary.
