3	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF					
4	ALBUQUERQUE:					
5	Section	Section 1. Intent				
6	6 (A) El Vado Motel located at 2500 Central Avenue SW, Lots 24-39, Bloc					
7		Westpark Addition to the City of Albuquerque, has been recommended				
8	as a City Landmark by the Landmarks and Urban Conservation					
9		Commission; and				
10	(B)	El Vado Motel meets criteria for City Landmark designation, as specified				
11		in Section 14-12-7(A) of the Ordinance establishing the Landmarks and				
12		Urban Conservation Commission and providing for designation of City				
13		Landmarks (R.O.A. 1994) as follows:				
14		(1) Has historic significance rooted in its architecture and associations				
15	with automobile tourism on U.S. Highway 66;					
16	6 (2) Portrays the environment of a group of people (lodging operators					
17	7 and automobile tourists) in an era of history (Late Depression/World					
18		War II/Post-War Period) characterized by a distinctive architectural				
19		style (Spanish-Pueblo Revival);				
20		(3) Embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type and method of				
21		construction; that being an automobile tourist court consisting of				
22		stuccoed adobe bearing walls with timber roof beams and wood				
23		decking/ceiling and including a multicolor, luminous tube (neon)				
24		image on a painted metal sign.				
25		(4) Was listed in the State Register of Cultural Properties and National				
26		Register of Historic Places in 1993; and				

1		(5) Its preservation is critical because of its relationship to already	
2		designated landmarks.	
3	(C)	Significant features of El Vado Motel identified by the Landmarks and	
4		Urban Conservation Commission as being worthy of preservation:	
5		(1) All three buildings in the complex;	
6		(2) Spanish-Pueblo Revival styling in the form of buttressed walls with	
7		curvilinear parapets, projecting vigas, wood posts and beams, and	
8		doors and windows recessed in the adobe bearing walls;	
9		(3) The court space between the buildings and its openness to Central	
10		Avenue; and	
11		(4) The El Vado Motel pole sign at the Central Avenue frontage,	
12		(5) The pattern and proportion of (window and door) openings in	
13		exterior walls;	
14		(6) Wood windows and doors that remain or whose design is	
15		documented in photographs or drawings of the building;	
16		(7) Characteristic interior features and finished such as exposed vigas	
17		(roof beams) and plaster walls; and	
18		(8) Open carports between room units.	
19	(D)	In addition to the preservation of distinctive features set forth in	
20		subsection (C), the following guidelines should be adopted:	
21		(1) New construction may be approved on the premises if it is	
22		compatible in scale, style, and material with the historic buildings.	
23		Carports may be enclosed to increase heated space, provided that	
24		their original openings remain evident and at least one carport	
25		remains open for historic interpretation purposes.	
26	(2) The federal Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation		
27		shall be incorporated into the specific development guidelines for E	
28		Vado Motel by reference.	
29	Section	2. That El Vado Motel be designated a City Landmark.	
30	Section	${\bf 3. \ \ SEVERABILITY\ CLAUSE\ \ If\ any\ section,\ paragraph,\ sentence,\ clause,}$	
31	word or	phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or	
32	unenfor	ceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not	
33	affect th	ne validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council	

hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section,				
paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision				
being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.				
Section 4. This ordinance shall be effective five (5) days after publication in full.
