8		(2)	Milled wood doors, windows, and trim characteristic of	
9	early 20 th -century Albuquerque houses; and			
10		(3)	The open yards north and west of the house.	
11	(D)	In ad	dition to the preservation of distinctive features set forth	
12	in subsection (C), the following guidelines should be adopted:			
13		(1)	New construction may be approved on the premises if it	
14	is compatible in scale, style, and material with the historic building.			
15		(2)	The federal Secretary of the Interior's Standards for	
16	Rehabilitation shall be incorporated by reference into specific development			
17	guidelines to be adopted by the Landmarks and Urban Conservation			
18	Commission for the Werner-Gilchrist House.			
19	Section 2.	That th	ne Werner-Gilchrist House be designated a City Landmark.	
20	Section 3.	SEVER	RABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,	
21	clause, word	or phra	se of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or	
22	unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not			
23	affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council			
24	hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section,			
25	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any			
26	provisions being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.			
27	Section 4.	EFFE	CTIVE DATE AND PUBLICATION. This ordinance shall	
28	take effect five days after publication by title and general summary and when a			
29	plat of the terr	itory h	ereby annexed is filed in the office of the County Clerk.	
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
