	25	Section 1 That the City Council calls upon the Administration to:

 Reprioritize funding for storm drainage renovation and rehabilitation projects to place the highest priority on funding projects that improve the storm drainage systems in recently flooded neighborhoods;
 Work with the Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Water Utility
 Authority to put in place a system for routinely monitoring, inspecting and

testing pumps and related infrastructure on a regular basis; and

- 3. Work with the Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Water Utility
 Authority to clearly define the roles and responsibilities of the City and the
 Authority with regard to the testing, maintenance, upgrading and
 replacement of the storm drainage system; and
- 4. Report to the City Council on the progress towards Items 2 and 3 above within 45 days of the enactment of this resolution and at least quarterly thereafter.

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
