| 5  | WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque and the State of New Mexico currently             |
| 6  | have a number of projects underway in the vicinity of the intersection             |
| 7  | including:   |
| 8  | 1. The State of New Mexico in partnership with the City of                         |
| 9  | Albuquerque is currently expanding Unser Boulevard to its full planned cross-      |
| 10 | section from Central Avenue to Sage Road.  |
| 11 | 2. The City will soon construct an area identity monument to be                    |
| 12 | located at the intersection of Central and Unser,                                  |
| 13 | 3. The City is developing a West Mesa transit station at the northwest             |
| 14 | corner of the Central and Unser.   |
| 15 | 4. The State has designated funding for landscaping medians on                     |
| 16 | Central between Coors Boulevard and Unser Boulevard; and                           |
| 17 | WHEREAS, the construction of projects to correct road deficiencies is one          |
| 18 | of the purposes specifically stated in the Transportation Infrastructure Tax       |
| 19 | legislation, so long as correcting those deficiencies comports with adopted        |
| 20 | city policies regarding urban development; and                                     |
| 21 | WHEREAS, development of transportation infrastructure for the Unser                |
| 22 | Crossing Project is consistent with City policy and will further the benefits that |
| 23 | will be created by improvements already occurring in the Unser and Central         |
| 24 | Area.  |
