ORDINANCE

1 **AUTHORIZING, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF**
2 **ALBUQUERQUE AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD OCTOBER 4, 2011, THE ISSUE AND**
3 **SALE OF A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$50,000,000 CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE,**
4 **NEW MEXICO GROSS RECEIPTS TAX IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS, TO BE**
5 **ISSUED IN ONE OR MORE SERIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING,**
6 **PURCHASING, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, REHABILITATING, MAKING ADDITIONS TO**
7 **OR MAKING IMPROVEMENTS TO ONE OR MORE PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PUBLIC**
8 **FACILITIES OR PURCHASING OR IMPROVING ANY GROUND RELATING THERETO;**
9 **PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS FROM GROSS RECEIPTS TAX**
10 **REVENUES; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN TERMS OR THE METHOD OF DETERMINING**
11 **THE TERMS AND OTHER DETAILS OF THE BONDS; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN**
12 **DOCUMENTS PERTAINING TO THE BONDS; RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY**
13 **TAKEN; REPEALING ALL ACTIONS INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ORDINANCE;**
14 **AUTHORIZING THE TAKING OF OTHER ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUE**
15 **AND SALE OF THE BONDS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

16 Capitalized terms used in the following preambles have the same meaning as
17 attributed to them in Section 1.(A) of this Bond Ordinance unless the context requires
18 otherwise.

19 WHEREAS, the City is a legally and regularly created, established, organized and
20 existing municipal corporation with Home Rule Powers; and

21 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-9-4 NMSA 1978, the State imposes a gross
22 receipts tax on persons engaging in business in the State, and pursuant to Sections 7-1-6.1
23 and 7-1-6.4 NMSA 1978 the City receives monthly distributions from the New Mexico
24 Taxation and Revenue Department of a portion (currently 1.225% of the taxable gross

receipts reported for the City for the month for which such remittance is made) of such gross receipts taxes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 7-1-6.1 and Section 7-1-6.46 NMSA 1978, the City receives monthly distributions from the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department in lieu of gross receipts tax revenue that the City would have received but for the deductions provided by Section 7-9-92 and 7-9-93 NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, the City has previously sold and delivered Tax Obligations of which there remain Outstanding on the date of adoption of the Bond Ordinance by the Council the following aggregate principal amounts:

WHEREAS, except for the Tax Obligations listed above, on the date of adoption of this Bond Ordinance, no portion of the Pledged Revenues has been pledged to the payment of any other Tax Obligations; and

WHEREAS, the effectiveness of this Ordinance is subject to approval by the voters of the City at an election to be held on October 4, 2011; and

1 WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the City and
2 its residents that the Bonds be secured by a lien (but not an exclusive lien) on the Pledged
3 Revenues on a par with the lien of the New Tax Obligations and Subordinate to the lien on
4 the Old Lien Pledged Revenues of the Old Lien Tax Obligations; and

5 WHEREAS, the Act provides that any law which authorizes the pledge of any or all of
6 the Pledged Revenues to the payment of any revenue bonds issued pursuant to the Act or
7 which affects the Pledged Revenues, or any law supplemental thereto or otherwise
8 appertaining thereto, shall not be repealed or amended or otherwise directly or indirectly
9 modified in such a manner as to impair adversely any such outstanding revenue bonds,
10 including the Bonds, unless such outstanding revenue bonds, including the Bonds, have
11 been discharged in full or provision has been fully made therefor; and

12 WHEREAS, the City is authorized by the Act to issue the Bonds as bonds in one or
13 more series the interest on which may be taxable for federal income tax purposes in order to
14 raise funds for the Projects; and

15 WHEREAS, the Council determines that it is in the best interest of the City to sell
16 each series of Bonds to the Investment Bankers at a price not less than the Bonds Sale Price
17 for each series, contingent upon approval by the Council of the final terms of each series of
18 Bonds in a Sale Resolution and upon approval by the Council of the terms of a Bond
19 Purchase Agreement, all within the parameters set forth in the Bond Legislation; and

20 WHEREAS, there will be on deposit with the City Clerk and presented to the City
21 Council in connection with the Sale Resolution; and:

- 22 1. The proposed form Bond Purchase Agreement;
- 23 2. The proposed form of Continuing Disclosure Undertaking;
- 24 3. The proposed form of Preliminary Official Statement; and
- 25 4. The proposed form of Official Statement.

26 WHEREAS, all required authorization, consents or approvals of any State,
27 governmental body, agency or authority in connection with the authorization, execution and
28 delivery of the Bonds: (i) which are required to have been obtained by the date of the
29 adoption of the Bond Legislation have been obtained, and (ii) which will be required to be
30 obtained prior to any Closing Date, will have been obtained by that date.

31 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
32 ALBUQUERQUE:

1 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS; CONSTRUCTION.

2 (A) DEFINITIONS. As used in the Bond Legislation, the following terms
3 shall, for all purposes, have the meanings specified in this Section 1.(A), unless the context
4 clearly requires otherwise (such meanings to be equally applicable to both the singular and
5 the plural forms of the terms defined):

6 ACT. The general laws of the State, including Sections 3-31-1 to 3-31-12 NMSA
7 1978, as amended and supplemented, the Home Rule Powers, the Charter of the City, and
8 all enactments of the Council, including the Bond Legislation, relating to the issuance of the
9 Bonds.

10 ACQUISITION FUND. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
11 Bonds Projects Acquisition Fund" created in Section 16.

12 AUTHENTICATING AGENT. The Registrar and any additional or successor or
13 co-Authenticating Agent appointed from time to time by an Authorized Officer.

14 AUTHORIZED DENOMINATIONS. \$5,000 and any integral multiple of \$5,000.

15 AUTHORIZED OFFICER. The Mayor, Chief Administrative Officer, Director of
16 Finance and Administrative Services and Treasurer of the City, or other officer or employee
17 of the City when designated by a certificate signed by the Mayor of the City from time to time.
18 The certificate may designate one or more alternates.

19 BOND COUNSEL. An attorney at law or a firm of attorneys designated by the City of
20 nationally recognized standing in matters pertaining to the issuance of bonds issued by
21 states and their political subdivisions.

22 BOND INSURANCE POLICY. Any policy of municipal bond insurance with respect to
23 a series of Tax Obligations insuring the payment, when due, of the principal of and interest
24 on all or part of that series.

25 BOND LEGISLATION. This Bond Ordinance and as to any series of Bonds, the
26 applicable Sale Resolution.

27 BOND ORDINANCE. This City Ordinance Nineteenth Council Bill No. _____, as
28 amended or supplemented from time to time.

29 BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT. A Bond Purchase Agreement among the City
30 and the Investment Bankers relating to the sale of a series of Bonds to the Investment
31 Bankers.

32 BOND REGISTER. The books maintained by the Registrar for the registration,
33 transfer and exchange of each series of Bonds.

1 BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax Revenue
2 Bonds" authorized by the Bond Ordinance and to be issued in one or more series in
3 accordance with the terms of the Bond Ordinance.

4 BUSINESS DAY. Any day other than (i) a Saturday or Sunday or (ii) any day on
5 which the offices of the City and banks located in the cities in which the principal offices of
6 the Paying Agent and Registrar are located are authorized or required to remain closed or
7 (iii) a day on which the New York Stock Exchange is closed.

8 CITY. The City of Albuquerque, in the County of Bernalillo and State of New Mexico.

9 CITY CHARTER. The Charter of the City adopted pursuant to the laws of the State at
10 a special election on June 29, 1971 and amended thereafter from time to time.

11 CLOSING DATE. The date of the original issue, sale and delivery to the Investment
12 Bankers or their designee, of a series of Bonds.

13 CODE. The Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time. Each
14 reference to a section of the Code in the Bond Legislation shall be deemed to include the
15 final and temporary United States Treasury regulations thereunder, as the same may be in
16 effect from time to time, to the extent the same are applicable, unless the context clearly
17 requires otherwise.

18 COMPLETION DATE. The date of completion of the construction, acquisition and
19 installation of the Projects or, as to that portion of the Projects to be funded by a series of
20 Bonds and as certified pursuant to Section 17.

21 CONTINUING DISCLOSURE UNDERTAKING. An undertaking of the City for the
22 benefit of respective Owners and beneficial owners of the each series of Bonds, if required
23 by law, pursuant to which the City will agree for the benefit of the respective Owners and
24 beneficial owners that, while the applicable Bonds are outstanding, the City will annually
25 provide certain financial information and operating data and will provide notice of certain
26 material events in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 promulgated under the Securities
27 Exchange Act of 1934.

28 COUNCIL. The governing body in which is vested the legislative power of the City.

29 COUNSEL. An attorney at law (who may be counsel to the City).

30 CREDIT FACILITY. A letter of credit, line of credit, Bond Insurance Policy or Reserve
31 Fund Insurance Policy, guaranty or similar agreement provided by a Credit Source whose
32 senior unsecured debt is rated no lower than the current rating on the applicable Obligations
33 and in any event no lower than "AAA" by Moody's, S&P and Fitch to the extent each such

1 rating agency is then rating such Obligations to provide support to pay the purchase price of,
2 or the payment when due of the principal of and interest on, such Obligations.

3 CREDIT SOURCE. Any bank, insurance company or other financial institution which
4 provides a Credit Facility for Tax Obligations.

5 DEBT SERVICE FUND. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
6 Improvement Revenue Bonds Debt Service Fund" created in Section 16.

7 DEBT SERVICE REQUIREMENTS. With respect to Tax Obligations and for any
8 given period, the sum of: (i) the amount required to pay the interest, or to make
9 reimbursements for payments of interest, becoming due on the Tax Obligations during that
10 period; plus (ii) the amount required to pay the principal or accreted value, or to make
11 reimbursements for the payment of principal or accreted value, becoming due on the Tax
12 Obligations during that period, whether at maturity, an accretion term date or upon
13 mandatory sinking fund redemption dates, plus (iii) the periodic payments required to be
14 made by the City pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement minus (iv) the periodic
15 payments to be received by the City pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement. No
16 payments required for any Tax Obligations which may be tendered or otherwise presented
17 for payment at the option or demand of the owners or holders of the Tax Obligations or which
18 may occur because of the exercise of an option by the City, or which may otherwise become
19 due by reason of any other circumstance or contingency, including acceleration or Exchange
20 Termination Payments, which constitutes other than regularly scheduled payments on Tax
21 Obligations shall be included in any computation of Debt Service Requirements for that
22 period.

23 Unless, at the time of computation of Debt Service Requirements, payments on the
24 Tax Obligations are owed to, or the Tax Obligations are owned or held by, the provider of a
25 Credit Facility pursuant to the provisions of that Credit Facility, the computation of interest for
26 the purposes of this definition shall be made without considering the interest rate payable
27 pursuant to a Credit Facility.

28 In any computation of Debt Service Requirements relating to the issuance of
29 additional New Lien Tax Obligations, there shall be deducted from that computation of Debt
30 Service Requirements amounts and investments which are irrevocably committed to make
31 designated payments on the Tax Obligations during the applicable period, including, without
32 limitation money on deposit in any debt service account, amounts on deposit in an escrow
33 account irrevocably committed to make designated payments on the Tax Obligations during

1 the applicable period and earnings on such investments which are payable during the
2 applicable period.

3 For the purpose of the definition of Debt Service Requirements, the accreted value of
4 capital appreciation bonds becoming due shall be included in the calculation of accrued and
5 unpaid and accruing interest and principal only from and after the date which is one year
6 prior to the date on which the accreted value becomes payable. In addition, the definition of
7 Debt Service Requirements shall include any expense component.

8 DEFEASANCE OBLIGATIONS. The following obligations which are not redeemable
9 at the option of the City:

10 (1) Government Obligations; and
11 (2) if permitted by law, obligations described in Section 103(a) of
12 the Code, (a) provisions for the payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on
13 which (i) shall have been made by the irrevocable deposit with a bank or trust company
14 acting as a trustee, escrow agent or holder of such obligations, securities described in clause
15 (1) of this definition, the maturing principal of and interest on which, when due and payable,
16 without further investment or reinvestment thereof, will provide sufficient money to pay when
17 due the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on such obligations, and (ii) which
18 securities described in clause (1) of this definition are not available to satisfy any other claim,
19 including any claim of such trustee or escrow agent or of any person claiming through such
20 trustee or escrow agent or to whom such trustee or escrow agent may be obligated, including
21 claims in the event of insolvency of such trustee or escrow agent or proceedings arising out
22 of such insolvency or (b) rated in its highest rating category (without regard to any refinement
23 or gradation thereof by numerical modifier or otherwise) by S&P, Moody's or Fitch.

24 DEPOSITORY. The following registered securities depository: The Depository Trust
25 Company, 55 Water Street, 22nd Fl., New York 10041-0099, Fax (212) 855-8440, in
26 accordance with then-current guidelines of the Securities and Exchange Commission, such
27 other address and/or such other securities depositories as an Authorized Officer may
28 designate.

29 ELECTRONIC MEANS. Telephone, telecopy, telegraph, facsimile transmission or
30 any other similar means of electronic communication. Any communication by telephone as
31 an Electronic Means shall be promptly confirmed in writing, which may be by one of the other
32 means of electronic communication listed in this definition.

1 EMMA. The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's Electronic Municipal Market
2 Access System located on its website at emma.msrb.org.

3 EVENT OF DEFAULT. Any of the events set forth in Section 28.

4 EXCHANGE ACT. Section 6-18-8.1 NMSA 1978, as amended from time to time.

5 EXCHANGE TERMINATION PAYMENT. The net amount payable pursuant to a
6 Qualified Exchange Agreement by the City or a Qualified Counterparty to compensate the
7 other party for any losses and costs that such other party may incur as a result of the early
8 termination of the obligations, in whole or in part, of the parties under that Qualified
9 Exchange Agreement.

10 EXPENSES. The reasonable and necessary fees, costs and expenses incurred by
11 the City in connection with the issuance of the Bonds and any transaction or event
12 contemplated by the Bonds and the Bond Legislation including, without limitation: (i) costs of
13 advertising and publication of legislation relating to any series of Bonds; (ii) costs of printing
14 certificates for any series of Bonds and any disclosure documents; (iii) legal fees and
15 expenses; (iv) fees and expenses of any (a) fiscal service providers, (b) underwriter
16 (including underwriter's discount), (c) financial advisor, (d) Independent Accountant, and (e)
17 Qualified Counterparty; (v) the initial premium payable to any bond insurer; (vi) disclosure
18 matters pertaining or allocable to any series of Bonds; and (vii) all reasonable and necessary
19 fees and administrative costs of the City relating to the foregoing.

20 FISCAL AGENT. Collectively, the Paying Agent, Registrar and Authenticating Agent.

21 FISCAL YEAR. The twelve-month period commencing on the first day of July of each
22 year and ending on the 30th day of June of the next succeeding year, or any other twelve-
23 month period which the City or other appropriate authority establishes as the fiscal year for
24 the City.

25 FITCH. Fitch Ratings, its successors and their assigns, and, if such entity is
26 dissolved or liquidated or no longer performs the functions of a securities ratings agency, any
27 other nationally recognized securities rating agency designated by the City.

28 GOVERNMENT OBLIGATIONS. Direct obligations of, or obligations the principal of
29 and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by, the United States of America or
30 certificates or receipts established by the United States Government or its agencies or
31 instrumentalities representing direct ownership of future interests or principal payments on
32 direct obligations of, or obligations fully guaranteed by, the United States of America or any
33 of its agencies or instrumentalities, the obligations of which are backed by the full faith and

1 credit of the United States, which obligations are held by a custodian in safekeeping on
2 behalf of the holders of such receipts, and rated or assessed in its highest Rating Category
3 by S&P, if then rating any series of Bonds, Moody's, if then rating any series of Bonds, and
4 Fitch, if then rating any series of Bonds, as applicable.

5 GROSS RECEIPTS TAX INCOME FUND. The "City of Albuquerque Gross Receipts
6 Tax Income Fund" continued in Section 16.

7 HOME RULE POWERS. The authority of the City to exercise legislative powers
8 given pursuant to Article X, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State and the City Charter.

9 INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT. Any certified public accountant, registered
10 accountant, or firm of such accountants duly licensed to practice and practicing as such
11 under the laws of the State, appointed and paid by the City who (i) is, in fact, independent
12 and not under the domination of the City, (ii) does not have any substantial interest, direct or
13 indirect, with the City, and (iii) is not connected with the City as an officer or employee of the
14 City, but who may be regularly retained to make annual or similar audits of the books or
15 records of the City.

16 INSURED BANK. Any federally or state-chartered savings and loan association or
17 federally or state-chartered commercial bank, the deposits of which are insured by the
18 Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and which has, or is the lead bank of a parent holding
19 company which has, combined capital, surplus and undivided profits of not less than
20 \$10,000,000.

21 INSURER. Any insurer or insurers issuing a Bond Insurance Policy or Surety Bond,
22 or both, for Tax Obligations.

23 INTEREST PAYMENT DATE. Each January 1 and July 1, or, if any January 1 or
24 July 1 is not a Business Day, the-next succeeding Business Day, with the first such Interest
25 Payment Date for any series of Bonds to be established in the applicable Sale Resolution.

26 INVESTMENT BANKERS. The investment bankers, if any, or their successors and
27 assigns if approved in any Sale Resolution.

28 MATURITY DATE. The respective date on which any series of Bonds mature.

29 MOODY'S. Moody's Investors Service, Inc., a corporation organized and existing
30 under the laws of the State of Delaware, its successors and other assigns, and, if such
31 corporation is dissolved or liquidated or no longer performs the functions of a securities rating
32 agency, any other nationally recognized securities rating agency designated by the City.

1 NEW LIEN TAX OBLIGATIONS. The Series 2001 Bonds, the Series 2004A Bonds,
2 the Series 2004B Bonds, the Series 2008A Bonds, the Series 2008B Bonds, the Series
3 2009A Bonds, the Series 2009B Bonds, the NMFA Surcharge Loan Agreement, the NMFA
4 Stadium Lease Loan Agreement, the Bonds, and any other Tax Obligations, issued or
5 incurred after the adoption of this Bond Ordinance payable from the Pledged Revenues, with
6 a lien on the Pledged Revenues on a parity with the lien on the Pledged Revenues of the
7 Bonds, and subordinate to the lien of the Old Lien Tax Obligations and prior to the lien of the
8 Subordinate Tax Obligations.

9 NEW MEXICO FINANCE AUTHORITY STADIUM LEASE LOAN. The \$6,000,000
10 Loan Agreement dated October 4, 2002 by and between the NMFA and the City.

11 NEW MEXICO FINANCE AUTHORITY SURCHARGE LOAN. The \$9,000,000 Loan
12 Agreement dated December 27, 2002 by and between the NMFA and the City.

13 NMFA. The New Mexico Finance Authority.

14 NMSA 1978. The compilation of the laws of the State known as New Mexico Statutes
15 Annotated, 1978 Compilation, as amended and supplemented from time to time.

16 OFFICIAL STATEMENT. The final disclosure document relating to the sale of any
17 series of Bonds (including the cover page and all summary statements, appendices and
18 other materials included or incorporated by reference or attached thereto), as amended or
19 supplemented.

20 OLD LIEN PLEDGED REVENUES. That portion of Pledged Revenues which is equal
21 to one percent (1%) of the sum of taxable gross receipts, plus receipts which would have
22 been taxable gross receipts but for the deductions provided by Sections 7-9-92 and 7-9-93
23 NMSA 1978, plus other receipts for which a distribution in lieu of Old Lien Pledged Revenues
24 is made to the City, reported for the City for the month for which such remittance is made.

25 OLD LIEN TAX OBLIGATIONS. The Series 1991B Bonds and the Series 1996
26 Bonds.

27 OUTSTANDING. When used in reference to Tax Obligations, on any particular date,
28 the aggregate of all Tax Obligations issued and delivered under the applicable City ordinance
29 or resolution authorizing the issuance of the Tax Obligations, except:

30 (1) those canceled at or prior to such date or delivered to or
31 acquired by the City at or prior to such date for cancellation;

32 (2) those which have been paid or are deemed to be paid in
33 accordance with the City ordinance or resolution authorizing the issuance of the applicable

1 Tax Obligations, or otherwise relating thereto, provided that the payment of Insured Tax
2 Obligations with the proceeds of a Bond Insurance Policy shall not result in those Insured
3 Tax Obligations ceasing to be Outstanding;

4 (3) in the case of Variable Rate Tax Obligations, any Tax
5 Obligations deemed tendered but not yet presented for payment; and

6 (4) those in lieu of or in exchange or substitution for which other
7 Tax Obligations shall have been delivered, unless proof satisfactory to the City and the
8 Paying Agent for the applicable Tax Obligations is presented that any Tax Obligations for
9 which new Tax Obligations were issued or exchanged are held by a bona fide holder or in
10 due course.

11 OWNER. The registered owner of a Bond as shown, from time to time, on the
12 registration books maintained by the Registrar.

13 PAYING AGENT. The City Treasurer or other agent for the City for the payment of
14 any series of the Bonds and any co-paying agent or successor paying agent which is a trust
15 company, national or state banking association or financial institution appointed by resolution
16 of the Council or by an Authorized Officer from time to time.

17 PAYMENT OBLIGATIONS. All obligations of the City to pay a Credit Source the
18 principal amount of, interest on, and fees, costs, expenses and other amounts related to
19 drawings, term loans and other advances and Tax Obligations held by that Credit Source,
20 pursuant to the relevant Credit Facility.

21 PERMITTED INVESTMENTS. Any of the following which at the time are legal
22 investments for the City for the money to be invested and any other investments which at the
23 time of investments are legal investments of the City for the money to be invested:

24 (1) Government Obligations;

25 (2) Obligations of, or obligations guaranteed as to principal and
26 interest by any agency or instrumentality of the United States which are backed by the full
27 faith and credit of the United States, but not including: General Services Administration—
28 participation certificates; Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA)—GNMA
29 guaranteed mortgage-backed securities and GNMA guaranteed participation certificates;
30 U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development—local authority bonds; and U.S. Export-
31 Import Bank—all fully guaranteed obligations;

32 (3) Obligations of the following government-sponsored agencies:
33 Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation—participation certificates and senior debt

obligations; Farm Credit System (formerly: Federal Land Banks and Banks for Cooperatives)—consolidated system-wide bonds and notes; Federal Home Loan Banks—consolidated debt obligations; Federal National Mortgage Association—senior debt obligations and mortgage-backed securities (excluding stripped mortgage securities which are valued greater than par on the portion of unpaid principal); Student Loan Marketing Association—senior debt obligations (excluding securities that do not have a fixed par value and/or whose terms do not promise a fixed dollar amount at maturity or call date) and letter of credit backed issues; Financing Corporation—debt obligations; and Resolution Funding Corporation—debt obligations;

(4) Certificates of deposit, time deposits and banker's acceptances of any bank or savings and loan association, the short-term obligations of which are rated in the highest Rating Categories by S&P, Moody's or Fitch, provided that such deposits must be fully secured by securities designated in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (9) of this definition and held in safekeeping for, or on behalf of, or held in book-entry form in the name of, the City;

(5) Accounts with banks and savings and loan associations located in Bernalillo County, provided that the banks and savings and loan associations, and the collateral securing the investments permitted by this paragraph, satisfy the requirements of applicable State law;

(6) Obligations the interest on which is excluded from gross income of the recipient for federal income tax purposes which are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P, Moody's or Fitch;

(7) Money market instruments and other securities of commercial banks, broker-dealers or recognized financial investors, which securities or institutions are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P and Moody's or Fitch, or which securities are guaranteed by a person or entity whose long-term debt obligations are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P and Moody's or Fitch, including, without limitation, securities of, or other interests in, any open end or closed end management type investment company or investment trust registered under the provisions of 15 U.S.C. Sections 80(a)-1 *et. seq.*, which invest only in, or whose securities are secured only by, obligations of the type set forth in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (9) of this definition;

(8) The "short-term investment fund" described in Section 6-10-10.1 NMSA 1978 or other similar pooled fund maintained by the State for the investment of public funds of local public bodies of the State;

1 (9) Stripped Securities: (i) U.S. Treasury STRIPS and (ii)
2 REFCORP STRIPS (stripped by Federal Reserve Bank of New York);

3 (10) Repurchase agreements involving the purchase and sale of,
4 and guaranteed investment contracts, the par value of which is collateralized by a perfected
5 first pledge of, or security interest in, or the payments of which are unconditionally
6 guaranteed by, securities described in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (9) of this definition, which
7 collateral is held by the City, or for the benefit of the City, by a party other than the provider of
8 the guaranteed investment contract or repurchase agreement, with a collateralized value of
9 at least 102% of the par value of such repurchase agreement or guaranteed investment
10 contract or 102% of the market value thereof, valued at intervals of no less than monthly and
11 which collateral is not subject to any other pledge or security interest;

12 (11) Cash insured at all times by the Federal Deposit Insurance
13 Corporation or otherwise collateralized with Government Obligations; and

14 (12) Agreements which permit the City to require a commercial
15 bank, broker-dealer or recognized financial institution to purchase from the City at a fixed
16 price obligations described in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (9) of this definition; provided that,
17 if required by law, the contract relating to such agreement is approved by resolution of the
18 Council and all other requirements of law relating to any such investment are satisfied and
19 provided further that such institution, or the guarantor of such institution or agreement, shall
20 be rated in one of the top two Rating Categories by S&P, Moody's or Fitch, or by another
21 national rating agency.

22 PERSON. Any individual, corporation, partnership (in which case each general
23 partner shall be deemed a Person), limited liability company, joint venture, association, joint
24 stock company, trust, unincorporated organization, government or any agency or political
25 subdivision of a government.

26 PLAN IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE. The committee established pursuant to F/S
27 R-11-204.

28 PLEDGED REVENUES. The revenues from the State gross receipts tax derived
29 pursuant to Section 7-9-4 NMSA 1978, imposed on persons engaging in business in the
30 State, which revenues are remitted monthly by the Revenue Division of the Taxation and
31 Revenue Department of the State to the City as authorized by Sections 7-1-6 and 7-1-6.4
32 NMSA 1978, and which remittances as of the date of adoption of this Bond Ordinance are
33 equal to one and two hundred twenty-five thousandths percent (1.225%) of the taxable gross

1 receipts reported for the City for the month for which such remittance is made; provided that
2 if a greater amount of such gross receipts tax revenues are hereafter provided to be remitted
3 to the City under applicable law, such additional amounts shall be included as revenues
4 pledged pursuant to Bond Legislation; and provided further that the amount of revenues
5 pledged pursuant to the Bond Legislation shall never be less than the greater of: (i) 1.225%
6 of the taxable gross receipts remitted to the City as set forth above, or (ii) the maximum
7 amount at any time provided hereinafter to be remitted to the City under applicable law; and
8 provided further, the City intends that Section 3-31-6(C) NMSA 1978 applies expressly to the
9 amount of revenues pledged pursuant to the Bond Legislation. Pledged Revenues also
10 includes (i) the portion of the gross receipts tax distribution to the City to be made pursuant to
11 Section 7-1-6.46 NMSA 1978, which represents the amount of State gross receipts tax
12 revenues set forth in the sentence above that would have been remitted to the City but for
13 the deductions provided by Sections 7-9-92 and 7-9-93 NMSA 1978 and (ii) any similar
14 distributions made to the City in lieu of State gross receipts tax revenues, but State gross
15 receipts tax revenues do not include any similar distributions in lieu of any municipal local
16 option gross receipts tax revenues.

17 PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT. The initial disclosure document relating to
18 the sale of any series of Bonds (including the cover page and all summary statements,
19 appendices and other materials included or incorporated by reference or attached thereto),
20 as amended or supplemented.

21 PROJECTS. The Projects to be financed by a series of Bonds and established
22 through the procedures set forth in Section 4.(B).

23 QUALIFIED COUNTERPARTY. Any Person entering into a Qualified Exchange
24 Agreement with the City, its successors and assigns, or any substitute Qualified
25 Counterparty, appointed or consented to from time to time by an Authorized Officer.

26 QUALIFIED EXCHANGE AGREEMENT. Any financial arrangement between the City
27 and a Qualified Counterparty which satisfies the requirements of the Exchange Act at the
28 time the agreement is entered into.

29 RATING CATEGORY. A generic securities rating category, without regard, in the
30 case of a long-term rating category, to any refinement or gradation of such long-term rating
31 category by a numerical modifier or otherwise.

32 REBATE FUND. The fund, if any, for any series of Bonds created by ordinance or
33 resolution of the City relating to any series of Bonds for the purpose of depositing funds to be

1 used to make rebate payments or alternative amounts in lieu of rebate to the federal
2 government.

3 RECORD DATE. The fifteenth day of the month immediately preceding each Interest
4 Payment Date.

5 REGISTRAR. The Treasurer or other agent for the City for the transfer and exchange
6 of the Bonds and any co-registrar or successor registrar which is a trust company, national or
7 state banking association or financial institution appointed by resolution of the Council or by
8 an Authorized Officer from time to time.

9 RELATED DOCUMENTS. Any Bond Purchase Agreement, Continuing Disclosure
10 Undertaking, and any other documents relating to the Bonds identified and approved in the
11 Bond Legislation.

12 S&P. Standard & Poor's Public Finance Group, a division of McGraw-Hill
13 Companies, Inc., its successors and their assigns and, if such corporation is dissolved or
14 liquidated or no longer performs the functions of a securities rating agency, any other
15 nationally recognized securities rating agency designated by the City.

16 SALE PRICE. The principal amount (plus any original issue premium and less any
17 original issue discount) of each series of Bonds less an underwriter's discount to be set forth
18 in a Sale Resolution not to exceed 2.0% of the principal amount of each series of Bonds
19 (which discount includes expenses, fees, and attorneys' fees of the Investment Bankers)
20 plus, in such case, accrued interest from the date of that series of Bonds to the Closing Date
21 for that series of Bonds.

22 SALE RESOLUTION. A resolution, and all amendments thereto of the Council
23 setting and approving specifications for any series of Bonds within the parameters set in the
24 Bond Ordinance, and relating to the issuance, sale and administration thereof.

25 SERIES 1991B BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts
26 Tax/Lodgers' Tax Refunding and Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 1991B."

27 SERIES 1996 BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
28 Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 1996."

29 SERIES 2001 BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Taxable Golf Course
30 Net Revenue/Gross Receipts Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2001."

31 SERIES 2004A BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Tax-Exempt Gross
32 Receipts Tax/Lodgers' Tax Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2004A."

1 SERIES 2004B BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Taxable Gross
2 Receipts Tax/Lodgers' Tax Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2004B."

3 SERIES 2008A BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
4 Refunding Revenue Bonds, Taxable Series 2008A."

5 SERIES 2008B BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
6 Revenue Refunding Bonds (Beach, Bluewater and Manzano Vista Projects), Series 2008B."

7 SERIES 2009A BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts
8 Tax/Lodgers' Tax Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2009A."

9 SERIES 2009B BONDS. The "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax
10 Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2009B."

11 SPECIAL RECORD DATE. A date established for payment of overdue interest on
12 the Bonds by the Paying Agent pursuant to Section 5.(B).

13 STATE. The State of New Mexico.

14 SUBORDINATE TAX OBLIGATIONS. All Tax Obligations now Outstanding or
15 hereafter issued or incurred with a lien on the Pledged Revenues subordinate to the lien of
16 the New Lien Tax Obligations on the Pledged Revenues or the lien of the Old Lien Tax
17 Obligations on the Old Lien Pledged Revenues.

18 SURETY BOND. Any policy of insurance or surety bond with respect to a series of
19 Tax Obligations guaranteeing certain payments into a debt service reserve account or similar
20 account with respect to that series of Tax Obligations, purchased to satisfy, in whole or in
21 part, the reserve requirement for that series or to replace any money on deposit in a debt
22 service reserve account or similar account.

23 TAX OBLIGATIONS. New Lien Tax Obligations, Old Lien Tax Obligations, and any
24 other bonds, notes or other instruments which evidence a borrowing payable from and
25 secured by (i) the Old Lien Pledged Revenues; or (ii) the Pledged Revenues now
26 Outstanding or hereafter issued or incurred.

27 VALUE. The value of any investment shall be calculated as follows:

28 (A) as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are published on a
29 regular basis in The Wall Street Journal (or, if not there, then in The New York Times): the
30 average of the bid and asked prices for such investments so published on or most recently
31 prior to such time of determination;

32 (B) as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are not published
33 on a regular basis in The Wall Street Journal or The New York Times: the average bid price

1 at such time of determination for such investments by any two nationally recognized
2 government securities dealers (selected by the City in its absolute discretion) at the time
3 making a market in such investments or the bid price published by a nationally recognized
4 pricing service;

5 (C) as to certificates of deposit and bankers acceptances: the face amount
6 thereof, plus accrued interest; and

7 (D) as to any investment not specified above: the value thereof established
8 by prior agreement between the City and the Credit Source.

9 VARIABLE INTEREST RATE. An interest rate which varies or fluctuates from time to
10 time. Except for any historical period for which the actual rate or rates are determinable, and
11 unless otherwise stated in the Bond Legislation, interest shall be calculated for Variable
12 Interest Rate Tax Obligations at the maximum interest rate then permitted on such Tax
13 Obligations by the City ordinance authorizing the issuance of such Tax Obligations.

14 VARIABLE RATE OBLIGATIONS. Tax Obligations, including reimbursement
15 obligations pursuant to a Credit Facility, the interest rate on which is subject to change from
16 time to time.

17 (E) RULES OF CONSTRUCTION. Except as otherwise expressly provided
18 in the Bond Legislation, or unless the context otherwise requires:

19 (1) The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the
20 singular.

21 (2) All accounting terms not otherwise defined in the Bond
22 Legislation have the meanings assigned to them in accordance with generally accepted
23 accounting principles in the United States.

24 (3) All references to Sections shall refer to Sections of this Bond
25 Ordinance unless otherwise stated.

26 (4) Words importing any gender include the other gender.

27 (5) "Herein," "hereby," "hereunder," "hereof," "hereinbefore" and
28 "hereafter" refer to the Bond Legislation and not solely to the particular portion of the Bond
29 Legislation in which such word is used.

30 SECTION 2. RATIFICATION. All action heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the
31 provisions of the Bond Legislation) by the Council and the officers of the City, directed toward
32 the issuance and sale of the Bonds, is ratified, approved and confirmed, including City

1 Council Enactment No. R-2011-204, adopted by the Council by a vote of 5-3, with one
2 member excused.

3 SECTION 3. FINDINGS. The Council declares that it has considered all relevant
4 information and data in making its findings and finds and determines that:

5 (A) The Pledged Revenues may lawfully be pledged to secure the payment
6 of the Bonds to the extent and in the manner provided in the Bond Legislation.

7 (B) The Bonds are issued pursuant to the Act.

8 (C) The issuance of the Bonds in one or more series and the construction,
9 acquisition and installation of the Projects are in the interest of the public health, safety and
10 welfare of the residents of the City.

11 SECTION 4. AUTHORIZATIONS AND APPROVALS.

12 (A) AUTHORIZATION OF BONDS AND PROCEEDS OF BONDS. This
13 Bond Ordinance has been adopted by the affirmative vote of the Council. For the purpose of
14 protecting the public health, conserving the property, protecting the general welfare and
15 prosperity of the citizens of the City and achieving cost savings, it is declared necessary that
16 the City issue, and the City is hereby authorized to issue its Bonds as negotiable, fully
17 registered bonds, pursuant to the Act and as set forth in the Bond Legislation.

18 The Bonds are designated as the "City of Albuquerque, New Mexico Gross
19 Receipts Tax Improvement Revenue Bonds." The Bonds may be issued in one or more
20 series, with appropriate series and other designations, as set forth in a Sale Resolution to
21 further identify each series of Bonds. The issuance of the Bonds in a cumulative amount for
22 all series of Bonds not to exceed \$50,000,000 is authorized and approved. The actual
23 principal amount of each maturity of Bonds shall be stated in the applicable Sale Resolution.
24 Each series of Bonds shall be sold to the Investment Bankers or to the NMFA pursuant to a
25 Bond Purchase Agreement in a negotiated sale at a Sale Price.

26 Proceeds of the Bonds may also be used to pay Expenses and for any of the
27 other purposes set forth in the Bond Legislation. The payment of Expenses is authorized
28 and approved.

29 (B) PROJECTS. Pursuant to F/S R-11-204, the Plan Implementation
30 Committee shall have made its recommendations and the Council shall have considered the
31 recommendations of the Plan Implementation Committee so that Projects will have been
32 identified for the voters prior to the next municipal election.

33 SECTION 5. DETAILS OF THE BONDS.

1 (A) GENERAL DETAILS. The Bonds shall be issued only as fully registered
2 bonds and shall be numbered with such prefix or other distinguishing designations as the
3 Registrar may determine necessary or appropriate to distinguish one Bond from another and
4 each series of Bonds from another. Each series of Bonds shall be dated the date stated in
5 the appropriate Sale Resolution, issued in Authorized Denominations and shall bear interest
6 on the basis of a 360-day year and twelve 30-day months from the most recent date to which
7 interest has been paid or provided for or, if no interest has been paid or provided for, from
8 their date until maturity at the rate set forth in the appropriate (Sale Resolution, payable
9 semiannually on January 1 and July 1 of each year beginning on the date set forth in the
10 appropriate Sale Resolution and shall mature on the date or dates stated in the appropriate
11 Sale Resolution; provided that the final Maturity Date of any series of Bonds shall not extend
12 beyond 30 years from the dated date of that series of Bonds. The net effective interest rate
13 on each series of the Bonds shall not exceed twelve percent (12%) per annum.

14 (B) PAYMENT OF BONDS; TRANSFERS TO PAYING AGENT. Payments
15 on the Bonds shall be made in such coin or currency of the United States of America as, at
16 the respective time of payment, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.
17 The City shall transfer funds to the Paying Agent for the Bonds on a timely basis so that the
18 Paying Agent may make payments of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the
19 Bonds when due, to the Owners and comply with the requirements of any Bond Insurer
20 relating to payments of Bonds. As soon as known to the City, the City shall notify the Paying
21 Agent if there is or will be an insufficient amount of money available to pay principal and
22 interest on the Bonds when due.

23 The principal of and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be payable to the
24 Owners upon presentation and surrender of their Bonds at the principal office of the Fiscal
25 Agent.

26 Interest on the Bonds shall be payable on each Interest Payment Date by the
27 Paying Agent by check mailed on the date on which due to the Owners at the close of
28 business on the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date to the registered addresses of
29 Owners appearing on the registration books for the Bonds. In the case of any Owner of the
30 Bonds in an aggregate principal amount in excess of \$1,000,000 as shown on the
31 registration books who, prior to the Record Date for the Bonds next preceding any Interest
32 Payment Date, has provided the Paying Agent with wire transfer instructions, interest shall

1 be paid in immediately available funds in accordance with the wire transfer instructions
2 provided by that Owner.

3 If and to the extent that the City fails to make payment or provision for
4 payment of interest on any Bond on any Interest Payment Date, interest shall continue to
5 accrue on that Bond but shall cease to be payable to the Owner of that Bond as of the
6 applicable Record Date. When money becomes available for payment of the interest, (i) the
7 Registrar shall establish a Special Record Date for the payment of that interest which shall
8 be not more than 15 nor fewer than 10 days prior to the date of the proposed payment, and
9 (ii) the Registrar shall give notice by first-class mail of the proposed payment and of the
10 Special Record Date to each Owner not less than 10 days prior to the Special Record Date
11 and, thereafter, the interest shall be payable to the Owners at the close of business on the
12 Special Record Date.

13 While a Depository or its nominee is the owner of the Bonds, principal and
14 interest payments on the Bonds shall be made to the Depository, or its nominee, as required
15 by the Depository.

16 (C) BOOK-ENTRY. Unless otherwise stated in the Sale Resolution, the
17 Bonds shall initially be issued or registered in book-entry form, from time to time, with a
18 Depository acting as securities depository for the Bonds with no physical distribution of bond
19 certificates made to the public. A single certificate for each maturity date of the Bonds issued
20 in book-entry form shall be delivered to such Depository and immobilized in its custody. The
21 book-entry system shall evidence ownership of Bonds in Authorized Denominations, with
22 transfer of ownership effected on the books of the Depository and its participants
23 ("Participants"). As a condition to delivery of Bonds in book-entry form, the purchaser of the
24 Bonds shall, immediately after acceptance of delivery thereof, deposit those Bonds
25 certificates with such Depository, registered in the name of such Depository or its nominee.
26 Principal, premium, if any, and interest will be paid to such Depository or its nominee as the
27 registered Owner of those Bonds. The transfer of principal and interest payments to
28 Participants shall be the responsibility of such Depository; the transfer of principal and
29 interest payments to the beneficial owners of Bonds (the "Beneficial Owners") shall be the
30 responsibility of such Participants and other nominees of Beneficial Owners maintaining a
31 relationship with Participants (the "Indirect Participants"). The City shall not be responsible or
32 liable for maintaining, supervising or reviewing the records maintained by such Depository,
33 Participants or Indirect Participants.

1 If (i) the Bonds are not eligible for the services of the institution which has
2 been acting as the Depository for the Bonds, (ii) the institution that has been acting as the
3 Depository determines to discontinue its services with respect to the Bonds or (iii) the City
4 determines that a continuation of the system of book-entry transfers through the institution
5 that has been acting as the Depository ceases to be beneficial to the City or the Beneficial
6 Owners, the City shall either identify another Depository or certificates shall be delivered to
7 Beneficial Owners or their nominees. In the event of the discontinuation of the book entry
8 system for the Bonds, the Beneficial Owners or their nominees, upon authentication of the
9 Bonds and registration of the Bonds in the Beneficial Owners' or nominees' names, shall
10 become the Owners for all purposes. The City shall mail an appropriate notice to the
11 Depository for notification to Participants, Indirect Participants and Beneficial Owners of the
12 substitute Depository or the issuance of bond certificates to Beneficial Owners or their
13 nominees, as applicable.

14 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bond Legislation to the contrary, as
15 long as all Bonds are registered in the name of a Depository or its nominee, all payments
16 with respect to principal of, redemption premium, if any, and interest on those Bonds, and all
17 notices with respect to those Bonds, shall be made and given by the Paying Agent or the City
18 to the Depository, by the Depository to its Participants or Indirect Participants and by the
19 Participants and Indirect Participants to the Beneficial Owners.

20 (D) BONDS NOT PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. If any Bonds are not
21 presented for payment when the principal becomes due either at maturity or at the date fixed
22 for redemption thereof or otherwise, or if any check or draft mailed to an Owner in connection
23 with a payment of interest on any Bonds is not cashed by an Owner, and an amount
24 sufficient to pay those Bonds or interest is held by the Paying Agent for the benefit of the
25 Owners, the Paying Agent shall segregate and hold such money in trust without liability for
26 interest on that money to the Owners, for the benefit of the Owners of the applicable Bonds,
27 who shall, except as provided in the following paragraph, then be restricted to only the
28 amounts segregated for the satisfaction of any claim relating to that payment on such Bonds.

29 Any money which the Paying Agent segregates and holds in trust for the
30 payment of the principal of, premium or interest on Bonds which remains unclaimed for three
31 years after such payment has become due shall be paid to the City. After the payment of
32 such unclaimed money to the City, the Owners shall look only to the City for the payment of
33 those Bonds.

1 SECTION 6. REDEMPTION OF BONDS.

2 (A) OPTIONAL REDEMPTION. The Bonds shall be subject to redemption
3 prior to maturity at the option of the City at the times and at the redemption prices set forth as
4 to each series of Bonds, in the applicable Sale Resolution. Unless money sufficient to pay
5 the principal of and premium, if any, on the Bonds to be redeemed pursuant to this Section
6 6.(A) is received by the Paying Agent prior to the giving of notice of redemption in
7 accordance with Section 6.(D), that notice shall state that the redemption is conditional upon
8 the receipt of that money by the Paying Agent by 2:00 p.m. on the redemption date. If an
9 amount sufficient to redeem all Bonds called for redemption is not received by that time, (i)
10 the Paying Agent shall redeem only those Bonds for which the redemption price was
11 received, (ii) the Bonds to be redeemed shall be selected in the manner set forth in Section
12 6.(C) and (iii) the redemption notice shall have no effect with respect to those Bonds for
13 which the redemption price was not received and those Bonds shall not be redeemed. The
14 Registrar shall give notice to the Owners of the Bonds previously called for redemption which
15 shall not be redeemed, in the manner in which notice of redemption was given, identifying
16 the Bonds which shall not be redeemed, stating that the redemption did not take place with
17 respect to those Bonds and shall promptly return any Bonds which shall not be redeemed
18 which were previously delivered by the Owners of those Bonds.

19 (B) MANDATORY SINKING FUND REDEMPTION.

20 Each series of Bonds shall be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption
21 prior to maturity as set forth in the appropriate Sale Resolution.

22 As and for a sinking fund for the redemption of a series of Bonds subject to
23 mandatory sinking fund redemption, on or before July 1 in each of the years and in the
24 principal amounts stated in the applicable Sale Resolution, the City shall transfer into the
25 applicable account of the Debt Service Fund the Pledged Revenues required for the
26 payments of principal on those Bonds with a priority asset forth in Section 19 so that there is
27 on deposit on the required redemption date in the Debt Service Fund amounts sufficient to
28 redeem the Bonds called for redemption (after credit as provided below). Subject to the last
29 paragraph of this subsection (C), Bonds which are term bonds shall be subject to mandatory
30 sinking fund redemption at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof
31 plus accrued interest to the redemption date on July 1 in the years and in the principal
32 amounts stated in the applicable Sale Resolution.

1 At its option, to be exercised on or before the 45th day next preceding any
2 July 1 mandatory sinking fund redemption date, the City may irrevocably elect to (i) deliver to
3 the Paying Agent for cancellation Bonds of the same series and Maturity Date, as the case
4 may be, in any aggregate principal amount and/or (ii) receive a credit in respect of its sinking
5 fund redemption obligation for any Bonds of the same series and Maturity Date which, prior
6 to such date, have been redeemed (otherwise than through the operation of the sinking fund)
7 and canceled by the Paying Agent and not theretofore applied as a credit against any sinking
8 fund redemption obligation. Each Bond so delivered or previously redeemed shall be
9 credited by the Paying Agent at the principal amount thereof against the amounts required to
10 be paid by the City on the respective July 1 mandatory sinking fund redemption date or dates
11 designated by the City and the principal amount of Bonds to be redeemed by operation of
12 such sinking fund on such date shall be accordingly reduced.

13 (C) PARTIAL REDEMPTION. If less than all of the Outstanding Bonds are
14 to be redeemed, the Maturity Dates of the Bonds to be redeemed shall be selected by the
15 City. If less than all Bonds of a given series and Maturity Date are redeemed, the Bonds of
16 that series and Maturity Date to be redeemed shall be selected by lot in such manner as
17 determined by the Fiscal Agent. However, the portion of any Bonds to be redeemed and the
18 portion of any Bond not redeemed shall both be in Authorized Denominations. If, as
19 indicated in a certificate of an Authorized Officer delivered to the Fiscal Agent, the City has
20 offered to purchase all Bonds then Outstanding and less than all of the Bonds have been
21 tendered to the City for purchase, the Fiscal Agent, at the direction of an Authorized Officer,
22 shall select for redemption all, or any part designated by the City, of the Bonds which have
23 not been tendered.

24 In selecting Bonds for redemption, the Fiscal Agent shall treat each Bond as
25 representing that number of Bonds which is obtained by dividing the principal amount of any
26 Bond by the minimum Authorized Denomination. If it is determined that one or more, but not
27 all, of the units of principal amount represented by any Bond is to be called for redemption,
28 then, upon notice of intention to redeem such unit or units, the Owner of such Bond (except
29 with respect to Bonds registered to a Depository or its nominee, in which case a notation as
30 to the amount redeemed may be made on such Bonds) shall promptly surrender such Bond
31 to the Fiscal Agent for (i) payment to such Owner of the redemption price of the unit or units
32 of principal amount called for redemption, and (ii) delivery to such Owner of a new Bond of

1 the same series and Maturity Date in the aggregate principal amount of the unredeemed
2 balance, without charge therefor.

3 If the Owner of any such Bond fails to present that Bond to the Fiscal Agent
4 for payment, that Bond nevertheless shall become due and payable on the date fixed for
5 redemption to the extent of the unit or units of principal amount called for redemption and
6 interest shall cease to accrue on that principal amount.

7 (D) NOTICE. Notice of redemption of Bonds shall be given by the Fiscal
8 Agent by sending a copy of such notice by registered or certified first class, postage prepaid
9 mail not less than 30 days prior to the redemption date of the Bonds being redeemed, to all
10 Depositories, to one or more Information Services and to the Owner of each Bond, or portion
11 thereof, to be redeemed at the address shown as of the fifth day prior to the mailing of notice
12 on the Bond Register. The City shall give the Fiscal Agent notice of the redemption date and
13 the Maturity Date and the principal amounts of each maturity of Bonds to be called for
14 redemption pursuant to Section 6.(A) at least five Business Days prior to the date that the
15 Fiscal Agent is required to give Owners notice of redemption. Bonds to be called for
16 redemption pursuant to Section 6.(B) shall be called for redemption by the Fiscal Agent
17 without the necessity of any notice to the Fiscal Agent from the City. Neither the City's failure
18 to give such notice, the Fiscal Agent's failure to give such notice to any Depository (other
19 than as the Owner of Bonds being redeemed), or the registered Owner of any Bonds to be
20 redeemed, or any defect therein, nor the failure of the Depository to notify a Participant or
21 any Participant or Indirect Participant to notify a Beneficial Owner of any such redemption,
22 shall affect the validity of the proceedings for the redemption of any Bonds for which proper
23 notice was given.

24 The official notice of redemption to Owners shall state:

- 25 (1) the CUSIP numbers of the Bonds to be redeemed,
- 26 (2) the redemption date,
- 27 (3) the redemption price,
- 28 (4) the Bonds to be redeemed,
- 29 (5) if less than all Outstanding Bonds are to be redeemed, the
30 bond numbers and Maturity Dates of the Bonds to be redeemed and, in the case of a partial
31 redemption of a Bond, the principal amount to be redeemed,
- 32 (6) that, subject to the provisions of Section 6.(A), if applicable, on
33 the redemption date, the redemption price will become due and payable on each Bond or

1 portion thereof called for redemption, and that interest thereon shall cease to accrue from
2 and after that date,

3 (7) the place where such Bonds are to be surrendered for payment
4 of the redemption price, the name of a contact person (if the book-entry system described in
5 Section 5.(C) is in effect), and the phone number at the office of the Paying Agent, and

6 (8) if the redemption is pursuant to Section 6.(A), that the
7 redemption is conditional, if applicable, stating the conditions set forth in Section 6.(A).

8 The Paying Agent shall comply with any other terms regarding redemption
9 and notice of redemption, as are required by any agreement with a Depository.

10 Except as provided in Section 6.(A), notice having been given in the manner
11 provided above, the Bonds or part thereof called for redemption shall become due and
12 payable on the redemption date designated and the Bonds, or part thereof to be redeemed,
13 for which the redemption price is on deposit with the Fiscal Agent, shall not be deemed to be
14 Outstanding and shall cease to bear or accrue interest from and after such redemption date.
15 Subject to Section 6.(A), upon presentation of a Bond to be redeemed at the office of the
16 Fiscal Agent on or after the redemption date, or, so long as the book-entry system is used for
17 determining beneficial ownership of the Bond being redeemed, upon satisfaction of the terms
18 of any other arrangement between the Fiscal Agent and the Depository, the Fiscal Agent will
19 pay such Bonds or portion thereof called for redemption.

20 (E) BONDS NOT PRESENTED FOR REDEMPTION. Money for payment
21 of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest, to the date fixed for redemption, on Bonds
22 called for redemption which are not presented for payment on the date fixed for redemption
23 shall be set aside by the Fiscal Agent in trust for the Owners of such Bonds and held as set
24 forth in Section 5.(D). Interest on such Bonds shall cease to accrue on the date fixed for
25 redemption.

26 (F) CANCELLATION. All Bonds which have been redeemed or received for
27 transfer shall be canceled and destroyed by the Fiscal Agent and shall not be reissued and a
28 counterpart of the certificate of destruction evidencing such destruction shall be furnished by
29 the Fiscal Agent to the City.

30 SECTION 7. RESERVED.

31 SECTION 8. REGISTRATION, TRANSFER, EXCHANGE AND OWNERSHIP OF
32 BONDS.

1 (A) REGISTRATION, TRANSFER AND EXCHANGE. The City shall cause
2 books for the registration, transfer and exchange of the Bonds to be kept at the principal
3 office of the Registrar. Upon surrender for transfer or exchange of any Bonds at the principal
4 office of the Registrar duly endorsed by the Owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing,
5 or accompanied by a written instrument or instruments of transfer or exchange in form
6 satisfactory to such Registrar and properly executed, the City shall execute and the Registrar
7 shall authenticate and deliver in the name of the transferee or Owner a new Bond or Bonds
8 of the same Maturity Date, series, interest rate and same aggregate principal amount in
9 Authorized Denominations.

10 (B) OWNER OF BONDS. The person in whose name any Bond is
11 registered shall be deemed and regarded as its absolute Owner for all purposes, except as
12 may otherwise be provided with respect to the payment of interest on Bonds in Section 5.(B).
13 Payment of the principal on any Bonds shall be made only to or upon the order of its Owner
14 or his legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and
15 discharge the liability on Bonds to the extent of the amount paid.

16 (C) REPLACEMENT OF BONDS. If any Bond is lost, stolen, destroyed or
17 mutilated, the Registrar shall, upon receipt of that Bond if mutilated, and evidence,
18 information or indemnity which the Registrar may reasonably require, authenticate and
19 deliver a replacement Bond or Bonds of the same aggregate principal amount, Maturity Date,
20 series and interest rate, bearing a number or numbers not then outstanding. If any lost,
21 stolen, destroyed or mutilated Bond has matured or been called for redemption, the Registrar
22 may direct the Paying Agent to pay that Bond in lieu of replacement.

23 (D) CHARGES. Exchanges and transfers of Bonds shall be made without
24 charge to the Owners or any transferee except that the Registrar may make a charge
25 sufficient to reimburse the Registrar for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to
26 be paid with respect to that transfer or exchange.

27 (E) BONDS CALLED FOR REDEMPTION. The Fiscal Agent shall not be
28 required to transfer or exchange (i) any Bonds during the five-day period preceding the
29 mailing of notice calling Bonds for redemption and (ii) any Series 1999C Bonds or Bonds
30 called for redemption.

31 (F) UNAUTHENTICATED BONDS. The officers of the City are authorized
32 to deliver to the Registrar fully registered but unauthenticated Bonds in such quantities as

1 may be convenient to be held in custody by the Registrar pending the use thereof as
2 provided in the Bond Legislation.

3 SECTION 9. NEGOTIABILITY. Bonds shall be fully negotiable and shall have all
4 the qualities of negotiable paper, and the owner or owners thereof shall possess all rights
5 enjoyed by the owners of negotiable instruments under the provisions of the Uniform
6 Commercial Code—Investment Securities in effect in the State.

7 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LIMITED OBLIGATIONS. The Bonds and all payments of
8 principal, premium, if any, and interest thereon, (whether at maturity or on a redemption date)
9 and the obligations of the City for all other payments, fees, costs, interest and expenses
10 under the Bond Legislation and under all Related Documents shall be special limited
11 obligations of the City payable solely from the Pledged Revenues, which revenues are
12 pledged and are payable as set forth in Sections 19 and 20. However, the Bonds are also
13 payable from amounts on deposit in the Acquisition Fund and the Debt Service Fund.

14 Owners and the parties under any Related Documents may not look to any general or
15 other fund of the City for the payment of the principal of or interest on, or the fees, costs and
16 expenses relating to, such obligations, except the designated special funds pledged therefor.
17 Neither the Bonds nor the obligations of the City under any Related Documents shall
18 constitute an indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any constitutional, charter or
19 statutory prohibition or limitation, nor shall they be considered or held to be general
20 obligations of the City, and the Bonds shall recite that they are payable and collectable solely
21 out of the Pledged Revenues and from any other sources stated in the Bond Legislation and
22 that the Owners may not look to any general or other municipal fund for the payment of the
23 principal, premium, if any, or interest, as applicable, on the Bonds or for the payment of any
24 amounts owed under any Related Documents.

25 SECTION 11. EXECUTION AND CUSTODY OF BONDS.

26 (A) FILING MANUAL SIGNATURES. Prior to the execution of any Bonds
27 pursuant to Sections 6-9-1 through 6-9-6 NMSA, the Mayor, City Clerk and City Treasurer
28 shall each file with the Secretary of State of New Mexico his or her manual signature certified
29 by him or her under oath; provided that such filing shall not be necessary for any officer
30 where any previous filing may have legal application.

31 (B) EXECUTION. Bonds shall be signed with the manual or facsimile
32 signature of the Mayor and the manual or facsimile signature of the City Treasurer or City
33 Clerk. There shall be placed on each Bond the printed, engraved, stamped or otherwise

1 placed facsimile or imprint of the City's corporate seal. Bonds when authenticated and
2 bearing the manual or facsimile signatures of the officers in office at the time of their signing
3 shall be valid and binding obligations of the City, notwithstanding that before delivery of those
4 Bonds, any or all of the persons who executed those Bonds shall have ceased to fill their
5 respective offices. The Mayor, City Clerk and City Treasurer, at the time of the execution of
6 the Bonds, each may adopt as and for his or her own facsimile signature the facsimile
7 signature of his or her predecessor in office if such facsimile signature appears upon any of
8 the Bonds or certificates pertaining to the Bonds. No manual or facsimile signature of any
9 officer of the City or an Authenticating Agent shall be required if the Bonds are issued in
10 book-entry form without the delivery of any physical securities.

11 (C) CUSTODY. The Registrar shall hold in custody all Bonds signed and
12 attested by the Mayor, City Clerk and City Treasurer until ready for delivery to the purchaser,
13 transferee or Owner. The City shall, from time to time, at the written request of the Registrar,
14 provide the Registrar an adequate supply of Bonds.

15 (D) AUTHENTICATION. No Bonds shall be valid or obligatory for any
16 purpose unless the certificate of authentication has been duly executed by the Registrar.
17 That Registrars certificate of authentication shall be deemed to have been duly executed if
18 manually signed by an authorized officer of the Registrar, but it shall not be necessary that
19 the same officer sign the certificate of authentication on all Bonds.

20 SECTION 12. APPOINTMENT OF FISCAL AGENT. The initial Fiscal Agent for the
21 Bonds shall be the City Treasurer, unless otherwise set forth in the Sale Resolution. The
22 Paying Agent, Authenticating Agent and Registrar shall be the same Person for the Bonds,
23 unless otherwise set forth in the Sale Resolution.

24 SECTION 13. SUCCESSOR REGISTRAR OR PAYING AGENT. If the Registrar or
25 Paying Agent initially appointed shall resign, or if the City shall determine to appoint a
26 successor or co-Registrar or co-Paying Agent or shall reasonably determine that a Registrar
27 or Paying Agent has become incapable of fulfilling its duties under the Bond Legislation, the
28 City may, upon notice mailed to each Owner at the address last shown on the registration
29 books, appoint a successor or co-Registrar or Paying Agent. Every such successor or co-
30 Registrar or Paying Agent shall be a bank or trust company located and in good standing in
31 the United States with a capital stock, surplus and undivided profits, however denominated,
32 of not less than \$75,000,000 or the City Treasurer, or any successor in office.
33 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bond Legislation, no removal, resignation or

1 termination of the Paying Agent shall take effect until a successor shall be appointed.
2 Additional provisions relating to the Registrar and the Paying Agent and the payment of the
3 Bonds may be in a separate paying agent agreement executed on behalf of the City by an
4 Authorized Officer.

5 SECTION 14. BOND FORM. Each series of Bonds shall be in substantially the
6 form set forth in the Sale Resolution for each series, with only such changes as are not
7 inconsistent with the Bond Legislation.

8 SECTION 15. SALE OF BONDS.

9 Each series of Bonds shall be sold to the Investment Bankers at the Sale
10 Price for that series, pursuant to the terms of the Bond Legislation and the appropriate Bond
11 Purchase Agreement or to the NMFA. If a series of Bonds is sold to Investment Bankers,
12 after that series of Bonds has been duly executed and authenticated by the Registrar, upon
13 receipt of the Sale Price for that series by the City that series of Bonds shall be delivered to
14 the Investment Bankers by an Authorized Officer or to the Depository, if any, on behalf of the
15 Investment Bankers if the Bonds of that series are issued in book-entry form.

16 SECTION 16. FUNDS. The City creates or continues, as applicable, the following
17 funds:

18 (A) GROSS RECEIPTS TAX INCOME FUND. Continues the Gross
19 Receipts Tax Income Fund previously established and maintained by the City.

20 (B) ACQUISITION FUND. Creates the Acquisition Fund to be maintained
21 by the City. Separate accounts in the Acquisition Fund may be created by the City in each
22 Sale Resolution.

23 (C) DEBT SERVICE FUND. Creates the Debt Service Fund to be
24 maintained by the City. Separate accounts in the Debt Service Fund may be created by the
25 City in each Sale Resolution.

26 (D) ADDITIONAL FUNDS. The City shall create any additional funds which
27 may be required.

28 SECTION 17. BOND PROCEEDS; BOND FUND DEPOSIT; APPROPRIATIONS.

29 The total amount of proceeds from the sale of any series of Bonds shall be applied
30 and appropriated as set forth in the applicable Sale Resolution for that series. Proceeds of
31 any series of Bonds that are deposited in the Acquisition Fund or any account thereof shall
32 be applied to the Projects or the appropriate portion thereof or for the payment of Expenses
33 related to that series of Bonds and for any other purpose related to the Projects or incidental

1 to the issuance or administration of the Bonds permitted by the Bond Legislation; provided
2 that the City may pay Expenses related to any series of Bonds from the proceeds of that
3 series of Bonds without first depositing such proceeds in the Acquisition Fund or any account
4 thereof. The Completion Date for any portion of the Projects funded by a series of Bonds
5 shall be evidenced by a certificate of an Authorized Officer stating that portion of the Projects
6 have been completed. As soon as practicable, and in any event not more than 60 days after
7 the Completion Date, any balance remaining in the applicable account of the Acquisition
8 Fund (other than any amount certified by an Authorized Officer as being necessary for costs
9 of the Projects not then due and payable) shall be transferred to the applicable account of
10 that Debt Service Fund and used by the City for the payment of the principal of or interest
11 next coming due on that series of Bonds. The Investment Bankers shall not be responsible
12 for the application or use by the City or by its officers of the Bond proceeds or of any other
13 funds designated in the Bond Legislation.

14 On the Closing Date, the City Treasurer or other Authorized Officer may approve
15 variations in the amounts to be deposited, transferred and used as set forth in this Section 17
16 as necessary or desirable, to the extent permitted by law.

17 SECTION 18. APPROVAL OF DOCUMENTS; PAYMENT OF EXPENSES.

18 (A) DOCUMENT APPROVAL. As to any series of Bonds, the Council shall
19 adopt in the applicable Sale Resolution, if necessary, a Bond Purchase Agreement,
20 Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, and Preliminary Official Statement in substantially the
21 forms presented to the Council at that time with such changes and additions necessary and
22 appropriate for the issuance of such series of Bonds. Additional Related Documents for the
23 applicable series of Bonds shall also be identified and approved by the Council in the
24 applicable Sale Resolution.

25 (B) EXPENSES. All Expenses shall be paid directly by the City to the party
26 entitled thereto using moneys available from the proceeds of the Bonds or from the Gross
27 Receipts Tax Income Fund, pursuant to the priorities established by Section 19.

28 (C) FURTHER ACTS. From and after the date of the adoption of the Bond
29 Legislation, the officers, agents and employees of the City are authorized, empowered and
30 directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be
31 necessary to issue the Bonds and to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Bond
32 Legislation and the Related Documents.

33 SECTION 19. DEPOSIT AND PRIORITIES FOR USE OF PLEDGED REVENUES.

1 (A) DEBT SERVICE FUND. So long as any Bonds are Outstanding, either
2 as to principal or interest, or both, the Pledged Revenues shall be set aside and deposited as
3 follows:

4 Pledged Tax Revenues shall, immediately upon receipt thereof by the City, be
5 set aside and deposited into the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund. All money deposited into
6 the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund shall be held separate and apart from the City's
7 general fund and applied only in accordance with the provisions of the Bond Legislation and
8 any other City ordinance authorizing the issuance of Tax Obligations. Money shall not be
9 accumulated in or transferred from the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund for the payment of
10 the principal of, premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds or other Tax Obligations after the
11 payment each month of, or the setting aside of funds each month sufficient to pay, the
12 amounts required to be deposited pursuant to this Section 19. The following payments shall
13 be made from the Pledged Revenues:

14 Firstly, as a first charge on the Pledged Revenues, but only to the extent the
15 Pledged Revenues consist of Old Lien Pledged Revenues, the amounts necessary to pay
16 the Debt Service Requirements on Old Lien Tax Obligations at the time Outstanding or to
17 fund any reserve account as required by the terms of any ordinance or resolution authorizing
18 the issuance of such Old Lien Tax Obligations shall be withdrawn from the Gross Receipts
19 Tax Income Fund at the time prescribed in the ordinance or resolution of the City authorizing
20 issuance of such Old Lien Tax Obligations and shall be paid or deposited in accordance with
21 such ordinances and resolutions.

22 Secondly, as a second charge on the Pledged Revenues, the amounts
23 necessary to pay the Debt Service Requirements on New Lien Tax Obligations at the time
24 Outstanding shall be withdrawn from the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund and shall be
25 concurrently credited to the Debt Service Fund (including any account therein established by
26 a Sale Resolution) or any relevant debt service account, with the same priority and, if
27 insufficient to pay all of the enumerated Debt Service Requirements, pro rated in proportion
28 to the amounts of such Debt Service Requirements (monthly, in the case of the Bonds, in
29 accordance with Section 20.(G)):

30 (1) Prior to each interest payment date, that amount necessary to
31 pay or reimburse the next maturing installment of interest of each series of New Lien Tax
32 Obligations then Outstanding.

1 (2) Prior to each principal payment date, that amount necessary to
2 pay the next regularly scheduled installment of principal, whether at maturity or a mandatory
3 sinking fund redemption date, of each series of New Lien Tax Obligations then Outstanding.

4 (3) Prior to their respective due dates, the amounts necessary to
5 pay or reimburse the provider of a Credit Facility for payments of Debt Service Requirements
6 (but not tender price) on New Lien Tax Obligations made by the relevant Credit Source. The
7 tender price of a series of New Lien Tax Obligations and any interest payment owed to any
8 Credit Source which exceeds the amount of interest which would be payable at the maximum
9 bond interest rate on that series, shall not be reimbursed from the Gross Receipts Tax
10 Income Fund with the priority set forth in this Section 19.(A) but shall be reimbursed with the
11 priority set forth in Section 19.(B).

12 (4) The City may pay the Debt Service Requirements on the Bonds
13 and, unless otherwise required under the ordinance or resolution under which they were
14 issued, any other Tax Obligations that are New Lien Tax Obligations from Pledged Revenues
15 as described in Section 19 in such order, in whole or in part, as to the use of Pledged
16 Revenues as the City may from time to time determine in its sole discretion.

17 (B) OTHER NEW LIEN TAX OBLIGATIONS. To the extent not required to
18 be deposited or paid pursuant to Sections 19.(A), Pledged Revenues available in the Gross
19 Receipts Tax Income Fund shall be used, as necessary, to pay (i) payment obligations owed
20 by the City to a Credit Source for New Lien Tax Obligations, including the tender price of and
21 certain interest payments on, New Lien Tax Obligations paid by that Credit Source; and (ii)
22 fees, expenses and interest owed by the City to any other provider of fiscal services for a
23 series of New Lien Tax Obligations. Amounts from the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund to
24 be used to pay interest pursuant to this Section 19.(B) shall be deposited by the City into a
25 separate account maintained by the City on or before the due date thereof.

26 (C) DEBT SERVICE RESERVE REQUIREMENTS. To the extent not
27 required to be deposited or paid pursuant to Sections 19.(A) or 19.(B), Pledged Revenues
28 available in the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund shall be used, as necessary, to pay any
29 debt service reserve account as required by the terms of any ordinance or resolution
30 authorizing the issuance of New Lien Tax Obligations.

31 (D) SUBORDINATE TAX OBLIGATIONS. To the extent not required to be
32 deposited or paid pursuant to Sections 19.(A), 19.(B) or 19.(C), Pledged Tax Revenues

1 available in the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund shall be used, as necessary, to pay Debt
2 Service Requirements on Subordinate Tax Obligations as the same accrue.

3 (E) USE OF SURPLUS PLEDGED REVENUES. To the extent not required
4 in any month to be deposited or paid pursuant to Sections 19.(A), 19.(B), 19.(C) or 19.(D),
5 any moneys remaining in the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund may be transferred from the
6 Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund, and applied as required by the terms of any ordinance or
7 resolution authorizing the issuance of any Old Lien Tax Obligations and, if not so required to
8 be applied, to any other lawful purpose or purposes authorized by applicable law, as
9 determined by the City, subject to any limitations imposed by the Code.

10 SECTION 20. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION OF FUNDS.

11 (A) USE OF AMOUNTS AND TERMINATION OF DEPOSITS IN DEBT
12 SERVICE FUNDS.

13 (1) MONEY IN DEBT SERVICE FUNDS. Except as provided in
14 Section 20.(A)(2), the money credited to the Debt Service Fund including any account therein
15 established by a Sale Resolution shall be used by the City only to pay, or to reimburse a
16 Credit Source for the payment of, the Debt Service Requirements of the applicable series of
17 Bonds. Money on deposit in the Debt Service Fund and any account therein shall be
18 transferred to the Paying Agent on or before each relevant payment date.

19 (2) TERMINATION UPON DEPOSITS TO MATURITY. No
20 payment needs to be made into the Debt Service Fund or to any applicable account therein if
21 no Debt Service Requirements on the Bonds are then past due and the amounts on deposit
22 in the applicable account of the Debt Service Fund for the payment of the applicable series of
23 Bonds are at least equal to all Debt Service Requirements on the applicable series of Bonds
24 prior to their Maturity Dates or mandatory redemption dates, or to any date for which the City
25 has exercised or has obligated itself to exercise its option to redeem the applicable series of
26 Bonds prior to their Maturity Dates or redemption dates, as the case may be. In such event,
27 money in the applicable series of Debt Service Fund shall be used for the payment of the
28 Debt Service Requirements or such optional redemption payments, if applicable, when due,
29 on the applicable series of Bonds. Any money in those accounts in excess of the amounts
30 required by the preceding sentence may be used as provided in Section 19.(E).

31 (B) CREDIT OR DEFICIENCY. In making the determinations of the
32 amounts to be transferred from the Gross Receipts Tax Income Fund as provided in Section
33 19 or this Section 20, the City may take into account any amount then on deposit in any fund

1 relating to the Bonds which is available and required to be used for the designated payment.
2 If any deposit made to a fund for the payment of the Bonds is less than the amount required
3 to be deposited, the City shall pay or credit to that fund from Pledged Revenues in the Gross
4 Receipts Tax Income Fund the first money available to pay that deficiency using the priorities
5 set forth in Section 19 and this Section 20.

6 (C) TRANSFER OF MONEY. Each payment of principal and interest
7 coming due on the Bonds shall be transferred from the applicable fund to the Paying Agent.

8 (D) VARIABLE INTEREST RATE. In making the computations required by
9 Section 19 and this Section 20, interest on Variable Interest Rate Tax Obligations which
10 Cannot be computed exactly shall be computed at the maximum interest rate permitted for
11 those Obligations unless otherwise required by the City ordinance authorizing the issuance
12 of such Obligations.

13 (E) INVESTMENT OF MONEY. Any money in any fund created or
14 Continued in Section 16 shall be invested in Permitted Investments. The investments
15 purchased using money in any such fund shall be deemed at all times to be part of that fund.
16 The interest accruing in the funds and any profit realized therefrom shall be credited to the
17 fund in which the relevant investments are deemed to be held. Any loss resulting from such
18 investment shall be charged to the applicable fund. The City Treasurer shall present for
19 redemption or sale on the prevailing market any obligations purchased as an investment of
20 money in the applicable fund whenever it shall be necessary to do so in order to provide
21 money to meet any payment or transfer from such fund. Neither the City Treasurer nor any
22 other officer of the City shall be liable or responsible for any loss resulting from any such
23 investment made in accordance with the Bond Legislation.

24 (F) DEPOSITS OF FUNDS. The money and investments deposited in the
25 funds created or continued in Section 16 shall be maintained and kept in one or more
26 Insured Banks. Each payment shall be made into and credited to the proper fund at the
27 designated time, except that when the designated time is not a Business Day, then such
28 payment shall be made on the next succeeding Business Day. Nothing herein shall prevent
29 the establishment of one or more such funds in insured banks for all of the accounts
30 designated in Section 16.

31 (G) DEPOSITS OF PLEDGED REVENUES FOR BONDS.

32 (1) The City shall make substantially equal monthly deposits in the
33 applicable account in the Debt Service Fund in order to pay the amount of interest on the

1 applicable series of Bonds which will become due on the Interest Payment Date next
2 following the date of deposit. The monthly deposits required in the preceding sentence shall
3 begin in the calendar month subsequent to the Closing Date for that series of Bonds.

4 (2) Deposits to the applicable account in the Debt Service Fund for
5 the next installment of principal becoming due on the applicable series of Bonds shall be
6 made in substantially equal monthly deposits commencing in the first month which is less
7 than 13 months prior to the month in which that installment of principal is due.

8 (H) VALUATION.. The "value" of Permitted Investments shall be
9 determined at least every six months as follows:

10 (1) if the price of the investment is not set as described in Section
11 20.(H)(4), as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are published on a regular
12 basis in The Wall Street Journal (or, if not there, then in The New York Times): the average
13 of the bid and asked prices for such investments published on or more recently prior to such
14 time of determination;

15 (2) as to investments the bid and asked prices of which are not
16 published on a regular basis in The Wall Street Journal or The New York Times: the average
17 bid price at such time of determination for such investments by any two nationally recognized
18 government securities dealers (selected by the City in its absolute discretion) at the time
19 making a market in such investments or the bid price published by a nationally recognized
20 pricing service;

21 (3) as to certificates of deposit and bankers acceptances: the face
22 amount thereof, plus accrued interest;

23 (4) as to investments in clauses (1), (2), (3) and (9) of the definition
24 of Permitted Investments pursuant to which a financial institution is obligated to purchase the
25 investment from the City at a fixed price through maturity of the investment: the price set
26 forth in such agreement, provided that such institution, or the guarantor of such institution or
27 agreement, shall be rated in one of the top two Rating Categories by S&P, Moody's and Fitch
28 if then rating the Bonds, or by another national rating agency; and

29 (5) as to any investment not specified above: the cost of the
30 Permitted Investments (including any amount paid as accrued interest) or the principal
31 amount thereof, whichever is less; except that Permitted Investments purchased at a
32 premium may initially be valued at the cost thereof, but in each year after such purchase

1 shall be valued at a lesser amount determined by ratably amortizing the premium over the
2 remaining term.

3 No loss or profit on Permitted Investments shall be deemed to take place as a result
4 of fluctuations in the market quotations prior to the sale or maturity thereof.

5 (I) Deposits for the payment of principal of and interest on other New Lien
6 Tax Obligations required by Section 19.(B) may be made more or less frequently than
7 monthly.

8 SECTION 21. LIEN ON PLEDGED REVENUES; PROCEEDS; ETC.

9 (A) BONDS. Payments of Debt Service Requirements on the Bonds are
10 secured by an irrevocable lien on and the City grants and confirms to the owners of the
11 Bonds a security interest in the Pledged Revenues for the payment of the principal or
12 premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued as New Lien Tax
13 Obligations.

14 The City pledges and grants a security interest in and lien (but not an
15 exclusive lien) on the money and Permitted Investments on deposit in the applicable account
16 in the Debt Service Fund, the applicable account in the Acquisition Fund and any other fund
17 (other than any Rebate Fund) held pursuant to the Bond Legislation for the corresponding
18 series of Bonds for the payment of such Bonds.

19 (B) OTHER RELATED DOCUMENTS. Payments under any other Related
20 Documents shall be secured by an irrevocable lien on, and the City grants to the parties
21 entitled to payments under those Related Documents, a security interest in, the Pledged
22 Revenues for those payments.

23 (C) REBATE PAYMENTS. Any investment income which is required to be
24 rebated to the United States pursuant to Section 148(f) of the Code is not subject to the
25 pledge and security interest provided in this Section 21.

26 SECTION 22. EQUALITY OF BONDS. Except as specifically stated in the Bond
27 Legislation, each series of the Bonds from time to time Outstanding shall not be entitled to
28 any priority one over the other in the application of the Pledged Revenues, regardless of the
29 time or times of their issuance, it being the intention of the Council that there shall be no
30 priority among the series of the Bonds, regardless of the fact that they may be actually
31 issued and delivered at different times.

32 SECTION 23. ADDITIONAL BONDS OR OTHER OBLIGATIONS PAYABLE FROM
33 PLEDGED REVENUES.

1 (A) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF NEW LIEN TAX OBLIGATIONS.

2 No provision of the Bond Legislation shall be construed to prevent the issuance by the City of
3 additional New Lien Tax Obligations, nor to prevent the issuance of bonds or other
4 obligations refunding all or a part of any New Lien Tax Obligations. However, before any
5 additional New Lien Tax Obligations are issued:

6 (1) The City shall then be current in the accumulations required to
7 be made pursuant to any ordinance or resolution authorizing the issuance of any Old Lien
8 Tax Obligations and New Lien Tax Obligations; and

9 (2) With respect to additional New Lien Tax Obligations:

10 (a) The Pledged Revenues received by the City for either –
11 (i) the Fiscal Year or (ii) any twelve consecutive months out of the eighteen calendar months
12 immediately preceding the date of the issuance of such additional New Lien Tax Obligations
13 – shall have been sufficient to pay an amount representing two hundred and twenty-five
14 percent (225%) of the combined maximum annual principal and interest payments (excluding
15 any reserves therefor) coming due in any subsequent Fiscal Year on: (i) the then
16 Outstanding Old Lien Tax Obligations, (ii) the then Outstanding New Lien Tax Obligations,
17 and (iii) the New Lien Tax Obligations proposed to be issued.

18 (b) A written certificate or opinion by an Independent
19 Accountant that such annual Pledged Revenues are sufficient to pay the amounts required
20 by paragraph (a) above shall be conclusively presumed to be accurate in determining the
21 right of the City to authorize, issue, sell and deliver the proposed additional New Lien Tax
22 Obligations.

23 (c) In making the computations required by this Section
24 23.(A)(2) and Section 24.(B), that part of the interest rate on Variable Rate Obligations which
25 cannot be computed exactly shall be computed at the maximum interest rate then permitted
26 on such obligations by the City ordinance authorizing the issuance of such obligations.

27 (B) SUBORDINATE TAX OBLIGATIONS PERMITTED. No provision of the
28 Bond Legislation shall be construed to prevent the issuance by the City of Subordinate Tax
29 Obligations.

30 (C) SUPERIOR TAX OBLIGATIONS PROHIBITED. No provision of the
31 Bond Legislation shall be construed to permit the City to issue, and the City shall not issue,
32 obligations payable from the Pledged Revenues having a lien thereon prior and superior to
33 the New Lien Tax Obligations.

1 SECTION 24. REFUNDING BONDS PAYABLE FROM PLEDGED REVENUES.

2 The provisions of Section 23 are subject to the following exceptions:

3 (A) PRIVILEGE OF ISSUING REFUNDING TAX OBLIGATIONS.

4 Outstanding Tax Obligations may be refunded, regardless of whether the priority of the lien
5 for the payment of the refunding obligations on the Pledged Revenues is different than the
6 lien of the refunded Tax Obligations on Pledged Revenues, except as provided in Section
7 23.(C) and in Sections 24.(B), 24.(C) and 24.(D).

8 (B) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING TAX

9 OBLIGATIONS. No Refunding Tax Obligations shall be issued as New Lien Tax Obligations
10 unless:

11 (1) The Tax Obligations refunded are Old Lien Tax Obligations or
12 New Lien Tax Obligations and the issuance of the refunding Tax Obligations does not
13 increase the maximum annual Debt Service Requirements of the refunded Tax Obligations
14 and all other Outstanding New Lien Tax Obligations on the refunding date; or

15 (2) The refunding New Lien Tax Obligations are issued in
16 compliance with Section 23.(A).

17 (C) REFUNDING PART OF A SERIES. While any series of Bonds are

18 Outstanding, except as set forth in subparagraph (3) below, the refunding Tax Obligations
19 shall enjoy complete equality of lien on the Pledged Revenues with the portion of any Tax
20 Obligations of the same series which is not refunded and the Owners of the refunding Tax
21 Obligations shall be subrogated to all of the rights and privileges enjoyed by the Owners of
22 the refunded Tax Obligations.

23 A part of a series of Outstanding Tax Obligations may be refunded only with
24 the consent of the Owners of the unrefunded portion of that series unless:

25 (1) The issuance of the refunding Tax Obligations does not
26 increase the maximum annual Debt Service Requirements evidenced by the refunded Tax
27 Obligations and by the Outstanding Tax Obligations of such series not refunded on the
28 refunding date; or

29 (2) The refunding New Lien Tax Obligations are issued in
30 compliance with Section 23.(A); or

31 (3) The lien on the Pledged Revenues for the payment of the
32 refunding Tax Obligations is subordinate to the lien thereon for the payment of the
33 unrefunded portion of the series.

1 (D) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING TAX
2 OBLIGATIONS. Any refunding Tax Obligations shall be issued with such details as the City
3 may provide by ordinance and resolution, but without any impairment of any contractual
4 obligations imposed upon the City by any proceedings authorizing the issuance of any
5 Outstanding Obligations.

6 SECTION 25. PROTECTIVE COVENANTS. The City covenants and agrees, so
7 long as any series of Bonds remain Outstanding:

8 (A) USE OF PROCEEDS OF TAX OBLIGATIONS. The City shall proceed
9 without delay to apply the proceeds of each series of Tax Obligations to the purposes for
10 which they are issued.

11 (B) PAYMENT OF TAX OBLIGATIONS. The City shall promptly pay Debt
12 Service Requirements on each series of Tax Obligations at the place, on the date and in the
13 manner specified in the City ordinances and resolutions and the documents relating to those
14 Tax Obligations.

15 (C) CITY'S EXISTENCE. The City shall maintain its corporate identity and
16 existence unless another political subdivision by operation of law succeeds to the liabilities
17 and rights of the City under the Bond Legislation, without adversely affecting to any
18 substantial degree the privileges and rights of any Owner.

19 (D) PROHIBITION OF ANY EXTENSION OF INTEREST PAYMENTS. In
20 order to prevent any accumulation of claims for interest after maturity, the City shall not
21 directly or indirectly extend or assent to the extension of time for the payment of any claim for
22 interest on any Bonds. If the time for payment of any interest is extended, such payment
23 shall not be made by the City, in case of default under the Bond Legislation, until the prior
24 payment in full of the Debt Service Requirements on all Bonds on which the payment of
25 interest has not been extended.

26 (E) RECORDS. The City shall keep proper books of record and account,
27 separate and apart from all other records and accounts, showing complete and correct
28 entries of all transactions relating to the Pledged Revenues.

29 (F) AUDITS. The City shall, within 270 days following the close of each
30 Fiscal Year, cause an audit of its books and accounts relating to the Pledged Revenues to be
31 completed by an Independent Accountant showing the receipts and disbursements in
32 connection with the Pledged Revenues.

1 (G) DUTY TO IMPOSE TAX. If State law or the City Charter or any City
2 ordinance or part thereof, which affects the Pledged Revenues, shall ever be held to be
3 invalid or unenforceable, the City shall immediately take any action which is legally available
4 to the City necessary to produce sufficient Pledged Revenues to comply with the obligations
5 of the City under the Bond Legislation.

6 (H) IMPAIRMENT OF CONTRACT. In accordance with Section 3-31-6(C)
7 NMSA 1978, no law, ordinance or resolution of the City which affects the Pledged Revenues
8 or the Bonds shall be repealed or otherwise directly or indirectly modified in such a manner
9 as to impair adversely Outstanding Bonds or obligations of the City under the Bond
10 Legislation or any Related Documents, unless the Bonds or obligations have been
11 discharged in full or provision has been fully made therefor.

12 SECTION 26. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES OF THE CITY. The City
13 represents and warrants that:

14 (A) HOME RULE POWER; EXISTENCE. The City has Home Rule Powers
15 and has been validly created and is operating under the laws of the State and the City's
16 Charter.

17 (B) AUTHORITY. The City has all requisite power and authority under the
18 laws of the State and the Home Rule Powers to enter into, execute and deliver the Related
19 Documents, to issue and sell the Bonds and to perform its covenants contained in the Bond
20 Legislation.

21 (C) EXECUTION AUTHORIZED. The execution and delivery of the Related
22 Documents and use of the disclosure documents for the Bonds and the issuance and sale of
23 the Bonds shall be duly authorized by the Council and, no further authorization or approval of
24 such execution, use, delivery, issuance or sale is required by law.

25 (D) ENFORCEABILITY OF BONDS. The Bonds, when issued, delivered
26 and paid for, shall constitute valid and binding special, limited obligations of the City
27 enforceable in accordance with their terms and entitled to the benefits and security of the
28 Bond Legislation, subject to the limitations contained in the Bond Legislation and subject to
29 any applicable bankruptcy, reorganization, insolvency, moratorium or other laws affecting the
30 enforcement of creditors' rights generally and the enforceability of indemnification provisions
31 and except to the extent that the enforceability thereof may be limited by the availability of
32 equitable remedies.

1 (E) ENFORCEABILITY OF RELATED DOCUMENTS. The Related
2 Documents, when executed and delivered by the City shall constitute valid and binding
3 special limited obligations of the City enforceable in accordance with their terms, subject to
4 any applicable bankruptcy, insolvency, moratorium or other laws affecting the enforcement of
5 creditors' rights generally and the enforceability of indemnification provisions except to the
6 extent that the enforceability thereof may be limited by the availability of equitable remedies.

7 (F) NO CONFLICT. The execution and delivery of the Related Documents,
8 Bonds and the other agreements contemplated by the Bond Legislation and compliance with
9 the provisions thereof, shall not conflict with nor constitute on the part of the City a breach of
10 or a default under any existing law, court or administrative regulation, decree, order or, to the
11 knowledge of the City, any agreement, indenture, mortgage or lease to which the City is a
12 party or by which it is or may be bound.

13 (G) OTHER LIENS. Other than as described and identified by the Bond
14 Legislation, there are no liens or encumbrances of any nature on or against the Pledged
15 Revenues on the date of adoption of the Bond Legislation.

16 SECTION 27. TAX COMPLIANCE. The City covenants that it shall use, and shall
17 restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of any series of Bonds intended by the City
18 to be issued as bonds the interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal
19 income tax purposes in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) any
20 series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the interest on which will not be
21 included as gross income for federal income tax purposes shall not (i) constitute private
22 activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Sections 141, 148 or 149 of the Code,
23 or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103(a) of the Code applies, and (b) the
24 interest thereon shall not be treated as a preference item under Section 57 of the Code. The
25 City further covenants (a) that it shall take or cause to be taken such actions that may be
26 required of it for the interest on any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as
27 bonds the interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal income tax
28 purposes to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes,
29 (b) that it shall not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that
30 exclusion, and (c) that it, or persons acting for it, shall, among other acts of compliance, (i)
31 apply the proceeds of any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the
32 interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal income tax purposes to the
33 governmental purposes of the borrowings, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii)

1 make timely and adequate rebate payments or payments of alternative amounts in lieu of
2 rebate to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and
3 reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property
4 financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such
5 exclusion of that interest under the Code.

6 Authorized Officers are authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection,
7 designation, choice, consent, approval, or waiver on behalf of the City with respect to any
8 series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the interest on which will not be
9 included as gross income for federal income tax purposes as the City is permitted or required
10 to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of
11 the elections available under Section 148 of the Code for the purpose of assuring, enhancing
12 or protecting favorable tax treatment or status of any series of Bonds intended by the City to
13 be issued as bonds the interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal
14 income tax purposes or interest thereon or assisting in the compliance with requirements for
15 that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate
16 amount or payments of penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making
17 computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those
18 amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and
19 signed by the officer, (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make
20 payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the
21 City, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the
22 intended tax status of any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the
23 interest on which will not be included as gross in come for federal income tax purposes, and
24 (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the City, for inclusion in the transcripts of
25 the proceedings for any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the
26 interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal income tax purposes,
27 setting forth the reasonable expectations of the City regarding the amount and use of all the
28 proceeds of any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued as bonds the interest on
29 which will not be included as gross income for federal income tax purposes, the facts,
30 circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances
31 relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of any series of Bonds
32 intended by the City to be issued as bonds the interest on which will not be included as gross
33 income for federal income tax purposes.

1 SECTION 28. EVENTS OF DEFAULT. Each of the following events is an "Event of
2 Default":

3 (A) NONPAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL. As to any series of Bonds, failure to
4 pay the principal of that series of Bonds when the same becomes due and payable, either at
5 maturity, or by proceedings for prior redemption, or otherwise.

6 (B) NONPAYMENT OF INTEREST. As to any series of Bonds, failure to
7 pay any installment of interest on that series of Bonds on the due date thereof.

8 (C) INCAPABLE TO PERFORM. The City shall for any reason be rendered
9 incapable of performing its obligations under the Bond Ordinance or the Sale Resolution.

10 (D) DEFAULT OF ANY OTHER PROVISION. Default by the City in the due
11 and punctual performance of its covenants or conditions, agreements and provisions
12 contained in any series of Bonds or in the Bond Ordinance or the applicable Sale Resolution
13 on its part to be performed, and the continuance of such default (other than a default set forth
14 in Sections 28.(A), 28.(B) or 28.(C)) for 60 days after written notice specifying such default
15 and requiring the same to be remedied has been given to the City by the Owners of 25% in
16 aggregate principal amount of that series of Bonds then Outstanding.

17 SECTION 29. REMEDIES UPON DEFAULT.

18 (A) REMEDIES UPON DEFAULT. Upon the happening and during the
19 continuance of any Event of Default relating to a series of Bonds: the Owners of not less than
20 25% in aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding affected by the Event of
21 Default, including but not limited to a trustee or trustees therefor may proceed against the
22 City to:

23 (1) protect and enforce the rights of the Owners by mandamus or
24 other suit, action or special proceedings in equity or at law, in any court of competent
25 jurisdiction, either for the appointment of a receiver or for the specific performance of any
26 covenant or agreement contained in the Bond Legislation or for the enforcement of any
27 proper legal or equitable remedy as those Owners may deem necessary or desirable to
28 protect and enforce their respective rights;

29 (2) enjoin any act or thing which may be unlawful or in violation of
30 any right of any Owner;

31 (3) require the Council to act as if it were the trustee of an express
32 trust; and

33 (4) any combination of those remedies.

1 All proceedings shall be instituted and maintained for the equal benefit of all
2 Owners of the Bonds then Outstanding. The failure of an Owner to exercise any right
3 granted by this Section 29 shall not relieve the City of any obligation to perform any duty.
4 Each right or privilege of any such Owner (or trustee or receiver therefor) is in addition and
5 cumulative to any other right or privilege and the exercise of any right or privilege by or on
6 behalf of any Owner shall not be deemed a waiver of any other right or privilege of such
7 Owner.

8 (B) GENERAL. No remedy in the Bond Legislation is intended to be
9 exclusive of any other remedy or remedies, and each and every such remedy shall be
10 cumulative, and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under the Bond Legislation
11 or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute.

12 All rights, remedies and powers provided by the Bond Legislation may be
13 exercised only to the extent that the exercise thereof does not violate any applicable
14 provision of law and all the provisions relating to an Event of Default or the exercise of
15 remedies upon the occurrence of an Event of Default are intended to be subject to all
16 applicable provisions of law which may be controlling and to be limited to the extent
17 necessary so that they shall not render the Bond Legislation invalid or unenforceable under
18 the provisions of any applicable law.

19 SECTION 30. APPLICATION OF MONEY. All money received with respect to any
20 right given or action taken under the provisions of the Bond Legislation after the occurrence,
21 and during the continuance, of an Event of Default with respect to the Bonds, except as
22 otherwise specified in the Bond Legislation, after payment of the costs, fees and expenses of
23 the proceedings resulting in the collection of such money, shall be deposited in the
24 applicable account of the Debt Service Fund and applied to the payment of the applicable
25 series of the Bonds in accordance with the terms and provisions of Section 19.

26 Whenever money is to be applied pursuant to the provisions of this Section 30, it shall
27 be applied at such times, and from time to time, as the Paying Agent determines, having due
28 regard to the amount of money available for application and the likelihood of additional
29 money becoming available in the future. Whenever the Paying Agent determines to apply
30 such money, the Paying Agent shall fix a Special Record Date and the date (which shall be
31 an Interest Payment Date unless the Paying Agent deems another date more suitable) upon
32 which payment is to be made and on such date interest on the amounts of principal to be
33 paid on such dates shall cease to accrue. The Paying Agent shall give notice to the Owners

1 of the deposit of any such money and of the fixing of any such date, and shall not be required
2 to make payment of principal to the Owner of any Bonds until presented to the Paying Agent
3 for appropriate endorsement or for cancellation if fully paid.

4 SECTION 31. DUTIES UPON DEFAULT; RIGHTS CONFERRED. Upon the
5 happening and during the continuance of any Event of Default, the City will do and perform
6 all proper acts on behalf and for the Owners to protect and preserve the security created for
7 the payment of the Bonds and any Payment Obligations and to insure the payment of the
8 Debt Service Requirements promptly as the same become due. The Owners of not less than
9 25% in aggregate principal amount of Outstanding series of Bonds, after written demand,
10 may proceed to protect and enforce the rights provided by this Section 31.

11 SECTION 32. DEFEASANCE. If, when a series of Bonds become due and payable
12 in accordance with their terms or otherwise as provided in the Bond Legislation and the
13 entire amount of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest due and payable on all of that
14 series of Bonds is paid or if provisions are made for the payment thereof when due and
15 payable, and all other sums payable under the Bond Legislation are paid, then all covenants,
16 agreements and other obligations of the City to the Owners shall cease, terminate and
17 become void and be discharged and satisfied. However, the covenants of the Bond
18 Legislation relating to the rebate requirements of Section 148(f) of the Code shall survive
19 until all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

20 (1) When all principal, interest and prior redemption premium, if
21 any, in connection with any Bond has been duly paid or provided for, the pledge and lien of
22 the Bond Legislation, and all obligations hereunder (except as provided in Section 33), shall
23 be discharged with respect to that Bond and that Bond shall no longer be deemed to be
24 Outstanding within the meaning of the Bond Legislation. There shall be deemed to be such
25 due payment or to be adequate provisions for the prompt and complete payment of a Bond
26 when the City has placed in escrow and in trust with a commercial bank or trust company
27 located within or without the State and exercising trust powers, an amount sufficient
28 (including the known minimum yield from Defeasance Obligations in which such amount may
29 be initially invested) to meet all requirements of principal, interest and prior redemption
30 premium, if any, on that Bond as the same become due to its final maturity or upon the
31 designated prior redemption date. The Defeasance Obligations shall become due prior to
32 the respective times at which the proceeds thereof shall be needed, in accordance with a
33 schedule established and agreed upon between the City and such bank or trust company (at

1 the time of the creation of the escrow, or the Defeasance Obligations shall be subject to
2 redemption at the option of the owners thereof to assure such availability as so needed to
3 meet such schedule.

4 (2) If any Bonds are deemed to be paid and discharged pursuant
5 to this Section 32, within 15 days after the date of defeasance, the City shall irrevocably
6 direct the Fiscal Agent to give written notice to each Owner of Bonds deemed paid and
7 discharged at the address shown on the Bond Register on the date on which those Bonds
8 are deemed paid and discharged. The notice shall state, to the extent applicable, the same
9 information required by Section 6.(D) for the redemption of Bonds and shall describe the
10 Defeasance Obligations.

11 SECTION 33. SURVIVAL OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS. Notwithstanding the
12 foregoing, with respect to Bonds deemed paid pursuant to Section 32, any provisions of the
13 Bond Legislation which relate to indemnification and the payment of fees and expenses, the
14 payment of the principal of and premium on Bonds at maturity or on a prior redemption date,
15 interest payments and dates thereof, exchange, registration of transfer and registration of
16 Bonds, replacement of mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bonds, the safekeeping and
17 cancellation of Bonds, non-presentment of Bonds, the holding of money in trust and
18 payments to the Fiscal Agent in connection with all of the foregoing, and the applicable
19 requirements of the Code pertaining to any series of Bonds intended by the City to be issued
20 as bonds the interest on which will not be included as gross income for federal income tax
21 purposes, including the payment of excess earnings to the federal government, shall remain
22 in effect and be binding upon the Owners of Bonds and the Fiscal Agent for those Bonds,
23 notwithstanding the release and discharge of the Bond Legislation. The provisions of this
24 Section 33 shall survive the release, discharge and satisfaction of the Bond Legislation.

25 SECTION 34. NOTICES. Except as otherwise specifically required in the Bond
26 Legislation, notice with respect to the Bonds shall be effective when received and it shall be
27 sufficient service of any notice, request, demand or other paper if the same is given: (i) orally,
28 or (ii) by certified or registered mail, or (iii) by Electronic Means, or (iv) hand delivered;
29 provided that any notice given orally, including notice by telephone, must be confirmed by
30 notice in writing as set forth in clause (ii), (iii) (except by telephone) or (iv) above initiated
31 within one Business Day after oral notice is given. Notice shall be given as follows:

21 Any such party may, by notice as set forth above to the other parties,
22 designate any further or different address to which subsequent notices, certificates or other
23 communication shall be sent.

24 When the Bond Legislation provides for notice to the Owners of Bonds of any
25 event, such notice shall be sufficiently given (unless otherwise expressly provided in the
26 Bond Legislation) if in writing and given in accordance with this Section 34 to each Owner of
27 Bonds affected by such event, at his address as it appears on the register for the Bonds. In
28 any case where notice to an Owner of Bonds is given by mail, neither the failure to mail such
29 notice nor any defect in any notice mailed to any particular Owner of Bonds shall affect the
30 sufficiency of such notice with respect to any other Owner, and any notice which is mailed in
31 the manner provided in this paragraph shall conclusively be presumed to have been duly
32 given.

1 Where the Bond Legislation provides for notice upon the occurrence of any event,
2 that notice may be waived by the person entitled to receive that notice, either before or after
3 the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of notice.

4 The Fiscal Agent shall provide S&P, if the Bonds are then rated by S&P, Moody's, if
5 the Bonds are then rated by Moody's, and Fitch, if the Bonds are then rated by Fitch, with
6 prior written notice of any amendments to the Bond Legislation and the redemption of Bonds
7 pursuant to Sections 6.(A) or 6.(B) or paid pursuant to Section 32. Such notice shall be sent
8 (a) to Moody's at: Moody's Investors Service, 7 World Trade Center, 250 Greenwich Street,
9 New York, New York 10007, (b) to S&P at: Standard & Poor's Corporation, Attention:
10 Municipal Finance Department 55 Water Street, New York, New York 10041, and (c) to Fitch
11 at: Fitch Ratings, Inc., One State Street Plaza, New York, New York 10004.

12 SECTION 35. RESERVED.

13 SECTION 36. AMENDMENT OF BOND LEGISLATION.

14 (A) LIMITATIONS UPON AMENDMENTS. Prior to any Bonds being issued,
15 the Bond Legislation may be amended by ordinance or resolution of the Council without the
16 consent of Owners. After Bonds have been issued, the Bond Legislation may be amended
17 by ordinance or resolution of the Council without the consent of Owners:

18 (1) To cure any ambiguity, or to cure, correct or supplement any
19 defect or inconsistent provision contained in the Bond Legislation;

20 (2) To grant to the Owners any additional rights, remedies, powers
21 or authority that may lawfully be granted to them;

22 (3) To obtain or maintain a rating or shadow rating on any Bonds
23 from any rating agency which amendment, in the judgment of Bond Counsel, does not
24 materially adversely affect the Owners;

25 (4) To achieve compliance with federal securities or tax laws;

26 (5) To make any other changes in the Bond Legislation which, in
27 the opinion of Bond Counsel, is not materially adverse to the Owners; and

28 (6) To make changes in procedural matters relating to any Bond
29 Insurance Policy.

30 (B) ADDITIONAL AMENDMENTS. Except as provided above, the Bond
31 Legislation may only be amended or supplemented by ordinance adopted by the Council
32 without receipt by the City of any additional consideration, but with the written consent of the
33 Owners of a majority of the principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds which are affected by

1 the amendment or supplement (not including Bonds which are then owned by or for the
2 account of the City). However, no such ordinance shall have the effect of permitting:

3 (1) An extension of the maturity of any Bonds; or

4 (2) A reduction in the principal amount of, premium, if any, or
5 interest rate on any Bonds; or

6 (3) The creation or continuance of a lien on or a pledge of the
7 Pledged Revenues ranking prior to the lien or pledge of New Lien Tax Obligations on the
8 Pledged Revenues; or

9 (4) A reduction of the principal amount of Series 1999C Bonds or
10 Bonds required for consent to such amendment or supplement.

11 (C) NOTICE OF AMENDMENT. Notice of a proposed amendment requiring
12 the consent of the Owners shall be mailed to the Owners of the Bonds then Outstanding
13 affected by the amendment at their addresses as the same last appear in the registration
14 books kept by the Registrar. Such notice shall briefly set forth the nature of the proposed
15 amendment and shall state that copies of the instrument pertaining to such amendment are
16 on file at the principal corporate office of the Registrar for inspection by all Owners. If, within
17 60 days or such longer period as shall be prescribed by the City following the giving of such
18 notice, the requisite percentage of Owners affected by the amendment have consented to
19 and approved the amendment, the amendment shall become effective and no Owner shall
20 have any right to object to such amendment, or the operation thereof.

21 SECTION 37. MANNER OF EVIDENCING OWNERSHIP OF BONDS. Any
22 request, direction, consent or other instrument provided or required by the Bond Legislation
23 to be signed and executed by the Owners may be in any number of concurrent writings of
24 similar tenor and may be signed or executed by Owners in person or by an agent appointed
25 in writing. Proof of the execution of any such request, direction or other instrument or of the
26 writing appointing any such agent and of the ownership of the applicable Bonds, if made in
27 the following manner, shall be sufficient for any of the purposes of the Bond Legislation and
28 shall be conclusive in favor of the Fiscal Agent and the City with regard to any action taken
29 by them, or either of them, under such request or other instrument, namely:

30 (A) The fact and date of the execution by any person of any such writing
31 may be proved by the certificate of any officer in any jurisdiction who by law has power to
32 take acknowledgments in such jurisdiction that the person signing such writing

1 acknowledged before him the execution thereof or by the affidavit of a witness of such
2 execution; and

3 (B) The ownership of the Bonds shall be proved by the Bond Register.

4 Any action taken or suffered by the Fiscal Agent pursuant to any provision of the
5 Bond Legislation, upon the request or with the assent of any person who at the time is the
6 Owner of any Bonds, shall be conclusive and binding upon all future Owners of the same
7 Bonds.

8 SECTION 38. APPLICABLE LAW. The Bond Legislation shall be governed by the
9 laws of the State without reference to choice of law principles thereof.

10 SECTION 39. PAYMENTS AND PERFORMANCE ON BUSINESS DAYS. Except
11 as otherwise required in the Bond Legislation: (i) any covenant required to be performed on
12 any date which is not a Business Day may be performed on the first Business Day thereafter
13 and (ii) if the date for any payment on the Bonds at a place of payment shall be other than a
14 Business Day, then payment shall be made on the next succeeding Business Day, and no
15 interest shall accrue for the intervening period other than as specifically provided for in the
16 Bond Legislation.

17 SECTION 40. LIMITATION OF RIGHTS. With the exception of rights in the Bond
18 Legislation expressly conferred, nothing in the Bond Legislation or the Bonds, expressed or
19 implied, is intended or shall be construed to give to any Person other than the Owners, the
20 Fiscal Agent, the City and the parties to which such right, remedy or claim is expressly
21 granted by the Bond Legislation or the Bonds, any legal or equitable right, remedy or claim
22 under or in respect to the Bond Legislation, the Bonds or any covenant, condition or
23 stipulation of the Bond Legislation, the Bonds, and all covenants, stipulations, promises and
24 agreements in the Bond Legislation, and the Bonds shall be for the sole and exclusive
25 benefit of the Owners, each Insurer, the City and the parties to which such right, remedy or
26 claim is expressly granted.

27 SECTION 41. DELEGATED POWERS. The officers of the City are authorized and
28 directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of the Bond
29 Legislation, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the publication of the
30 summary substantially in the form set out in Section 49, the printing of the Bonds, and the
31 execution of such documents as are not inconsistent with the terms of the Bond Legislation
32 including, without limitation, certificates as may be required by the Investment Bankers, if

1 any, including, but not limited to the absence and existence of factors affecting the exemption
2 of interest on the Bonds from federal income taxation.

3 The Director of the Department of Finance and Administrative Services of the City, or
4 his successor in interest or title, is authorized and directed to make such changes or
5 corrections to the procedures established in the Bond Legislation relating to the times of day
6 or the days on which actions are required to be taken, or the persons responsible for
7 particular actions, the form of notice of the occurrence of events, the types and forms of
8 actions required and other similar administrative matters which, in his judgment, are
9 necessary and appropriate to accomplish the purposes of the Bond Legislation. The Director
10 of the Department of Finance and Administrative Services, or his successor in interest or
11 title, shall give notice of any such changes or corrections to all persons affected thereby, to
12 Bond Counsel for the City and shall file with the City Clerk a certificate of such changes and
13 corrections.

14 SECTION 42. IMMUNITY OF MAYOR, COUNCIL MEMBERS, COMMISSIONERS,
15 OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF CITY. No recourse shall be had for the enforcement of
16 any obligation, promise or agreement of the City contained in the Bond Legislation or in any
17 Bonds for any claim based thereon or otherwise in respect thereof, against any Mayor,
18 Council member, officer or employee, as such, in his individual capacity, past, present or
19 future, of the City or of any successor to the City, whether by virtue of any constitutional
20 provision, statute or rule of law, or by the enforcement of any assignment or penalty or
21 otherwise. It is expressly agreed and understood that no personal liability shall attach to, or
22 be incurred by, any Mayor, Council member, officer or employee, as such, past, present or
23 future, of the City or of any successor to the City, either directly or through the City or any
24 successor to the City. All personal liability against every such Mayor, Council member,
25 officer and employee is, as a condition of, and as part of the consideration for, the adoption
26 of the Bond Legislation, expressly waived and released.

27 SECTION 43. LIMITATION OF ACTION. After the passage of 35 days from the
28 publication required by Section 49, any action attacking the validity of any proceedings had
29 or taken by the City preliminary to and in the authorization and issuance of the Bonds shall
30 be perpetually barred.

31 SECTION 44. RESERVED.

32 SECTION 45. BOND LEGISLATION IRREPEALABLE AS TO BONDS. After any
33 series of the Bonds are issued, the Bond Legislation shall be and remain irrepealable until all

1 series of the Bonds and the interest thereon shall be fully paid, canceled and discharged, as
2 provided in the Bond Legislation, or there has been defeasance as provided in the Bond
3 Legislation.

4 SECTION 46. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of the Bond Legislation
5 shall be held or deemed to be or shall, in fact, be inoperative or unenforceable as applied in
6 any particular case in any jurisdiction because it conflicts with any other provision or
7 provisions of any constitution or statute or rule of public policy, or for any other reason, such
8 circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the provision in question inoperative or
9 unenforceable in any other case or circumstance, or of rendering any other provision or
10 provisions in the Bond Legislation invalid, inoperative, or unenforceable to any extent
11 whatever.

12 The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or sections in the Bond
13 Legislation, shall not affect the remaining portions of the Bond Legislation, or any part
14 thereof.

15 SECTION 47. REPEALER CLAUSE. Any bylaws, orders, resolutions and
16 ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the Bond Legislation are repealed to the extent
17 only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any bylaw, order,
18 resolution or ordinance, or part thereof, heretofore repealed.

19 SECTION 48. EFFECTIVENESS OF ORDINANCE. The Ordinance shall not be
20 deemed effective until approved by the voters of the City at an election to be held on October
21 4, 2011.

22 SECTION 49. GENERAL SUMMARY FOR PUBLICATION. The title and a general
23 summary of the subject matter contained in the Bond Legislation shall be published in
24 substantially the following form:

33 The title of the Ordinance is:

1 **AUTHORIZING, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF**
2 **ALBUQUERQUE AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD OCTOBER 4, 2011, THE ISSUE AND**
3 **SALE OF A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$50,000,000 CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE,**
4 **NEW MEXICO GROSS RECEIPTS TAX IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS, TO BE**
5 **ISSUED IN ONE OR MORE SERIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING,**
6 **PURCHASING, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING, REHABILITATING, MAKING ADDITIONS TO**
7 **OR MAKING IMPROVEMENTS TO ONE OR MORE PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PUBLIC**
8 **FACILITIES OR PURCHASING OR IMPROVING ANY GROUND RELATING THERETO;**
9 **PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS FROM GROSS RECEIPTS TAX**
10 **REVENUES; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN TERMS OR THE METHOD OF DETERMINING**

15 **AND SALE OF THE BONDS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

16 The following is a general summary of the subject matter contained in the Ordinance:

17 Preambles recite and include such matters as the operation of the City of
18 Albuquerque, New Mexico (the "City") as a home rule municipality; the authority for the
19 issuance of its Gross Receipts Tax Improvement Revenue Bonds (the "Bonds") to be issued
20 in one or more series, payable from gross receipts tax revenues for the purpose of
21 constructing, purchasing, furnishing, equipping, rehabilitating, making additions to or making
22 improvements to one or more public buildings and public facilities or purchasing or improving
23 any ground relating thereto, (the "Projects"); and the determination of the Council that it is in
24 the best interest of the City to finance the Projects and effect the Projects.

25 Sections 1 through 3 define the terms used in the ordinance; ratify and confirm all
26 previous actions taken by the City relating to the Bonds; and declare the general findings of
27 the City Council relating to the Bonds and the Projects.

28 Sections 4 and 5 approve the use of one or more series of Bonds in the maximum
29 principal amount of not to exceed \$50,000,000 to finance the Projects; and provide that
30 details of the Bonds will be provided in one or more Sale Resolutions, that the Bonds shall be
31 issued as fully registered bonds in book-entry form and dated the date of delivery to the
32 purchasers, the net effective interest rate on the Bonds does not exceed 12% per annum, the
33 interest and principal payment dates for the Bonds, and the method of paying the Bonds.

1 Sections 6 through 10 provide for optional, mandatory sinking fund and extraordinary
2 redemption of the Bonds under terms to be set forth in one or more Sale Resolutions;
3 authorize the purchase of municipal bond insurance policies for the Bonds under terms which
4 may be amended or supplemented as set forth in one or more Sale Resolutions; provide for
5 the ownership, registration, exchange and transfer of the Bonds; provide that the Bonds shall
6 be fully negotiable; and provide that the Bonds shall be special limited obligations of the City
7 payable and collectible solely from gross receipts tax revenues, proceeds of the Bonds, and
8 amounts on deposit in certain funds and accounts and that the Bonds shall not be general
9 obligations of the City.

10 Sections 11 through 15 provide details concerning the execution and authentication
11 of the Bonds; provide for the appointment of a fiscal agent, paying agent, authenticating
12 agent and registrar under the terms to be set forth in the appropriate Sale Resolution;
13 provide for a successor registrar or paying agent; provide that forms of Bonds will be set forth
14 in the appropriate Sale Resolution; and provide for the sale of the Bonds to the purchasers.

15 Sections 16 through 20 provide for the establishment of various funds relating to the
16 Bonds; provide that the disposition of the proceeds of the Bonds and certain other funds will
17 be set forth in the appropriate Sale Resolution; provide for the approval of certain documents
18 relating to the Bonds; provide for the application of gross receipts tax revenues to the
19 payment of the Bonds and other bonds and obligations payable from gross receipts tax
20 revenues; and provide details relating to the investment of Bond proceeds and gross receipts
21 tax revenues.

22 Sections 21 through 24 provide that the Bonds are secured by an irrevocable lien
23 upon the gross receipts tax revenues; provide for equality among Bonds; and permit the
24 issuance of additional bonds, refunding bonds and other obligations payable from gross
25 receipts tax revenues under certain conditions.

26 Sections 25 through 31 provide protective covenants, including tax covenants, for the
27 benefit of the purchasers of Bonds; define events of default; establish remedies and duties
28 upon default; and provide for the application of money received pursuant to default.

29 Sections 32 through 37 provide details relating to defeasance of the ordinance and
30 the Bonds and the survival of certain provisions of the ordinance after defeasance; provide
31 details relating to notices; provide details relating to amendments to the ordinance; and
32 provide for the method of evidencing ownership of Bonds.

Sections 39 through 50 provide that the ordinance shall be governed by the laws of New Mexico; provide for payments and covenants to be performed on business days; limit rights of parties under the ordinance; delegate powers to the officers of the City to effectuate the provisions of the ordinance; provide for the immunity of officials; provide a limitation of action period; state that the ordinance is irrevocable; provide severability and repealer clauses; declare the existence of an emergency; provide that the ordinance will become effective upon publication of this notice; and provide a summary of the ordinance for publication.

There is also a statement by the President of the Council and the Mayor that the Ordinance is an emergency.
