study sessions to examine the Police Oversight Ordinance, receive public
comment, evaluate best practices nationwide, and draft a new Police Oversight
Ordinance; and
WHEREAS, in order to ensure that the existing Commission has access to
the data and information that it needs to become what it was intended to be
and to instigate necessary reforms, it is necessary to provide funding for an
analyst position for the Police Oversight Commission.
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
ALBUQUERQUE:
Section 1. The City Council finds it necessary to overhaul the Police
Oversight Ordinance and the functioning of the Police Oversight process and
rules. To that end, the Council shall, prior to the end of calendar year 2013,
hold public forums, conduct study sessions, provide staff and other resources,
as necessary, and evaluate best practices nationwide in order to produce a
revamped Police Oversight Ordinance that provides for prompt, impartial and
fair investigation of all citizen complaints brought by individuals against the
Albuquerque Police Department.
Section 2. In order to take the first step towards the goal outlined in Section
1 above, the following appropriation for fiscal year 2013 is hereby made from
the unreserved fund balance in the General Fund 110 for the creation of a
Management Analyst II position for the Independent Review Office:
Department/Project Increase (Decrease)
Chief Administrative Office 36,000
Section 3. The City Council intends to fund this Management Analyst II
position on a recurring basis beginning with the fiscal year 2014 budget cycle.
