1 RESOLUTION

2 INITIATING A PROCESS TO INDEPENDENTLY REVIEW THE CITY'S
3 MECHANISMS OF POLICE OVERSIGHT; CREATING AN AD HOC POLICE
4 OVERSIGHT TASK FORCE TO OVERSEE THAT PROCESS AND MAKE
5 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE CITY COUNCIL; CALLING FOR THREE PUBLIC
6 FORUMS TO BE HELD AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS THROUGHOUT THE CITY
7 DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH 2013.

8 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque maintains a highly professional well
9 trained police department; however, an effective oversight mechanism is
10 critical to maintaining the public's confidence in that department; and

11 WHEREAS, the City Council has enacted a Police Oversight Ordinance to
12 provide oversight of the Albuquerque Police Department and oversee all citizen
13 complaints; and

14 WHEREAS, due to recent events the City Council feels that the process
15 needs to be reevaluated and changed if necessary; and

16 WHEREAS, the Police Oversight ordinance requires periodic evaluations so
17 as to *"undertake a complete evaluation and analysis of the entire Police*
18 *Oversight Process, and recommend any necessary changes or amendments*
19 *that would appropriately improve the process."* §9-4-1-11 ROA 1994; and

20 WHEREAS, the City Council believes that the creation of a Police Oversight
21 Task Force is an appropriate first step in bringing expertise to bear on the
22 review of the police oversight process; and

23 WHEREAS, as an indispensable part of that review process, the City Council
24 finds it necessary to hold public forums to receive public comment on the
25 existing oversight process, and suggestions on ways that it can be approved,
26 from the citizens of Albuquerque; and

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1 WHEREAS, the City Council feels that it is in the best interest of the City for
2 this review to take place as expeditiously as possible.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
4 ALBUQUERQUE:

5 Section 1. There is hereby created an ad hoc Police Oversight Task Force.
6 The Police Oversight Task Force shall consist of seven (7) members
7 representing the following interests:

- 8 a. A member with investigative or prosecutorial experience at the
9 district or statewide level;
- 10 b. Two members with non-profit advocacy experience in mobilizing
11 community groups to address social concerns;
- 12 c. A member with experience in an organization that defends and
13 works to preserve individual civil liberties;
- 14 d. A retired member of the Albuquerque Police Department;
- 15 e. A member of the community at large;
- 16 f. A member with experience in governmental efficiency and
17 accountability.

18 In addition, the following non-voting members are invited to provide the Police
19 Oversight Task Force with the benefit of their expertise and experience:

- 20 g. A representative of the Administration selected by the Mayor;
- 21 h. The City's Independent Review Officer;
- 22 i. A representative of the Albuquerque Police Department selected
23 by the Chief.

24 Section 2. Duties of the Police Oversight Task Force. The Task Force shall
25 meet as many times as necessary so as to complete a thorough evaluation and
26 analysis of the police oversight process and report back to the City Council
27 with its recommendations for improving the police oversight process by the
28 end of December 2013. The Task Force shall review the history and evolution
29 of the existing police oversight system by reviewing the results and
30 recommendations of the Walker/Luna study and both the 2006 and 2011 MGT
31 studies. The Task Force shall receive briefings and presentations, as
32 necessary, from subject matter experts on the city's current oversight system,
33 and on best practices and oversight models from other cities. The Task Force

1 may request the City to engage nationally known experts in the field of police
2 oversight to assist them in making their recommendations. Staffing for the
3 Task Force shall be provided by the City Council.

4 Section 3. As an indispensable part of the Task Force's work, the Task
5 Force will hold three Town Hall meetings in which members of the public are
6 encouraged to provide comments or suggestions for improving the police
7 oversight process.

8 Section 4. As a matter of policy, prior to the Task Force making its
9 recommendations to the City Council all proposed amendments to the Police
10 Oversight Ordinance shall be presented to the Police Oversight Task Force for
11 discussion.

12 Section 5. An amount of up to \$10,000 is hereby designated with the City
13 Council Projects activity to pay for consultants and services related to this
14 resolution.

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
