	23	landscapes not visible from highways and provides an energy-efficient form of			
	24	transportation; and			

1	WHEREAS, many New Mexico residents who ride the Southwest Chief
2	depend on it as the only form of public transportation between Raton and
3	Albuquerque; and
4	WHEREAS, in federal fiscal year 2012, passengers boarded and alighted
5	from the Southwest Chief in New Mexico at Albuquerque, Lamy, Las Vegas
6	and Raton more than one hundred twelve thousand times; and
7	WHEREAS, each year, about four thousand four hundred Boy Scouts who
8	camp at the Philmont scout ranch travel on the Southwest Chief, using the
9	Raton station; and
10	WHEREAS, many New Mexico counties, including Bernalillo, Colfax, Mora,
11	San Miguel, Sandoval and Santa Fe, depend on property tax revenues paid by
12	the BNSF railway; and
13	WHEREAS, the BNSF railway company, formerly the Burlington Northern
14	and Santa Fe railway company, owns and leases to Amtrak most of the line on
15	which the Southwest Chief carries passengers in New Mexico; and
16	WHEREAS, capital funding is needed to modernize the Southwest Chief
17	line running from Hutchinson, Kansas, to Albuquerque so that it meets
18	required passenger-rail standards; and
19	WHEREAS, the BNSF railway management has said that it will not renew
20	Amtrak's lease, which expires in January 2014, unless Amtrak pays to upgrade
21	that line; and
22	WHEREAS, the United States Congress has not provided for a permanent
23	funding stream to cover the costs of Amtrak's infrastructure needs; and
24	WHEREAS, Amtrak's inability to secure adequate capital funding for
25	improvements imminently threatens the viability of the Southwest Chief line
26	from Raton to Albuquerque; and
27	WHEREAS, the Southwest Chief Coalition, a group of concerned citizens
28	and elected officials from Colorado, Kansas and New Mexico, has assembled
29	in an effort to preserve the Southwest Chief; and
30	WHEREAS, New Mexico governmental entities, including Colfax County,
31	Mora County, San Miguel County, Santa Fe County, the City of Las Vegas, the
32	City of Raton, the City of Santa Fe, and the Town of Wagon Mound along with

	5	Albuquerque and encouraged citizens, agencies and organizations to actively
	6	endorse the continuation of the current route through northern New Mexico;
