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## SPECIAL ELECTION RESOLUTION

2 TO SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING PROPOSITION AND AUTHORIZATION TO THE

3 VOTERS OF THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE: 1) A PROPOSITION TO AMEND

4 ARTICLE V, SECTION 4 OF THE CITY CHARTER TO SPECIFY THAT

5 APPOINTMENT OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND FIRE CHIEF WILL REQUIRE

6 THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND THAT THE CHIEF

7 OF POLICE OR FIRE CHIEF MAY BE REMOVED BY THE COUNCIL FOR

8 CAUSE; 2) A BOND QUESTION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL

9 OBLIGATION BONDS IN CERTAIN PRINCIPAL AMOUNT FOR METROPOLITAN
10 REDEVELOPMENT PURPOSES; 3) A PROPOSITION TO IMPOSE A 1/8 GROSS
11 RECEIPTS TAX FOR ESSENTIAL SERVICES; 4) A QUESTION ON WHETHER
12 TO REDUCE PENALTIES FOR POSSESSION OF LESS THAN 1 OUNCE OF
13 MARIJUANA; 5) A PROPOSITION TO AMEND ARTICLE III SECTION 3 OF THE
14 CITY CHARTER RELATING TO THE VOTER INITIATIVE PROCESS; AND
15 PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SPECIAL
16 MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, Section 3-8-9 NMSA 1978 allows a municipal special election to be held concurrently with any statewide general election, and a statewide general election is scheduled to be held on November 4, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved proposition P-14-1 (enactment P-2014-001) proposing to require the City Council's advice and consent for the 22 appointment of the Albuquerque Chief of Police and Albuquerque Fire Chief 23 and to allow the City Council to remove the Chief of Police or Fire Chief for 24 cause; and

WHEREAS, P-14-1 specified that the City Clerk is required to coordinate
with the Bernalillo County Clerk to prepare and file any necessary documents

1 and agreements for a special municipal election on P-14-1 to be held on 2 November 4, 2014, concurrently with the statewide general election; and 3 WHEREAS, the City Council also approved a resolution F/S R-14-61 4 (enactment R-2014-047) concerning a special municipal bond election to 5 authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds in a certain principal 6 amount for metropolitan redevelopment purposes; and

7 WHEREAS, F/S R-14-61 specified that the City Clerk is required to 8 coordinate with the Bernalillo County Clerk for a special municipal bond 9 election on November 4, 2014, concurrently with the statewide general 10 election; and

11 WHEREAS, Section 3-8-35 NMSA 1978, a portion of the Municipal Election 12 Code, states that when a special election is required by law, an election 13 resolution shall be adopted by the governing body calling for the election and 14 shall state, in part, the purpose for calling the election, the date of the election, 15 the questions to be submitted to the voters, and whether paper ballots or 16 voting machines will be used in the election.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 17 18 ALBUQUERQUE:

SECTION 1. SPECIAL ELECTION PROCESS. The applicable provisions of the New Mexico Municipal Election Code, including but not limited to those provisions relating to special, concurrent elections, shall govern the Special 22 Election.

(A) PURPOSE & DATE OF ELECTION. A special municipal election shall be held in Albuquerque, New Mexico on Tuesday, November 4, 2014 (the "Special Election") for the purpose of submitting the questions described in this Resolution to the registered, gualified voters in the City of Albuquerque.

28 CLOSING OF REGISTRATION. Any person who is otherwise **(B)** 29 qualified to vote and who is not currently registered to vote may register at the 30 office of the Clerk of the County of Bernalillo, 6th Floor, One Civic Plaza, 31 Albuquerque, New Mexico, or at the office of any duly appointed deputy 32 registration officer on or before 5:00 p.m., on October 7, 2014.

SECTION 3. RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ACTIONS. All actions, not 29 30 inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution, heretofore taken by the Council and the officers of the City directed toward the Bond Election 31 32 Question, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, is hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed. 33

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1 SECTION 4. PUBLICATION. This Resolution shall be published in English 2 and in Spanish once each week for four consecutive weeks. The first 3 publication of the election resolution shall be between fifty and sixty days 4 before the day of the election. The election resolution shall be posted in the office of the municipal clerk within twenty-four hours from the date of 5 6 adoption until the date of the election. For information purposes and 7 coordination, one copy of the election resolution shall be mailed to the 8 secretary of state and the Bernalillo County Clerk.

9 SECTION 5. FURTHER ACTIONS & COOPERATION. The officers and agents of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take all action 10 11 necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution, 12 including but not limited to providing this Resolution to the Bernalillo County 13 Clerk and cooperating with the Bernalillo County Clerk, the Bernalillo County 14 Commission and the New Mexico Secretary of State regarding all election 15 matters including but not limited to the completion of any memorandums of 16 agreement as may be required, the preparation of affidavits, instructions and 17 elections supplies, and the publication of notices.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, word, or
phrase of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable
by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the
validity of the remaining provisions of this Resolution. The Council hereby
declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section,
paragraph, sentence, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision
being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

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
