| 8 | WHEREAS, the Gaps Analysis conducted by the University of New |
| 9 | Mexico/Center for Education Policy Research estimated that 151,000 residents |
| 10 | of Bernalillo County have mental illness and/or substance use disorders and |
| 11 | could benefit from treatment, yet there are few agencies providing the more |
| 12 | intensive levels of treatment needed. |
| 13 | BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF |
| 14 | ALBUQUERQUE: |
| 15 | Section 1. That those funds in the amount of Five Hundred Thousand |
| 16 | Dollars (\$500,000) previously appropriated in C/S R-14-47, Exhibit A |
| 17 | "Supportive Services to the Homeless/to be determined" are hereby |
| 18 | designated to implement a program to assist persons being discharged from |
| 19 | the Metropolitan Detention Center who are homeless and mentally ill as |
| 20 | follows: \$100,000 for intensive case management and related services, |
| 21 | \$336,000 for supportive housing services and \$64,000 for a Project |
| 22 | Coordinator. |
| 23 | Section 2. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into a Social Services |
| 24 | Agreement with Albuquerque Healthcare for the Homeless in the amount of |
| 25 | \$100,000 for intensive case management services and a Social Services |
| 26 | Agreement with the New Mexico Supportive Housing Coalition in the amount |
| 27 | of \$336,000 for supportive housing services; and |
| 28 | Section 3. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental |
| 29 | Agreement with Bernalillo County to create a collaborative partnership |
| 30 | defining the roles and responsibilities of each party, the City and the County, |
| 31 | in effectively serving those persons who are being released from incarceration |
| 32 | and can be successfully transitioned into the community with the services |
| 33 | designated in Section 1 of this resolution. |

Section 4. That the Department of Family and Community Services shall release a Request for Proposals, the total amount up to \$625,000, to solicit responses to provide the services determined to be in the most critical areas of need as prioritized by the Behavioral Health Task Force: A crisis stabilization center, intensive case management and supportive housing services.
