Library Projects \$100,000

Acquire property, study, plan, design, develop, construct, reconstruct, renovate, rehabilitate, modernize, preserve, automate, upgrade, landscape and otherwise improve, and acquire books, media and equipment for public libraries that benefit District 7.

Street Projects \$300,000

Study, design, develop, construct, renovate, automate, modernize, sign, enhance, landscape and otherwise improve, and acquire property and equipment for municipal streets and roads, interstate roadways and interchanges, medians, trails, bikeways, walkways, sidewalks, railroad crossings and bridges that benefit District 7.

District 8

Public Safety Projects

Library Projects \$50,000
