SPONSORED BY:** Isaac Benton, by request 1 RESOLUTION 2 **ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM SYSTEMWIDE FAREBOX RECOVERY RATIO FOR** 3 THE TRANSIT DEPARTMENT'S FIXED-ROUTE SERVICE. 4 WHEREAS, the Transit Department seeks the establishment of a policy that 5 provides guidance for the setting of the prices of fixed-route service fare 6 products; and 7 WHEREAS, the Transit Department seeks a farebox recovery ratio policy 8 that provides for equitable sharing of costs, guides the Department in the 9 pricing of Transit fare products so that these products are reasonably priced 10 for the public, while generating a reasonable level of operating revenue; and 11 WHEREAS, the two prime determinants of a systemwide fixed-route Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 farebox recovery ratio are the revenue generated from the use of assets that Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] -13 are utilized in the providing of fixed-route transit service and the cost incurred 14 to operate, maintain and provide this service; and 15 WHEREAS, the Transit Department seeks to establish a minimum fixed-16 route, systemwide, farebox recovery ratio and recognizes that it could take 17 some years to achieve this minimum ratio. 18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 19 **ALBUQUERQUE:** 20 Section 1. Definitions 21 A. Fixed-route, systemwide operating revenues are defined as revenues 22 received from the sale of fare products and revenues received from 23 advertising on buses, bus shelters, and/or on ABQ RIDE software 24 applications. Revenues received by the Department from other governmental 25 entities for the Department providing fixed-route service are excluded from

this definition.

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1	B. Fixed-route, systemwide operating costs are defined as in the U.S.
2	Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration, National Transit
3	Database Glossary. Operating costs incurred by the Department for providing
4	fixed-route service to other governmental entities are excluded from this
5	definition.
6	C. Fixed-route, systemwide farebox recovery ratio is defined as fixed-route
7	systemwide operating revenues divided by fixed-route, systemwide operating
8	costs.
9	Section 2. The Transit Department by February 1 of each calendar year
10	shall post on its Web page fixed-route performance measurements for all
11	fixed-routes operated by the Transit Department for the previous fiscal year.
12	Section 3. Minimum Fixed-Route, Systemwide, Farebox Recovery Ratio.
13	A minimum fixed-route, systemwide, farebox recovery ration of twenty-five
14	percent (25%) is hereby established.
15	Section 4. Time Period For Achieving The Minimum, Fixed-Route,
16	Systemwide Farebox Recovery Ratio
17	The Transit Department shall achieve the minimum, fixed-route, systemwide,

19	Section 5. The Transit Department, through the Transit Department
<u>-</u> 20	Director, has the authority and responsibility to establish pricing of the fixed-



Attached are the Cover Analysis, Fiscal Impact Analysis, and the Resolution for establishing a minimum systewide farebox recovery ratio for city funded fixed-route service. I am requesting your review and signing of the Signature Page.

Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

A resolution to establish a minimum systemwide farebox recovery ratio for city of Albuquerque funded fixed-routes, giving the Transit Department director the responsibility to achieve and maintain the minimum systemwide farebox recovery ratio, and establishes a time period to achieve the minimum farebox recovery ratio.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This resolution establishes a 25% minimum system-wide farebox recovery ratio for fixed-routes that are funded by the city of Albuquerque, and gives the Transit Department director the responsibility to make fixed-route structure changes and/or fare product prices changes to obtain and maintain the 25% farebox recovery ratio, and establishes a time period to achieve the 25% farebox recovery ratio.

3. Why is this project needed?

The city needs to determine the "fair share" percentage of operating costs transit riders need to contribute toward funding the operations of city funded fixed-route transit service. The determination of this fair share percentage will guide the establishment of fixed-route fare product prices and will guide when increases in these prices are necessary to maintain the fair share percentage.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

There is no cost to the city with the establishment of this policy.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?

There is no revenue associated with this proposed resolution. Revenue impacts would be associated with any future changes in the Transit Department Fare Ordinance.
