| 4 | BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF |
| 5 | ALBUQUERQUE: |
| 6 | Section 1. LOW LAW ENFORCEMENT PRIORITY. The Albuquerque |
| 7 | Police Department, the City Attorney's Office and all other City law |
| 8 | enforcement officials shall make the investigation, arrest, and prosecution of |
| 9 | criminal offenses for the possession of one ounce or less of marijuana for |
| 10 | adult personal use a low law enforcement priority. |
| 11 | Section 2. ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES. The Albuquerque Police |
| 12 | Department and City Attorney shall establish appropriate forms and |
| 13 | procedures for the administration of the civil marijuana possession penalties |
| 14 | prescribed by O-15-60 as soon as possible. |
| 15 | Section 3. REPORTING. The Albuquerque Police Department shall |
| 16 | report all marijuana arrests if any, including any criminal citations issued for |
| 17 | marijuana use or possession if any, to the City Council on an annual basis. |
| 18 | Section 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, |
| 19 | word, or phrase of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or |
| 20 | unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not |
| 21 | affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this resolution. The Council |
| 22 | hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section, |
| 23 | paragraph, sentence, clause word or phrase irrespective of any provisions |
| 24 | being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid. |
| 25 | Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This resolution shall take effect five |
| 26 | days after publication by title and general summary. |
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
