SPONSORED BY: Patrick Davis** 1 RESOLUTION 2 ESTABLISHING A FIRE SERVICE AIDE PROGRAM AND PROTOCOLS FOR 3 FIRE SERVICE AIDES TO PROVIDE FIRST-RESPONDER SERVICES FOR NON-4 LIFE THREATENING MEDICAL CALLS, INCLUDING PERSONS SUFFERING 5 FROM INTOXICATION AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE IN PUBLIC PLACES; MAKING 6 AN APPROPRIATION. 7 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Police Department exists to prevent and 8 respond to crimes; and the Albuquerque Fire Department exists to save lives 9 by providing lifesaving medical services and firefighting services; and 10 WHEREAS, being under the influence of self-induced intoxicants is not a 11 crime in the City of Albuquerque; and persons suffering from public Deletion 12 intoxication may require basic first aid and transportation for detoxification 13 but do not routinely require a full life saving medical response; and WHEREAS, in 2015, The Albuquerque Police Department and Fire Department jointly responded to more than 15,000 calls, 41 per day, for medical assistance for persons suffering from substance abuse in public places, sometimes referred to as "down and out" calls; and WHEREAS, "down and out" calls account for 15% of total calls for the Fire Department and also require the equivalent of three full-time police officers per day to respond to these calls; and WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Police and Fire Departments currently respond to these calls as a "Priority 1," in the same category as crimes of 23 violence in progress, or life-threatening medical emergencies, responding with 24 full lights and sirens in an expedited manner, and spend, on average, nearly 45 25 minutes per call; and 26 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Fire Department currently responds to these 27 calls with full fire and ambulance services, making these highly-trained

1	firefighters and medical personnel unavailable for life-threatening		
2	emergencies; and the medical response required for the majority of these		
3	calls, currently provided by full AFD fire and rescue units, could be facilitated		
4	by persons with basic medical training; and		
5	WHEREAS	S, the Albuquerque Police Department is currently understaffed	
6	and response	es to medical calls divert officers from responding to calls for	
7	crimes in pro	gress or community policing activities.	
8	BE IT RESOL	VED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF	
9	ALBUQUERQUE:		
10	Section 1.	The Albuquerque Fire Department is authorized to establish a	
11	Fire Service Aide (FSA) program allowing FSAs to learn about the		
12	Department's policies and procedures prior to entering the Fire Academy as a		
13	Fire Cadet. FSAs shall receive basic fire safety training and EMT-level medical		
14	training enabling them to assist with non-life threatening medical calls for		
15	service and support for fire fighters and paramedics on critical scenes, and		
16	other training as determined by the Fire Chief.		
17	Section 2.	Upon certification to the Mayor and City Council by the Fire	
18	Chief and Director of Human Resources that the job descriptions, training and		
19	duties have been established for FSAs, and that a sufficient number of FSAs		
20	have been hired and trained, the Chiefs of the Police and Fire Departments		
21	shall establish policies that include adjusting response protocols to eliminate		
22	Priority 1 responses as the default response to "down and out" calls for		
23	service, where:		
24	a.)	A Fire Service Aide or otherwise trained employees is available	
25		to respond, triage and provide aide in a reasonable amount of	
26		time, and	
27	b.)	When there is no indication that a person needing medical	
28		assistance has been the victim of a crime or may require	
29		advanced medical assistance.	

Section 3. Nothing in this resolution shall be interpreted to prevent a police officer, firefighter, EMT or paramedic from initiating a welfare check on any person he/she observes who may require medical assistance. Nor shall any supervisor of the Police or Fire Departments be prohibited from directing
