The Chief shall report to 14 the City Council by the end of the third guarter of FY/17 on the feasibility and 15 costs associated with such a scholarship or incentive program. 16 Section 2. The Chief of the Albuguergue Police Department or designee; 32 The working group shall meet at least quarterly to assess the progress of 33 processing backlogged sexual assault evidence kits and to make
