#### \*The project purpose for which you are requesting Kellogg funding:

Mayor Tim Keller has centered equity and inclusion as core values and has empowered all departments to apply an equity lens across the many programs, services and budget decisions. He has come out publicly as champion of immigrants and refugees by strengthening our city's status as a sanctuary city; has broadened the Commission on Indian Affairs and committed to funding a full-time Native American liaison; and has brought LGBTQ, cultural sensitivity, implicit bias and racial equity training to City Hall and to APD and AFR. His actions have matched his campaign promises to restore our city's brand around our authentic self - OneAlbuquerque, and has established and charged the new Office of Equity and Inclusion with inspiring and equipping city government to embrace racial and gender equity as the means to achieve a safe, inclusive ar innovative city that works for all of its residents. Specifically he respects and understands the sovereignty ar needs of Native American residents.

#### \*Project Overview:

The City of Albuquerque Office of Equity and Inclusion would convene a community conversation about race and racism on the National Day of Racial Healing at a city facility or another appropriate venue, depending a availability. The Office of Equity and Inclusion would subcontract with one or more trusted community-based organizations to plan the event and facilitate the event. The city would provide the contractor with a set of principles and parameters to frame the conversation. The event would be open to the public and would engage youth and elders of all backgrounds to come together, listen, learn and foster healing on the National Day of Racial Healing.

#### \*Project Goals and Objectives:

The goal of the event is to begin a community conversation about race and racism, to foster healing. The objectives are to provide a space, a dedicated time, and a safe and open forum for community members to express themselves, share their experiences and begin to identify ways to address racism so that the healin process can begin. This may become the first in a series of conversations, depending on the community response to this initial conversation.

#### \*Project Activities:

Identify one or more trusted community-based organizations; Identify the framework for the event. Centering indigeneity. Co-plan the event, taking into consideration the expressed desire of people to share their experiences, while also recognizing the importance of moving conversations toward healing. Identifying a space, such as the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center, National Hispanic Cultural Center, or Albuquerque Museu - spaces that are conducive to conversations, small groups, fish bowl and other approaches to sharing/listening. Conducting broad community outreach and engaging key stakeholders to participate in the event.

#### \*Expected Project Outcomes:

The measurable outcome is an event centered around racial healing in Albuquerque.
