1	CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSAL
2	ADOPTING A PROPOSITION TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT THE

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6 7	WHEREAS, the City Charter was amended in 1974 to establish nine City
7	Council Districts for the City; and
8	WHEREAS, when the current nine Council District structure was
9	established in 1974, the population of City was estimated at approximately
10	260,000; and
11 u	WHEREAS, the U.S. Census estimates that as of 2017 the City's population

	WHEREAS, across nine U.S. cities of comparable population, the average

19	WHEREAS, in order to achieve this average ratio of Council representatives
20	to population in Albuquerque, a total of eleven Council Districts would

23	with population growth which could have the negative impact of diluting
24	access of individuals to participate with their City government and engage
25	their representatives; and

1 WHEREAS, consideration of the guestion as to whether additional Council 2 Districts should be added to the City would be ideally timed at the 2019 election, which is immediately in advance of the 2020 census and the 3 4 associated decennial redistricting process required by the City Charter. 5 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY 6 **OF ALBUQUERQUE:** 7 SECTION 1. The City Clerk shall place the summary, title, and text of the 8 following proposition on the ballot at the November 5, 2019 regular local 9 election, and City of Albuquergue voters shall be permitted to vote "for" or 10 "against": 11 SUMMARY 12 Proposing to increase the number of City Council Districts from nine to 13 eleven. 14 PROPOSITION 15 Proposing to amend the City Charter of the City of Albuquerque by 16 amending Article IV, Sections 1, 2 and 3 as follows: 17 "Section 1. AUTHORITY AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL. Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion 18 The legislative authority of the city shall be vested in a governing 19 body which shall constitute the legislative branch of the city and shall be 20 known as a Council, consisting of [nine eleven] members . . .. 21 Section 2. COUNCIL DISTRICTS. 22 The total area of the city shall be divided into [nine eleven] (a) 23 Council Districts, numbered one to [nine eleven] inclusive, and each district 24 shall elect one Councillor.... 25 Section 3. DISTRICT BOUNDARY REVISIONS. 26 After each Federal Census, the Council shall appoint a (a) 27 committee composed of an equal number of representatives from each 28 Council District, none of whom shall be elective city officers, to review and 29 make recommendations concerning the [nine eleven] Council Districts...." 30 SECTION 2. TIME OF FILING WITH THE CITY CLERK. The Director of City 31 Council Services, or designee, shall file this Charter amendment proposal with 32 the City Clerk within 90 days of the November 5, 2019 regular local election.

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SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, word or phrase of this proposition is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this proposition. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this proposition and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid. SECTION 4. COORDINATION WITH BERNALILLO COUNTY. The City Clerk shall coordinate with the Bernalillo County Clerk to prepare and file any necessary documents and agreements to facilitate the placement of this proposed Charter amendment on the November 5, 2019 regular local election ballot.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This proposition is effective immediately.
The Charter Amendment described in Section 1 of this proposition shall take
effect immediately following the certification of the election if approved by the
voters.
