1	preference votes is eliminated. First-preference votes cast for the failed				
2	candidate are eliminated, lifting the second-preference choices indicated on				
3	those ballots. A new tally is conducted to determine whether any candidate				
4	has won a majority of the adjusted votes. The process is repeated until a				
5	candidate wins an outright majority. This system is sometimes referred to as				
6	an instant runoff voting system; and				
7	WHEREAS, A ranked choice voting system which is also commonly				
8	referred to as an "instant runoff" would help eliminate costly separate runoff				
9	elections in the City, would help minimize administrative and staffing burdens				
10	would be more respectful of the time and resources of City voters, and would				
11	also be consistent with the City Charter's 50% requirement.				
12	BE IT PROPOSED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY				
13	OF ALBUQUERQUE:				
14	SECTION 1. The City Clerk shall place the summary, title and text of the				
15	following proposition on the ballot at the November 5, 2019 regular local				
16	election, and City of Albuquerque voters shall be permitted to vote "for" or				
17	"against":				
18	SUMMARY				
19	Proposing to implement a ranked-choice voting system, an electoral system in				
20	which voters rank candidates by preference on their ballots.				
21	PROPOSITION				
22	Proposing to amend the City Charter of the City of Albuquerque by amending				
23	Article II, Section 8, as follows:				
24	"Section 8. [RUNOFF ELECTIONS.				
25	(a) If no candidate receives 50% of the votes cast for the particular office in				
26	question, a runoff election shall be held within forty-five days after				
27	certification of the results of the election in question as now provided by law				
28	and as amended and supplemented from time to time. Unless otherwise				
29	specified in this Charter, the two candidates who receive the highest number				
30	of votes cast for the office in question shall automatically become the				
31	candidates at the runoff election and the filing of declarations of candidacy is				

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1	(b) The Council shall by resolution fix the date of the runoff election and
2	specify the offices to be filled and the names of the candidates therefor. The
3	resolution shall be published once, at least seven days before the runoff
4	election date. Otherwise, no publications are required in connection with
5	runoff elections.
6	(c) Only such voting precincts and procedures will be reactivated for a
7	runoff as will be required, on a city-wide basis if officials to be voted on by the
8	entire city electorate are involved, otherwise only such District Councillor
9	districts as may be involved.][RANKED CHOICE VOTING.
10	Commencing with the regular municipal election in November 2019, the Mayor
11	and City Councilors shall be elected using a ranked choice voting system
12	allowing voters to rank in order of their preference the candidates for each
13	office appearing on the ballot. If after counting all voters' first preference
14	votes listed on their ballots for an office, no candidate receives a total number
15	of votes cast equaling or exceeding 50% of the total number of votes cast for
16	the office, the candidate with the fewest first preference votes shall be
17	eliminated. Each ballot shall then be tallied again for that office counting the
18	first and second preference votes from each ballot for the remaining
19	candidates for that office who have not been eliminated. If still no candidate
20	for that office receives a total number of votes cast equaling or exceeding 50%
21	of the total number of votes cast for the office, the process shall be repeated
22	until a candidate receives at least 50% of the total number of votes cast for
23	that office.]"
24	SECTION 2. TIME OF FILING WITH THE CITY CLERK. The Director of City
25	Council Services, or designee, shall file this Charter amendment proposal with
26	the City Clerk within 90 days of the November 5, 2019 regular local election.
27	SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, word or
28	phrase of this proposition is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable
29	by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the
30	validity of the remaining provisions of this proposition. The Council hereby
31	declares that it would have passed this proposition and each section,
32	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any

provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

	ı	SECTION 4. COORDINATION WITH BERNALILLO COUNTY. The City Clerk
	2	shall coordinate with the Bernalillo County Clerk to prepare and file any
	3	necessary documents and agreements to facilitate the placement of this
	4	proposed Charter amendment on the November 5, 2019 regular local election
	5	ballot.
	6	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This proposition is effective immediately.
	7	The Charter Amendment described in Section 1 of this proposition shall take
	8	effect immediately following the certification of the election if approved by the
	9	voters.
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
